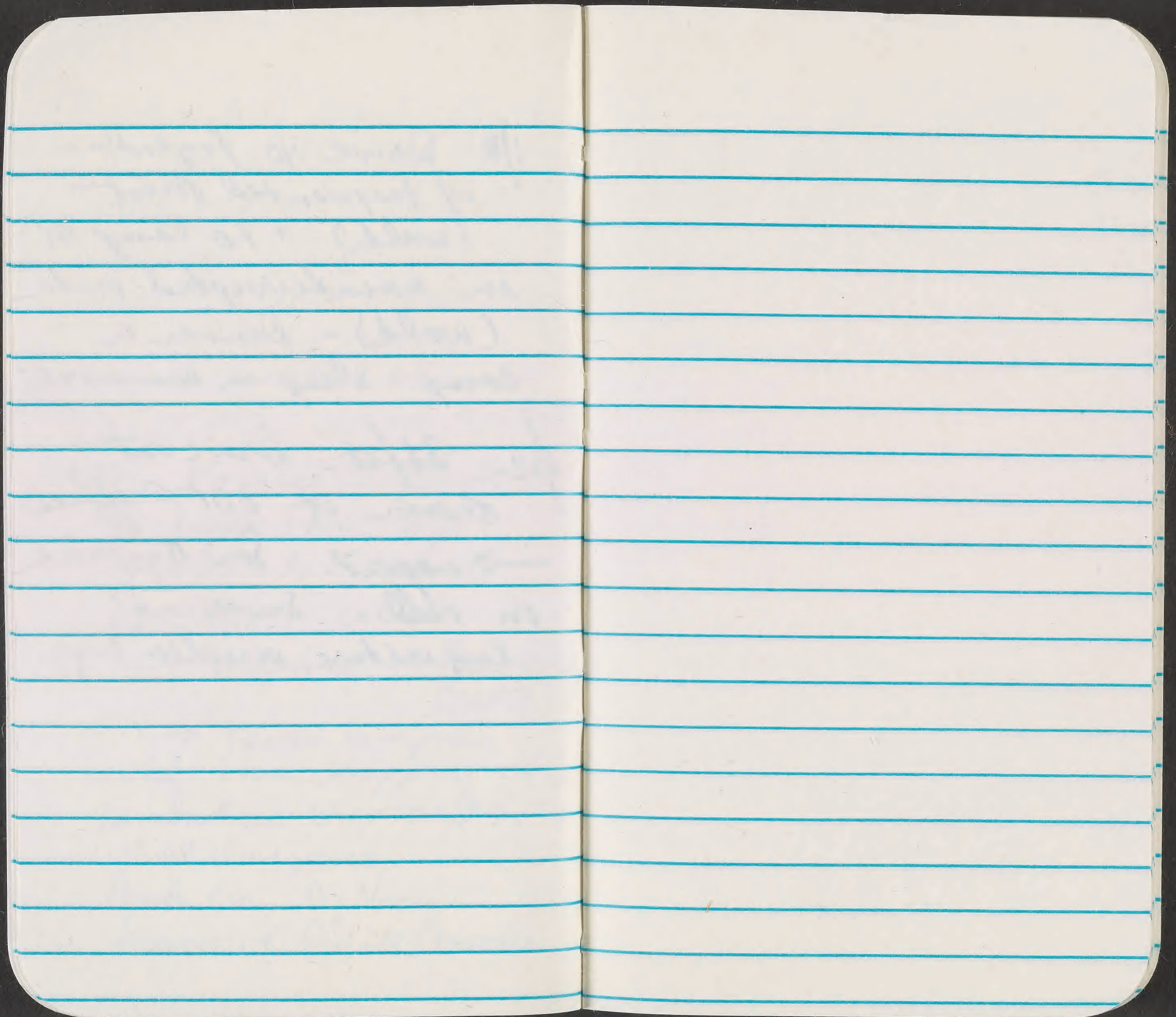

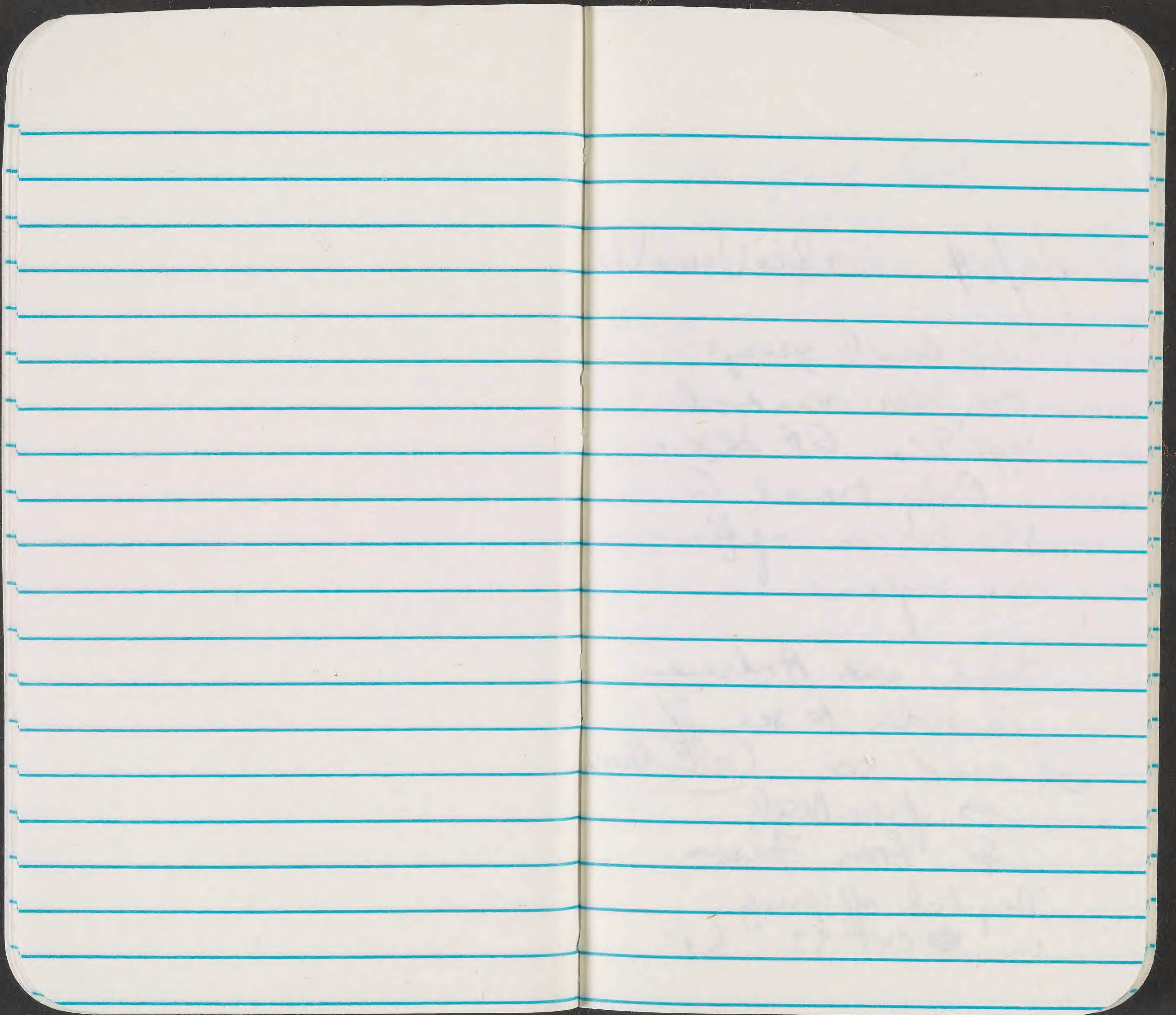

also African water buffalo + we later see a herd of 7-8 buffalo that have escaped and are free in the large piece of ~~the~~ continuous forest.

Some points:

1) When forests were isolated, initially ↑ # bird species, then decline.

2) Many ^{primary forest} frogs now breed near the edge or in pasture wherever there are ponds.

Pastures + edges may ↑ frog reproduction.

3) Edges result in trees with more light & less buffering, thus near edges, more leaves drop & more branches drop from wind.

Temperature inside is significantly cooler than outside.

After walking thru forest isolate, we drive another hour & walk @ 10-15 min. to get to Camp #41.

This camp is in a

1/11
patch of uninterrupted forest.

Has about 10-15 hammocks under a roof & 2 tables & kitchen.

Two latrines in the woods & a lovely cool stream where everyone bathes.

We take a short walk in the forest.

I am surprised by the height (it's lower than I expected — only 20-30 m high)

Also doesn't have as many large diameter trees as expected.

Some birds etc may be limited by presence of tree holes!

With us on trips
Andrew Whittaker,
from Birmingham, who
knows the birds
incredibly well by vocs.
& who Tom L. asked
to come as a guide.

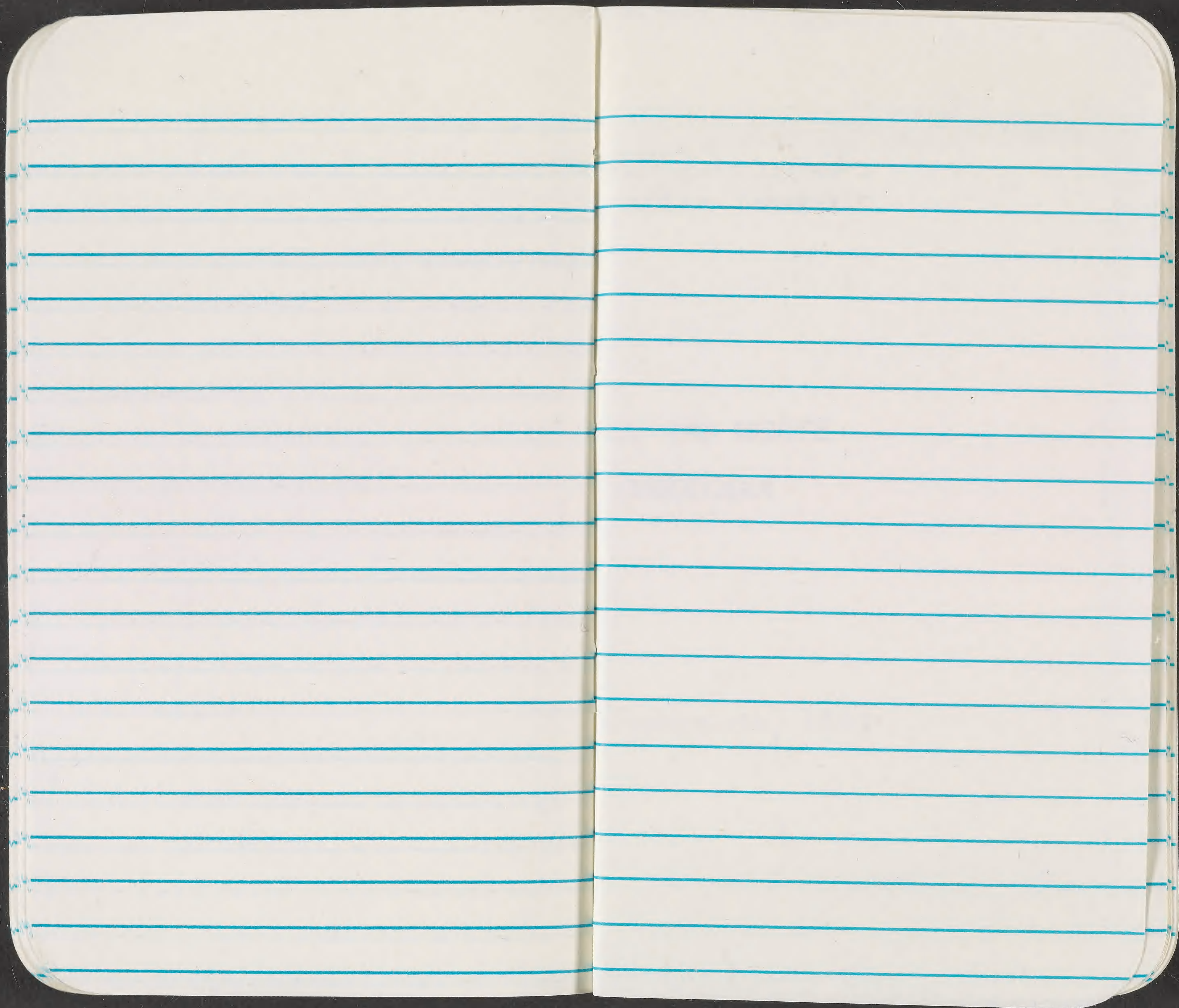



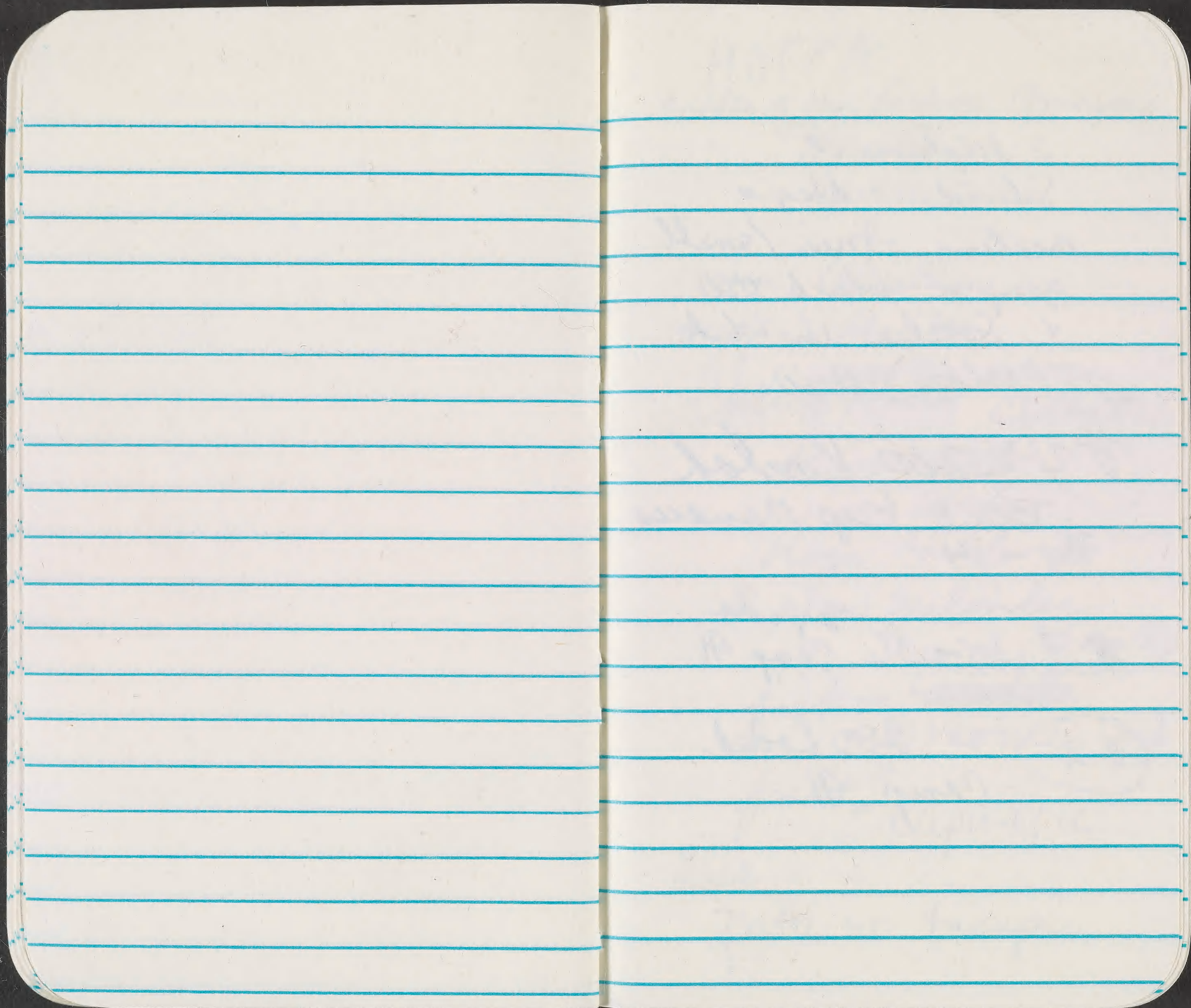
