

We have been notified that our orders of some varieties may be reduced and that sizes in some cases may be smaller than normal. Nevertheless, we are assured, forcing quality will be excellent.

Delivery will be made on each order with the best stock obtainable. On short items we will fill as nearly in full as possible. No substitutions will be made except after notice to buyer and with his consent.

We urge early orders, since there is every indication that all available stocks will be quickly exhausted.

### Hardy Narcissi Also Scarce

Narcissus crops in Oregon and Washington were short and prices are strong. All hardy narcissi offered in this catalog are top size, Northwestern grown. Bulbs from other sections may be offered, but not by us.

Remember, in comparing Dutch bulb prices, WE PAY OCEAN FREIGHT AND DUTY. You are not asked for cash payment of these items, and other added expenses, on delivery of bulbs, as is the case with some American importers. While prices cover these items, they are much reduced on your order by savings due to large volume handling.


