Mrs. Evans along with her newsmakers kept the people informed about the happenings around school, while every thing was so busy and rushed.

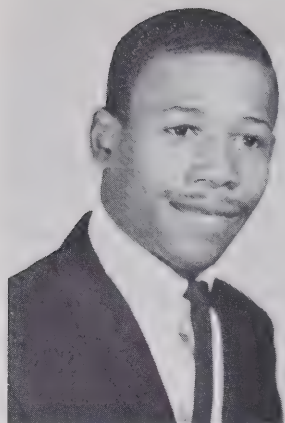

We, the Senior Class, have accomplished many of the goals we set for ourselves as freshmen. We are no longer unwise, only wiser.

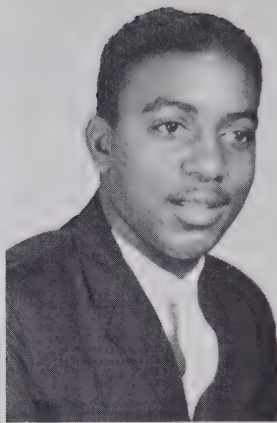

# School History

What a wonderful thing to be a part of history! We study history every day, some of us—and find it boring. But when we stop to consider that what we live today makes the history of tomorrow, then history should fascinate us. To bring history closer, have you ever thought of your family’s history, your church history, or even your school history—how far they date back?

We are going to give you in two parts the history of the Fuquay Springs School. We do not as yet use the word “Consolidated” because that has not always been a part of the name. As we write, we think of only four schools in this county bearing names other than community monikers. What a fine thing it would be if our school had a name of its own.

The first school for the Fuquay Springs community was located in Wilbon where the Bazel Creek Cemetary is now located. The land belonged to Mr. Toby Spence. A second school was located at the same time in the Holland’s Crossing section, on the old Johnson place.

The earliest date given was 1913 with Mrs. Lovie Hinton as teacher. Other teachers associated with this period were Mrs. Beulah Claigg and Mrs. Cross. The curriculum at the time probably consisted of Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic. Just imagine, dear readers, no dramatics, no athletics, no cafeteria, no glee club, no home economics, and no agriculture, to say nothing of drivers education.

In 1921, Mr. Joseph S. Davis was assigned to this school as principal, and at that time the location was moved to the town of Fuquay Springs. In addition to Mr. and Mrs. Davis there were two other teachers. Of the number of early teachers, many are still active today. Mrs. Minnie Slocum, one of those who came in the 1920’s although retired as a public school teacher, still remained active in church and community work.

The Rosenwald Fund was used in erecting the first brick building on the campus. During this period, high school students were transported to and from Berry O’Kelly High School in Method on a school bus purchased by the community. According to one of our sources of information, Mr. Leroy Burton, present agriculture teacher here, drove the bus.

In the early 1930’s a high school department was added here, and the first senior class was graduated in 1938.

In 1939, through the public work administration, an addition was made to the brick building. This made possible the addition of library facilities and a science laboratory.

On December 7, 1941, Pearl Harbor was bombed. This fact is important, because if Pearl Harbor had not been bombed, I may not have come to Fuquay. That’s history. After the bombing of Pearl Harbor, the government sent out an SOS for all competent clerical workers to come to Washington. The French, history, and music teacher here at Fuquay was a competent clerical worker. She went to Washington in February 1942, and I came to Fuquay. That’s history too.

In 1942, there was no graduation, because the senior class of that year elected to return the following year for the twelfth grade which had been added.

## PART II

Did you know that a cannery once stood where the gym is now and that the agriculture building once caught on fire?

In 1943 our first 12 year class was graduated. In the early 1940’s a nursery school was operated under the auspices of the WPA. This program was carried on in what the students called the “plank building”, an edifice that stood where the high school building now stands. Many of our graduates received an early send-off, thanks to the nursery school.

In the 1940’s the agriculture classes organized a choral group. They received quite a bit of assistance from Mr. Hubert Towns (deceased) and Mr. Joseph Baldwin. This group sang for the Lions Club at the Fuquay Springs High School and also journeyed to Raleigh for an afternoon session of Teachers Association.

It was during this period also that a cannery was erected on the site now occupied by the gymtorium. This cannery was kept busy day and night by the families of the Fuquay Springs Community. Tons of meat, fruit, and vegetables were canned here, and comradeship such as must have been evident at the old fashion quilting bees was experienced.

When the government set in motion machinery for rationing of foodstuffs, the school naturally had to assist. Lines of parents began to form outside the school long before the dismissal bell sounded. They were there to get “Sugar Books” and “Meat Books.”

It was during the 1940's also that we had a senior to win a Pepsi Cola scholarship. This senior matriculated at North Carolina College and is now in the Fayetteville system.

In 1947 Mr. D. A. Thomas came to Fuquay and served in that capacity for two full years. In the middle of the third year he died and his successor was Mr. W. M. McElrath.

In the early 1950's the "plank building" was demolished to make way for the high school building. That was a hectic time! The grammar grades were taught in the First Baptist church and in another building across from it. Students and teachers had to be transported by bus to and from the school at lunch time. All of us were very happy when the last brick for the high school building had been laid and the last paint brush had been slung so that we could be together as one big, happy family again.

Not for long were the hammers and saws silent on our campus. After the high school building was completed, work on a gymtorium was begun. For this project their once busy cannery had to be demolished. The class of 1953 was the first class to graduate from the gymtorium.

In the fall of 1953 Mr. W. M. McLean came to Fuquay as principal. During his administration commercial education and a marching band were added. The school faculty had grown to 34 strong and the fleet of buses to 12 instead of 1. In addition, the home economics department had been modernized, and water fountains had been installed inside the buildings. Our cafeteria, which at one time was housed in the basement of the agriculture building, was modern and well run, thanks to the entire staff which included a graduate of this school.

In 1964 a new elementary school was built. Mr. Wm. McLean, who was at that time principal of the Fuquay Consolidated High School, was then given the position of principal of the Lincoln Heights Elementary School. Mr. Wm. Freeman who at that time was counselor of the Fuquay Consolidated School moved a step higher to gain the principalship.

Grades 1-6 were moved to the Lincoln Heights Elementary School and grades 7-12 remained at the Fuquay Consolidated High School. Because of the split in the grade levels the number of teachers was decreased from 38-27.

Since Mr. Wm. Freeman has served as principal fo this school such courses have added as follows: carpentry, vocational education, art, and remedial reading.

We could not close without a word about the graduates. Since the first class was graduated in 1938, approximately 29 classes have gone forth from these halls. The information that follows will show you how many of the graduates have absorbed into the "world of work."

#### Occupations:

Accountant, Army lieutenants, Army majors, Brick masons, Clergyman, Counselor, Doctors, Dieticians, Law Enforcement Officers, Lawyers, Life Insurance Officers, Nurses, Pharmacists, Secretaries, Social Workers, and Teachers.

We do hope that future graduates will enlarge these occupations and truly bring to past that part of our "Alma Mater" embodying the school motto: Scholarship and service too,

Success our destiny;  
Hold aloft our radiant colors; We'll be true to thee!

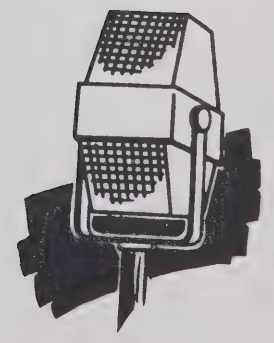
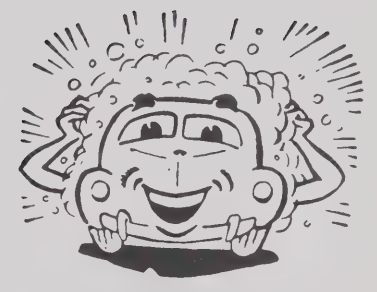
