

About the College

Nestled in the heart of one of Greensboro, North Carolina's residential communities, Bennett College is the only historically African-American college for women in the state of North Carolina, and is one of two in the country.

The College is an accredited, private four-year liberal arts college for women and is affiliated with the United Methodist Church. The institution was founded in 1873 as a co-ed normal school and in 1889 was chartered as a four-year college. In 1926, Bennett redirected its mission to become a college dedicated to educating women.

Bennett has graduated over 5,000 women since 1930 and can boast a number of "firsts". Bennett graduated the first African-American woman to head the Peace Corps; the first African-American woman to head the YWCA' the first African-American female television news director in the country; the first African-American female appointed to the position of District Attorney in North Carolina; and the first African-American female to manage a major American brewery. Bennett students are primarily of African-American descent, however, the College includes and welcomes women of all races.

Bennett College maintains its distinction as an institution of higher learning by offering an education conducive to excellence in scholarly pursuits, preparation for leadership roles and life-long learning in a contemporary society. The College offers selected education, training and research experiences appropriate for preparation in the arts and sciences, the professions, and for public service.

Office of the President

Dear Class of 1997 and Sister Bennett Belles:

In days to come and in years to come, this account of academic year 1996-97 in this volume of the Bennett Belle will grow in value. You will leaf through it and recall the many wonderful experiences at Bennett. Many of them will be brought to life by a face you remember, much of what happened will present itself to you in the face of challenge of the realism of life.

It chronicles the account of this rare year in which:

* for the first time since its construction in 194, the Annie Merner Chapel and the Little Theater have been under major repair and renovation and therefore unavailable for the "community gatherings" which are so much the central core of the ethos of Bennett College for Women;

* the historical Carnegie Library which was the only library in Greensboro for African Americans to use until the late 1960's is under repair, renovation and restoration for use in the Community Empowerment Development Program;

* the College, through the leadership of two of her daughters, Dr. Susie Powell and Mrs. Sallie Brown and their spouses, Drs. Franklin Anderson and Robert Brown, has engaged upon the first Capital Campaign since the 1973 Centennial Campaign which will provide an infusion of \$50 million in capital to fund the Chapel renovation, build the Women's Leadership Institute and its support systems, a Humanities and Social Services building, and an Honors Wing/Student Activity Space onto the David Dallas Jones Student Union building;

* the students for the third time out of the last four years raised the highest amount of money for the pre-alumni council and presented Bennett College with the third National Miss UNCF, Belle Kelly Cole;

* the first swimming team, "The Diving Belles" joined the "Dunking Belles", "Spiking Belles" and "Running Belles" to further extend the Intercollegiate Athletic Program;

* the Science Belles won five of the top ten awards of the Beta Kappa Chi Research competition;

* and the Class of 2000 entered as Freshwomen.

Bennett College is a very special place of nurturing to produce the well-educated professionals, informed participating citizens, enlightened parents, facilitators of social justice and effective, healthy utilizers of technology.

It has been my pleasure to provide presidential leadership since 1987 and a very special privilege to provide the leadership during this year for the continued, improved production of the important women leaders for the new millennium.
