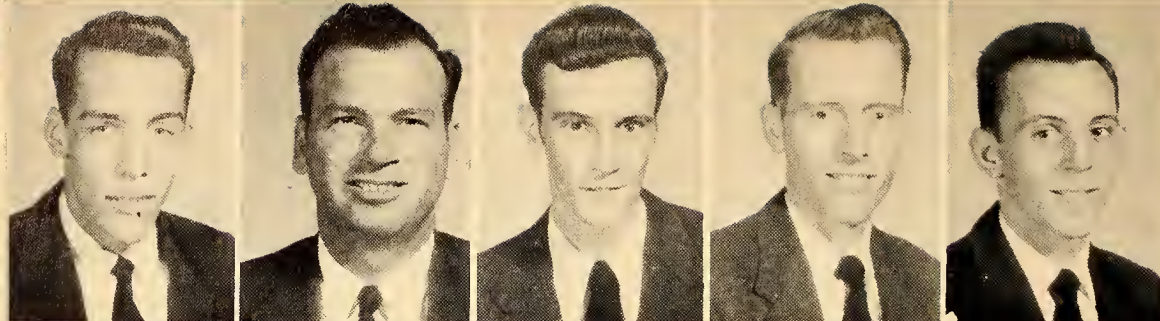
... of ones giving the play a light and gay touch. We make our entrances and exits with smiling faces because our lines are few and funny, and we are progressing in our performance.
