Formosum

Cold Storage 10 Days

Growers must not force Formosum in great heat. A cool house, 60 to 65 degrees, with plenty of moisture is better, but they will certainly do best when grown in pots. The so-called Formosum seems to be a class rather than a single type, and starts into growth irregularly, so if in pots they can be shifted into sections representing varying heights to give proper light and watering.

N. B.—Ten days in cold storage before planting is sure to benefit the crop.

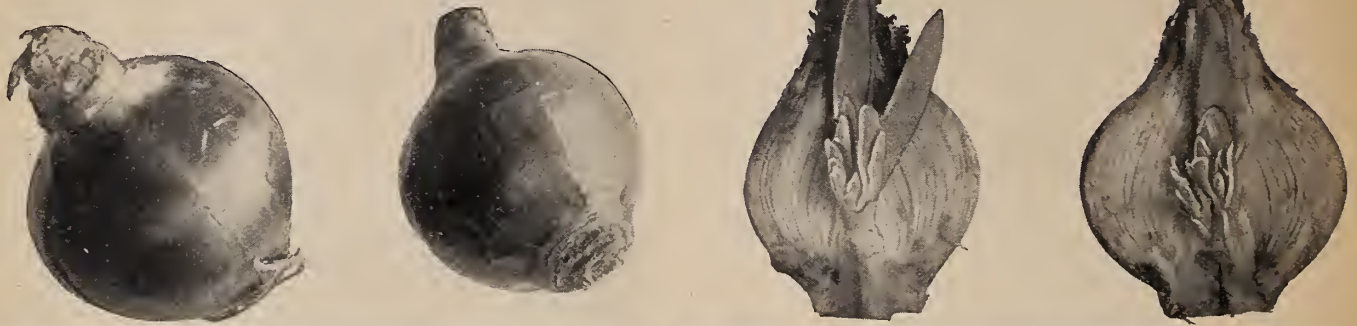

AS SOON as the embargo against the importation of narcissus bulbs was made certain we began a painstaking investigation of available American supplies, in order to assure our customers of the best stocks to be had. Every section of the country where narcissi are being grown, from the Pacific coast to the Atlantic ocean and the Gulf of Mexico, was visited by the manager of our bulb department.

We have selected our American grown Paper Whites with the same care that we have learned to take in purchasing imported bulbs; keeping in mind the requirements of the greenhouse forcer. We have chosen the stock of growers of experience, whose technical ability has been demonstrated, who are in locations of favorable soil and climate and whose stocks have been tested for forcing. And, above all, we have chosen stocks that are free from insects and disease and will not have to be given the heat treatment before shipment. Our narcissus bulbs will carry certificates under the federal quarantine giving them a clean bill of health. We caution florists against buying for forcing purposes narcissi which have received heat treatment.

The fields from which our bulbs come were inspected at flowering time, to insure true type; and a further inspection was made at harvesting time. Grading has also had our personal attention. Our Paper White bulbs will come from selected fields in California and South Carolina and the Rio Grande Valley of Texas. These stocks have all been tested for forcing in soil and in water and the reports from such tests are that while flowering somewhat later than imported bulbs, results are equally good.

We request that in ordering from this stock you give us the privilege of filling with the next lower size, if we cannot furnish the exact size ordered.

Some growers practice premature cutting off the tops, expose bulbs to the sun, in order to make early shipment. This is very dangerous and will cause dry rot.

We therefore take great pains in securing our stock from growers in California who do not use this practice. Our stock is thoroughly cured in the ground and dried thoroughly before they are packed. This, of course, means later delivery but better results can be obtained from such bulbs.

We caution forcers of Callas to water this stock sparingly after planting because Calla bulbs store up considerable moisture.

GREVILLEA Robusta (Silk Oak). These plants give gracefulness to a window or porch box when used in connection with Geraniums or other stock. Here they often take the place of a Boston Fern; answer the purpose every bit as well and make a fine showing all summer, doing well in full sunlight and holding out in the shade during fall and winter. You will find the 2 or 2 1/2-inch plants just the thing for the center of a fern dish in case a customer does not want to pay for the more expensive Cocos. Plants in 3 1/2-inch pots fill in nicely in a plant basket arrangement, around the holidays, or you can use them for the filling of plant boxes for the window or enclosed porch. Sow the seed now. They like a well drained, rather sandy soil and while they don't make as fast a growth as in a cool house, the plants are really better off grown in a Carnation house during the winter than in warmer quarters. A New Christmas Plant

This is our last Fall's introduction. We are not familiar with the culture of this plant and suggested sowing the seed in January. We found since that the seed germinates very slowly and irregularly, and that real good plants are not obtainable if sown so late, so we suggest to our customers to make a sowing in July or August and we feel that better results will be obtained.

The seedlings should not be pricked off into 2-inch pots until they show character leaves.

Next spring as soon as the weather warms up sufficiently, they could be shifted to cold frames in the full rays of the sun and brought back into a forcing temperature about the last week in August and "forced" in a temperature of 60 to 65 degrees for the Christmas trade. They come into flower early, but the first flowers should be kept "nipped" until well on in September when they will begin to take on a general crop which will make them salable in December and for several months following. 200 seeds, \$1.00; 1,000 seeds, \$4.50.
