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## P R E F A C E .

IN the year 1887, I prepared for publication in "THE LEWIS LETTER," at the request of its editor, a very imperfect genealogy of my branch of the great LEWIS family. In the classification of the various lines of descent published in that paper by the editor, Mr. F. P. Lewis, this was designated as BOOK XVIII. I have therefore entitled this little volume "BOOK XVIII. OF THE GENEALOGY OF THE LEWIS FAMILY." I was so dissatisfied with this first effort, that I then determined to occupy a part of my leisure in searching the records of our family, and in tracing back our descent as far as possible. In doing this I find that BOOK XVIII. merges into, and for several generations, is identical with BOOK XII., as classified by the same authority.

To undertake a complete genealogy of the LEWIS family, would be far beyond the time at my disposal, even were I competent for the task. This work is, I think, contemplated by a man far better qualified than myself, and I do not doubt that many will join me in hoping that he will sometime be able to carry out his purpose. I have simply confined myself to my own branch of the family, excepting that in a few instances I have given some collateral families whose names have incidentally come to me in my researches.

In accomplishing what I here present, I am indebted to many friends for information and suggestions. I cannot name them all. Very many of them are members of some branch of the family, and therefore, in some degree, have an interest in the undertaking. I especially wish to express my obligation to Mr. Rollin H. Cook, of Pittsfield, Mass., who has freely given me

the results of years of investigation, and furnished me with copies of numerous old records, through which I have obtained valuable information. I am also indebted to I. W. Havens, of Hartford, Julius Gay, of Farmington, Conn., E. R. Estabrook, of Hoosick Falls, N. Y., and many others, for information of great value to me. To these gentlemen, and all others who have contributed to my knowledge, I desire to make suitable acknowledgements.

I should have been pleased to give in fuller detail the history and characteristics of the children and grandchildren of OLIVER<sup>33</sup> and LUCINDA LEWIS, together with a record of their great-grandchildren, but after some effort I found that to carry out this idea with any degree of accuracy, was a task too great for me to undertake with the time at my command. With a few exceptions, therefore, in which lists have been furnished me, I have confined myself in this respect to my own father's family, but have caused to be bound in the book a few blank pages for family records, upon which any line of descent other than my own may be written out, and upon which future generations may carry down the record of their branch of the family, should they desire to do so.

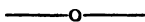

# Genealogy of the Lewis Family.



## *FIRST GENERATION.*

### CHAPTER I.

- I. WILLIAM LEWIS, came from England in the ship *Lion*, landing in Boston, September 16, 1632. He was admitted freeman November 6, 1632, and was a member of the Baintree Company, which in August, 1633, located at Cambridge, Mass. In 1635 he resided at the northwest corner of Winthrop and Holyoke streets, Cambridge. He moved to Hartford in 1636, being one of its earliest settlers. In 1641 he was a juryman and selectman. In 1659 he removed to Hadley, Mass., signing an agreement with his son William Lewis, Jr., Luke Hitchcock, and others, in all fifty-nine persons, to do so, and thus became one of the founders of Hadley. He represented Hadley in the General Court in 1662, and Northampton in 1665. In 1663 he was one of ten troopers in The Hampshire Troop. His wife's name was Felix ——. She died in Hadley, April 17, 1671. The will of Thomas Olcutt, of Hartford, November, 1653, leaves



one pound (£1) to "brother William Lewis senior," It has been suggested that this might indicate that Felix —, his wife, was a sister to Olcutt. Some time after the death of his wife, and before November 29, 1677, he moved to Farmington, Conn., where he died August 2, 1683. His will was admitted to probate August 10, 1683, and the inventory filed December 3, 1683. The will bequeaths to his grandchild Ezekiel, the estate at Hadley, he to pay his brother Nathaniel £16, if he lives to the age of twenty-one years; if he dies, it to go to his grandchild Abigail. He also bequeathed to his grandchild Abigail his land at Hartford "unless her brother Philip needs and cannot do without it, and pays her for it." The executors named were his son William Lewis, Samuel Steele, of Wethersfield, Conn., and Samuel Partrigg, of Hadley. The court records at the State Library in Hartford show that Philip claimed his grandfather's real estate in Hartford under the English law of primogeniture. William and Felix Lewis had but one child, a son,

## *SECOND GENERATION.*

2. i. WILLIAM, who was born in England, and died August 18, 1690. He was a prominent man in Farmington, being the first Recorder of the town, which was incorporated in 1645, and was also Captain of a military company. The history of Waterbury says

that William Lewis, of Farmington, and Samuel Steele, had a deed from Indians February 8, 1657, of a tract of land "with black-lead." One very competent to judge thinks this tract was what is now a part of Harwinton, Plymouth and Litchfield. He was twice married. First to Mary Hopkins, daughter of William Hopkins, of Stratford, Conn., and second to Mary Cheever, November 22, 1671. She was daughter of Ezekiel Cheever, of New Haven and Boston, a noted schoolmaster, was baptized November 29, 1640, and died January 10, 1728. She married for a second husband Dea. Thomas Bull, January 3, 1692. Thomas Bull's first wife was Esther Cowles, daughter of John Cowles, of Farmington, who was born in 1649, married April 29, 1669, and died in 1691.

### *THIRD GENERATION.*

#### CHAPTER II.

CHILDREN OF WILLIAM LEWIS<sup>2</sup> AND MARY HOPKINS, HIS  
FIRST WIFE.

3. i. MARY, was born May 6, 1645. She married Benjamin Judd, who was born about 1642 at Hartford, and who lived in Farmington from 1644 to 1679.

4. ii. PHILIP, was baptized December 13, 1646. He married — Ashley, daughter of Robert Ashley, of Springfield, Mass. Philip was made freeman at Farmington in 1689, and lived afterwards at Hartford and Fairfield.
5. iii. SAMUEL. He bore the military title of Sergeant; was born August 18, 1648, and died in 1725. He was made freeman in 1676; was married to Elizabeth Judd, and probably lived in Farmington.
6. iv. SARAH, was born in 1652, and died August 10, 1722. She married Sergeant Samuel Boltwood, of Hadley, Mass., a son of Robert and Mary Boltwood, who was killed by the Indians February 29, 1704.
7. v. HANNAH. Date of birth and death unknown. She married, first, Samuel Crow, of Hadley, Mass., and second, Daniel Marsh, of Hartford.
8. vi. WILLIAM. Date of birth not known. Was baptized March 15, 1656 or 57, and died in 1737. He married Phoebe More, daughter of Dea. Isaac More, of Farmington. He (William) also lived at Farmington.
9. vii. FELIX, was baptized December 12, 1658, and died after 1738. She married Thomas Selden, of Hadley, who died November 24, 1734.
10. viii. EBENEZER. Date of birth unknown. He was married, December 2, 1685, to Elizabeth Merriman,

who was born September 14, 1669, a daughter of Captain Nathaniel Merriman, one of the first settlers of Wallingford, Conn. Ebenezer lived in the eastern part of Wallingford in 1684.

11. ix. JOHN. Born May 15, 1665, and died about 1694.
12. x. JAMES. Born July 10, 1667. He was in Farmington in 1696; later on Long Island. He appealed from his father's will, and afterwards ran away to Jamaica and died in 1728.

CHILDREN OF WILLIAM LEWIS<sup>2</sup> AND MARY CHEEVER, HIS  
SECOND WIFE.

13. xi. ELIZABETH, was born October 20, 1672, and died in 1674.
14. xii. EZEKIEL, was born November 7, 1674, and died August 14, 1755. He graduated at Yale College, Class of 1695, and was a merchant in Boston when he died. The executors of his will were Ezekiel Lewis, of Woodbury, and William Judd, of Farmington. He married first, March 18, 1702, Mary Braden, who died February, 1703. He married second, October 11, 1704, Abigail Kilcup, the widow of Rodger Kilcup.
15. xiii. NATHANIEL, was born at Farmington, Conn., October 1, 1676, and died February 24, 1752. He married, first, Abigail Ashley, November 25, 1699.

She was daughter of David and Hannah (Grover) Ashley, of Westfield, Mass., and was born April 27, 1681. He married second, July 4, 1726, Thankful (Pomeroy) Lyman. She was born at Northampton, Mass., May 31, 1679, and died at Northampton September 18, 1773. She was daughter of Medad and Experience (Woodward) Pomeroy, and widow of Lieut. Benjamin Lyman, who was a son of John Lyman, and born in 1674. Nathaniel Lewis and his wife joined the Church March 19, 1710. He lived at Farmington.

16. xiv. ABIGAIL, was born September 19, 1678, and died January 20, 1707. She married, December 10, 1696, William Wadsworth, of Farmington.
17. xv. JOSEPH, was born March 15, 1679 or 1680. I have found no further record of him.
18. xvi. DANIEL, was born July 16, 1681. He married May 1, 1718, Mary Strong, daughter of Asahel and Margaret Strong, of Farmington. She (Mary) was born January 22, 1692, and died April 9, 1751. Daniel was a farmer. Savage says "the last died young." He probably refers to Joseph instead of Daniel.

## *FOURTH GENERATION.*

### CHAPTER III.

#### CHILDREN OF NATHANIEL'S AND ABIGAIL (ASHLEY) LEWIS.

19. i. NATHANIEL, was born at Farmington January 1, 1703. He joined the Church in 1734. December 2, 1739, his father gave him a deed, in which the consideration named is "parental love and affection for my son Nathaniel." About 1752 a deed was recorded from Nathaniel Lewis, of New Hartford, to his brother Phineas, in which reference is made to their mother, Thankful Lewis. She was in fact their step-mother. He married, February 17, 1733, Rachel Kelsey, of Wethersfield, Conn., and died before February 17, 1759. Rachel Kelsey was daughter to John and Mary (Buck) Kelsey. Mary Buck was daughter to Ezekiel and Rachel (Andrews) Buck. She was born in 1682, and married John Kelsey November 23, 1704. Rachel Andrews was daughter of John Andrews, one of the earliest settlers of Farmington, and was born in 1652. She married Ezekiel Buck, son of Emanuel (or Enoch) Buck, March 18, 1675. Ezekiel Buck was born January 15, 1650, at Wethersfield, and died March 3, 1713.
20. ii. NOADIAH, was born April 27, 1708, at Farmington, and died November 4, 1736. He married, December 4, 1735, Elizabeth Smith.

21.    iii.   ELISHA, was baptized July 30, 1710.
22.    iv.   PHINEAS, was born April 11, 1722. He married, November 27, 1746, Sarah Norton. He was a Lieutenant in the militia from 1757 to 1766. The date of his death has not been found. December 23, 1768, he received a deed from Giles Pettibone.

Whether there were any children between Elisha, born in 1710, and Phineas, born in 1722, is not now known. It is possible, perhaps probable, that there were.

It is, I think, safe to assume, that no children were born to Nathaniel and Thankful (Lyman) Lewis. She had twelve children by her first husband, as follows:

CHAPTER IV.

CHILDREN OF NATHANIEL<sup>19</sup> AND RACHEL (KELSEY) LEWIS, BORN  
AT FARMINGTON, CONN.

23. i. CHARLES, was born January 6, 1734. His wife's name was Rhoda —. They had seven children as follows:
1. NATHANIEL.—Baptized July 29, 1759.
  2. ELIZABETH.—Baptized March 22, 1761.
  3. CHLOE.—Baptized November 28, 1762.
  4. JOANNA.—Baptized May 5, 1765.
  5. RACHEL.—Baptized September 6, 1767.
  6. JERUSHA.—Baptized June 11, 1769.
  7. CHARLES.—Baptized April 19, 1772.
24. ii. OLIVER, was born November 28, 1736. He married Hannah ~~Kelly~~, daughter of James ~~Kelly~~, who was born July 9, 1740, at Farmington. His grandson, Oliver H. Lewis, of Ridgeville, O., informed the writer several years ago that he was an officer in the British army in the French war, and died at Quebec. He was therefore probably connected with General Wolf's army, to which Quebec capitulated September 17, 1759. Certain records may seem to conflict with this. The records of the Probate Court

at Hartford, under date of October 12, 1759, show that he was that day appointed guardian of his sister Hannah, and proceeds to say that "the said Oliver now acknowledges himself bound to the Judge of this court, on his recognizance of £200 money, that he will faithfully discharge the trust of a guardian to said minor, according to law." Records also show that February 17, 1759, his older brother Charles, who was executor of his father Nathaniel's will, asked for a distribution of his father's estate. This order of distribution was made April 18, 1760, giving a list of the children, and in this list naming "the heirs of Oliver." From these records it is evident that he was living October 12, 1759, and was dead April 18, 1760. If it is true that he died at Quebec, the Probate Court record in Hartford may be explained on either of two theories. First, that he was then home on leave of absence, and soon returned to the army; or, second, that, when he gave bail to the Probate Court in October, 1759, he was not there in person, but appeared by attorney. I have also been unable to find the date of the death of Hannah, his wife. Major George Payne, of Marietta, Ohio, who is her only surviving grandchild, remembers distinctly that she, in company with her son Oliver, visited his mother at their home near Winsted, Conn., in January, 1812. In the fall of 1812 his father moved to Ohio, and he also remembers that a few years afterward his mother received a letter from his Uncle

Oliver, conveying the intelligence that their mother had died at Hoosick, N. Y. It seems quite probable that being a widow, she should make her home with one of her three children, and as we know that she did not live with either Oliver or Hannah, I think it safe to assume that Mr. Payne's recollection is correct, and that she spent her last years with her oldest son Benjamin, who settled at Hoosick Falls, N. Y., and that she probably died there some time after 1812, although no record of her death or burial there can be found.

25.   iii. JUSTUS. He married Mary ——. New Hartford records show a deed to Aaron Richards from Justus and Mary Lewis. He died before 1816, as a deed dated March 12, 1816, to David Williams, names four children, heirs of Justus Lewis, late of New Hartford, as follows:
1. JUSTUS, who removed to Decatur, N. Y.
  2. ROSWELL, who removed to Chenango, N. Y.
  3. THOMAS, who removed to Richland, N. Y.
  4. ABI, she lived in New Hartford in 1816.
26.   iv. LYDIA, was baptized August 16, 1741. She seems to have been unable to entirely care for herself, as at the New Hartford town meeting December 5, 1763, six shillings and sixpence were voted to widow Elizabeth Shepard for keeping her.
27.   v. THANKFUL, was baptized October 6, 1744. She died before 1760, leaving heirs, as in the distribution

of estate of Nathaniel her father, made April 18, 1760, the *heirs* of Thankful are named.

28. vi. HANNAH, was baptized April 12, 1747. She married Mr. — Stevens, of Farmington.
29. vii. RUTH, was baptized August 5, 1750. She married John Stanley, of Hartford. She gave a deed March 12, 1778, to Justus Lewis.
30. viii. LABAN, was baptized June 21, 1752. He must have died before April, 1760, as he is not named in the distribution of his father's estate.
31. ix. RACHEL, was baptized November 9, 1753. She also must have died before April, 1760, for the same reason given in the case of Laban.

## SIXTH GENERATION.

### CHAPTER V.

CHILDREN OF OLIVER<sup>24</sup> AND HANNAH (KELLY) LEWIS.

32. i. BENJAMIN, was born at New Hartford, Conn., June 24, 1755. He was baptized at Farmington May 28, 1756, and died at Hoosick Falls, N. Y., October 29, 1831. He married Mary Howe, who

was born November 7, 1754, and died April 2, 1832. She was a descendant of General Howe, of the British army, but whether it was General George Augustus Howe, who fell at Ticonderoga July 5, 1758, or Sir William Howe, who was for three years Commander-in-chief of the British army in the war of the Revolution, I am unable to learn. The tradition is that she descended from Lord Howe, but this is improbable, as he was Admiral of the British navy, and not a General in the army, and had, so far as I know, but one daughter, who received in England, at her father's death, his baronial honors.

Benjamin Lewis was a Sergeant in Colonel Meigs' regiment in the Revolutionary war; was at New York when that city was taken by the British. He was also at New Haven and White Plains, and afterwards went to Canada under General Montgomery.

33. ii. OLIVER, was born January 25, 1758, at Farmington, was baptized February 12, 1758, and died March 21, 1839, at Ridgeville, Lorain county, Ohio. He married, March 13, 1783, Lucinda North, who was born July 16, 1762, and died January 30, 1838. She was daughter to David and Sarah North, of Northington, Conn. He (Oliver) was a member of Lieut. Thomas Bidwell's company, who were called out in the Revolutionary war, entering service August 19, 1776. He was a builder by trade, taking large contracts, and having a great reputation as

a bridge-builder. He removed from New Hartford to Farmington about 1787, from there to New Marlborough, Berkshire county, Mass., about 1796, from there, about 1805, to Vernon, Oneida county, N. Y., and thence to Mantua, Ohio, and afterwards to Ridgeville, Ohio, where he lived in his old age, with his second son, Oliver H. Lewis. The above dates are based on these records. 1st, The record of birth of Truman and Theodocia, his oldest children, is not found at Farmington, while the records of birth of the next five children, from Serena, born in 1788, to Oliver H., born in 1796, are found at Farmington. 2d, Records also show that Oliver Lewis, of Farmington, bought land from Isaac P. Barber, of New Marlborough, November 5, 1796, and of Ephraim Bigelow April 12, 1802. He also sold land in New Marlborough to Abner Webster, February 10, 1802, to Isaac Spaulding, of Norfolk, Conn., April 1, 1802, and to Herman Walter, January 6, 1805. These records seem to show a residence in the several places mentioned about as stated. He was a man of irreproachable character, universally esteemed and honored.

34. iii. HANNAH, was born January 13, 1759. She was baptized January 27, 1760, and died January 10, 1849. She married, December 9, 1779, Abram Payne. He was born May 24, 1758, and died October 30, 1827. He was a Sergeant in the 25th Connecticut regiment, Colonel Ozias Brownson, in

the Revolutionary war. September 14, 1812, they left their home near Winsted, Conn., and after a long and tiresome journey through a new country, they reached Marietta, Ohio. They settled on a farm at Salem, Washington county, Ohio, where they afterwards lived, died, and in a small cemetery upon which, they were buried.

## *SEVENTH GENERATION.*

### CHAPTER VI.

#### CHILDREN AND GRANDCHILDREN OF BENJAMIN<sup>32</sup> AND MARY (HOWE) LEWIS.

35. i. BENJAMIN, was born July 27, 1784, and died at Hoosick Falls, N. Y., September 18, 1868. He married Synthia Tucker July 14, 1816. She was born January 23, 1794, and died October 3, 1874.
36. ii. POLLY, was born December 16, 1785, and died June 4, 1842. She married, November 11, 1810, Eber Crandall, who was born October 15, 1789, and died June 21, 1866.

#### CHILDREN OF BENJAMIN<sup>35</sup> AND SYNTHIA (TUCKER) LEWIS.

37. i. SARAH MARIA, was born April 18, 1817, and died December 12, 1888. She married Orin Barnhart October 17, 1836.

38. ii. BENJAMIN A., was born April 3, 1819, and died August 13, 1858. He married Eunice G. Estabrook February 28, 1842.
39. iii. SYNTHIA LOUISA, twin sister to Benjamin A., was born April 3, 1819, and died August 11, 1882. She was never married.
40. iv. HANNAH A., was born June 30, 1830. She married, September 7, 1858, John Fuller, who was born November 15, 1828, and died September 26, 1885.

## CHAPTER VII.

### CHILDREN OF OLIVER<sup>33</sup> AND LUCINDA (NORTH) LEWIS.

41. i. TRUMAN, was born at New Hartford, Conn., November 5, 1784, and died at Warsaw, N. Y., September 15, 1865. He left his father's house at Vernon, N. Y., in the spring of 1807, and made his way on foot, much of the way through a wilderness, to Orangeville, Wyoming county, N. Y., where he bought some land in what was then an almost unbroken forest. This farm he owned when he died. Here he and his wife literally hewed out for themselves and their children a home. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church. In the war of 1812 he

was in active service, holding a commission as ensign from Governor Daniel D. Tompkins. He was frequently elected to important town offices. He represented Genesee county in the Legislature, in the years 1834 and 1835, and was the first Treasurer of Wyoming county. For something like fifteen *years* he was the agent for Wyoming county of the Farmers' Loan and Trust Company, of New York, and for the town of Orangeville, of the trustees under the will of James Lloyd, deceased, of Boston, Mass. These parties were the successors of the old Holland Land Company, and at the time they held a very large number of mortgages and owned a great number of farms in that part of Wyoming county included in the Holland Land Company's purchase. This business entrusted to him was therefore one of great magnitude. He so discharged his duties, however, as to both merit and receive the most gratifying commendation of the companies he represented, and the thanks and confidence of all persons occupying these lands, and liable to pay these mortgages; who everywhere expressed their gratitude for his kindness and forbearance, and their perfect faith in his integrity and justice. After closing up this business he came to Warsaw, N. Y., and spent the last seven years of his life with the writer, at whose house he died. He was a man of great executive ability, of eminent good judgment, and of the strictest integrity. He was also a genial, companionable man, possessing



an inexhaustible fund of anecdotes, with which he often entertained his friends. He married, October 3, 1811, Lucy Porter, who was born March 6, 1795. She was the daughter of Seth Porter, born January 2, 1770, and Sarah (Cowles) Porter, born April 10, 1772, and grand-daughter of Captain John Porter, born in 1746, and Jerusha Porter, born December 20, 1747. She was a woman in every way worthy of her husband. She died at Rockford, Ill., December 13, 1866.

42. ii. THEODOCIA, was born at New Hartford April 26, 1786. She married, first, November 7, 1811, Josiah Judson, who died May 4, 1824. She married, second, Truman Pitkin, March 29, 1826. She died December 25, 1866, at Rootstown, O. Truman Pitkin died May 23, 1873.
43. iii. SERENA, was born at Farmington, Conn., January 14, 1788. She was baptized as *Cyrena*, August 3, 1788, and died at Carey, Ohio, July 2, 1864. She married, October 23, 1809, Lyman Cody. He was born September 2, 1783, and died May 9, 1845.
44. iv. CORINNA, was born at Farmington, December 23, 1789; was baptized March 7, 1790, and died at Aurora, Portage county, Ohio, June 9, 1878. She married, first, September 13, 1814, Isaac D. Faxon, and second, Reuben Avery.
45. v. LUCINDA, was born at Farmington, January 15, 1792, was baptized April 29, 1792, and died at

Humboldt, Nebraska, December 19, 1884. She married, January, 1811, Jonathan Tinker. He died November, 1852.

46. vi. PAMELIA, was born at Farmington, February 12, 1794, was baptized July 27, 1794, and died at Cleveland, Ohio, October 21, 1862. She married Zenas Kent in 1811, at Vernon, Oneida county, N. Y. He was born at Middletown, Conn., July 12, 1786, and died at Cleveland, Ohio, October 4, 1865. They lived first at Ravenna, O., and afterwards at Cleveland. He was a successful merchant, and accumulated a large property.
47. vii. OLIVER HIRAM, was born at Farmington, July 1, 1796, was baptized September 4, 1796, and died at Ridgeville, Ohio, November 5, 1884. He was married three times: First to Alma Beebe; second to Sarah Webster, and third to Sally Denison. His residence was Ridgeville. He was a man of broad and generous character, of impressive appearance, and the most amiable qualities.
48. viii. JASON, was born at New Marlborough, Mass., August 10, 1798, and died at Hinsdale, N. Y., March 26, 1882.
