



Biddle Memorial Hall





Biddle Memorial Hall is the oldest structure on campus, constructed between 1883-1884 at a cost of \$40,000, and was named the "University Administration Building" under the leadership of the first president, Dr. Stephen Mattoon. It received its current name in 1923 when the University's name changed from Biddle University to Johnson C. Smith University under the fifth president, Dr. Henry L. McCrorey, and in 1925, the clock tower was installed at a cost of \$6,025. Biddle is the surname of the school's first major donor, Mrs. Henry J. Biddle; her husband died in 1862 while fighting for the Union in the Civil War. Under the current president, Dr. Dorothy Cowser Yancy, the third major renovation on Biddle commenced in 2002 by Gantt Huberman after \$6.7 million was raised, and was completed in 2005.



JCSU History

In 1867, the Reverend S. C. Alexander and the Reverend W. L. Miller saw the need to establish an institution to educate freed persons in one section of the South [and as a result, plans were devised] to secure the [institution]. The movement for the school was formally inaugurated on April 7, 1867, at a meeting of the Catawba Presbytery in the old Charlotte Presbyterian Church.... The two ministers were elected as teachers.

Information about establishing the school was brought to the attention of Mrs. Mary D. Biddle, a devout churchwoman of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, who...pledged \$1400. In appreciation of this first and generous contribution, friends of the project requested of Mrs. Biddle permission to name the newly established school after her late husband, Major Henry Biddle...

Colonel W. R. Myers, a wealthy Charlottean, donated the first eight acres of land...for the school. From 1867 to 1876, the school was known as the Biddle Memorial Institute. In 1876...the name of the school became Biddle University. The institution operated under this name until 1923.

Also in 1924, the institution was recognized by the North Carolina State Board of Education as a four-year college.... In 1932, the University's charter was amended, providing for the admission of women to the senior division [thereby making the institution] partially coeducational. In 1941...the University was a fully coeducational institution.

Johnson C. Smith University joined the United Negro College Fund in 1944. The institution's membership in the fund began to bear fruit immediately.... Through increasing support from the Duke Endowment, the United Negro College Fund, and other sources, the period between 1955 and 1968 was one of expansion of the physical plant and enrichment of the curriculum. Seven new buildings were erected during this period.... Since 1968, structures have been erected or renovated: ...Greenfield Hall, [the] Newsom Humanities Building, the Robert L. Albright Honors College...and the Irwin Belk Complex.... A complete renovation of Biddle Hall was completed April 2005.

The present site contains 100 acres of land and 39 buildings. The University has approximately fifteen hundred students and over 250 full-time faculty members, administrators, and staff members for administrative and support services.

Increasingly aware that today's demand for truly educated men and women is the most pressing in history and that quality and versatility are prerequisites to equal opportunity for all, Johnson C. Smith faces the challenge of its second century with new vision and a calculated plan of action.

JCSU Mission



Founded in 1867 under the auspices of the Committee on Freedmen of the Presbyterian Church, USA, Johnson C. Smith University is an independent, private, coeducational institution of higher learning. Located in the rapidly growing metropolis of Charlotte, North Carolina, the "Queen City of the South," this historically Black university has a residential campus with a familial atmosphere in which students are stimulated and nurtured by dedicated, caring faculty and staff. Consistent with its Christian roots, the University recognizes the importance of moral and ethical values to undergird intellectual development and all endeavors. Johnson C. Smith believes in the unrelenting pursuit of knowledge and the value of cultivating the life of the mind. The University assigns great significance to the development of self-confidence, to the understanding of one's own heritage as an awareness of the cultures of others, to the exploration of the myriad forces affecting people of this complex, technological age, and to the formulation of a sense of one's role in this schema.

The mission of Johnson C. Smith University is to provide an outstanding education for a diverse group of talented and highly motivated students from various ethnic, socioeconomic, and geographical backgrounds. Johnson C. Smith offers a liberal education in conjunction with concentrated study in specialized fields in preparation for advanced study and specific careers.

The University endeavors to produce graduates who are able to communicate effectively, think critically, learn independently as well as collaboratively, and demonstrate competence in their chosen fields. Further, it provides and environment in which students can fulfill their physical, social, cultural, spiritual, and other personal needs and in which they can develop a compelling sense of social and civic responsibility for leadership and service in a dynamic, multicultural society. Likewise, the University embraces its responsibility to provide leadership, service, and lifelong learning to the larger community.

Regarding teaching effectiveness as paramount in its educational enterprise, Johnson C. Smith has a commitment to the recruitment and retention of an outstanding faculty. To this end, the University promotes faculty development, encourages faculty involvement in research and other creative activities, and endorses the principles of academic freedom.

To ensure the integrity and stability of its status and the perpetuation of its rich legacy, Johnson C. Smith University has firm resolve to maintain the fiscal and human resources requisite to be a truly distinctive institution-- a hallmark of excellence in its students, faculty, staff, administrators, academic and other programs, facilities, operations, and environment.



In the fall of 2006, JCSU went through the accreditation process on the QEP Plan. One particular Goal was to reach consensus among diverse stakeholders and articulate a shared conceptual frame (vision).

SACS Core Requirement 2.12 states that "the institution [must develop] an acceptable Quality Enhancement Plan [and] that the plan [be] part of an ongoing planning and evaluation process."

The essential components of a successful QEP include:

- -A clear defined and focused topic that directly relates to student learning,
- -A set of clearly defined goals as well as learning outcomes that are achievable and assessable,
- -Assessment strategies that allow the institution to determine the achievement of goals as well as use the results for continued improvement,
- -A description of adequate resources that are in place for implementation,
- -Evidence of broad involvement and support of the plan.

The development of QEP is based upon a comprehensive and thorough analysis of the effectiveness of the learning environment for supporting student learning and accomplishing the mission of the institution. The QEP is, and should be integrated into the institutions ongoing planning and evaluation processes.



Earvin "Magic" Johnson visits JCSU



Earvin "Magic" Johnson on The Disease of Color, 'Each one, teach one'. By Serena Love

On Wednesday, February 28, 2007, Earvin "Magic" Johnson came to speak not on basketball but on an issue far more important. An issue that 89% of people of color are affected by. The issue was HIV.

Each year out of the newly infected, more than 50% of them are Black and 29% of them are Hispanic. Black women are 14 more times likely to contract HIV than white women. And for every 10 HIV tests taken, every 3 are diagnosed (30%) with AIDS, which means these people have had HIV long enough for it to have become full blown AIDS. This can also mean many probably have no idea they are infected and are spreading the disease unknowingly to innocent bodies. So Magic Johnson, being the leader that he is, unveiled a program called "I Stand with Magic" on Dec. 1, 2006, World AIDS Day. The purpose and goal of this program is to end HIV-infection and AIDS in the black community through education, protection, testing and HIV-treatment.

Johnson opened his JCSU speech in Biddle Hall's Gambrell Auditorium with basketball, how much he loved the game and the joy and excitement he got from it. This is a man who won 5 championships, who was and still is a star, a legend, but its also a man who thought HIV could never happen to him. He is trying to get uninfected people to realize they can remain unaffected. "Read the information, do what you need to, you have a chance to do something about it."he said. "[You] may moan and groan when I say this but the safest sex is no sex." And the audience did moan, laugh, and turn up their faces, but Magic stayed serious.

"The purpose is to educate yourself and not to be just book smart. You must have common sense as well, because no matter how buff a man is or how fine a woman is they could be carrying the virus." The way he found out he had HIV was through a test for basketball. At the time he was playing for the Lakers and they were required to take two physicals, one for the team and one for insurance. The insurance physical was the one that included the HIV test. Magic says he was more devastated that he couldn't play ball anymore than he was about having HIV. On top of all that he had to tell his wife who at the time was pregnant. She told him she loved him and that they would get through it.

However, he became depressed and wasn't doing much of anything. Finally his wife came in one day and told him that she and the kids were tired of him, he was depressed and was not the man she married, she wanted back the man she married, and so he got it together.

Currently, Magic has 25,000 people on his payroll. He has 106 Starbucks, 32 Burger Kings, and 42 Fitness Clubs among other things. He explained that he makes sure his establishments perform well and are successful. He said, "If you can't imagine yourself being successful it's a problem. You must be able to imagine yourself where you want to be. If you can't dream it, you can't become it. You must use your opportunities. Just because your poor doesn't mean you have to have poor dreams. If you have friends that don't believe in your dreams and support you, let them go. Students get scholarships and won't go to class. If you have a scholarship, you should be in class." He said he always listened to speakers to better himself and be smarter, because "you can't learn everything, but that's why there are speakers, so learn from them and use what they tell you."

In closing Johnson told students, "You can't just be in the BET world, you can't just be that. You gotta cross over to a lot of different worlds." He encouraged athletes to get tested and he answered questions from the audience. One question was, "When you find out someone has HIV how can you help them and support them?" He answered, "Treat people the same. If you knew them before and you use to dap them up and hug them, do the same thing after you find out. Don't treat them any different and don't ask them every two minutes if they're okay, they want to be treated the same and know you care. but don't overdo it. On the other hand, if you find out you have HIV and your uncle doesn't want to be your uncle anymore, get another uncle."

The athletic team selected the Sponsors of Johnson C. Smith University from Barber-Scotia College. During the thirties upper class Scotia women were admitted to Johnson C. Smith University. The upper class Scotia women were selected by the athletic team to be the Sponsors of JCSU. The title "Sponsor" underwent a change and the title "Miss Johnson C. Smith Homecoming Queen" was later adopted.

Miss Johnson C. Smith University was selected by the football team and crowned by the President during halftime at the homecoming games. This practice continued until 1944. Dr. Hardy Liston, then the Executive Vice President, installed the student government association and its first president Mr. William Davis to handle all homecoming events.

Glamour during homecoming started when Mrs. Inez Moore Parker staged the coronation of the Queen as a special feature before the homecoming game. The ceremony resembled the British Coronation with all its beauty and glamour. Soon the coronation became the pride and joy of every Smith female. The coronation took place in Biddle Hall until 1965. When the new gymnasium was built, the crowning of Miss JCSU was held at the gym. The homecoming queen activities were filled with glamour and prestige under the sponsorship of Mrs. Inez Moore Parker for thirty years.

During the sixties when the phrase Black is Beautiful expressed the sentiments of blacks in America, the style of the coronation changed to reflect an afrocentric perspective. Mrs. Joyce Crisp, then the student union Directress in 1972, headed the first afrocentric coronation. The script for the coronation was written in Swahili with assistance from Le Roi Jones. Mrs. Crisp designed the set with an African motif. Everything was designed with the most exquisite taste and related to the homecoming theme.

History of Basketball

Today, looking back, almost all sports have evolved from one another. In 1891, basketball was created to keep restless young men busy, and the first sets of rules were developed. The origin of this sport is traced back to a man named Dr. James Naismith. In 1891, he was attending a training school at the Young Mens Christian Association (YMCA) in Springfield, Massachusetts. The idea behind basketball was to create a sport that could be played inside, but still developed skill and didn't rely so much on one's strength. The first game was played with two peach baskets, four goals and a soccer ball. Basketball was not accepted in many countries until 1893, and in the U.S. was played through the YMCA. The original balls were brown and also difficult for players as well as fans to see, so in 1905 Tony Hinkle developed the orange basketball used today. The first gamewas played on January 20th 1982 in the YMCA with nine players. It wasn't until 1936 when basketball was brought to the Berlin Olympics. Thereafter, it became a popular professional sport, which even now is still loved and shouted for with great and competitive excitement.




History of Football



The history of football is important to the culture of the United States as well as football games around the world. American football is a descendent of rugby football and is the most popular sport in the United States. In rugby, the ball is kicked at a goal and then carried over a line. Football, also called "gridiron," is known for being physically rough and strategic. Rugby was played without the use of pads, no time outs and limited substitutions. In 1823, a rugby school student William Ebb Ellis picked up the ball during a soccer game and ran with it. This is what influenced Walter Camp, who, in 1879, first instituted the rules of the game. Walter Camp wrote the first rule book and edited every American football rulebook written until his death in 1975. Walter Camp also contributed the below changes from rugby and soccer to the American football game:

- -one side retained undisputed possession of the ball, until that side gives up the ball as a result of its own -violations
- -the line of scrimmage
- -11 on a team instead of 15
- -created the quarter-back and center positions
- -forward pass
- -standardized the scoring system, numerical scoring
- -created the safety, interference, penalties, and the neutral zone
- -tackling as low as the knee was permitted 1888
- -a touchdown increased in value to six points and field goals went down to three points 1912

Luv-A-Bulls



This is a sport that uses shouting and clapping for encouragement, it also uses routines organized with gymnastics, dance, and stunting to cheer on sports teams at games and matches. Cheerleaders perform complicated stunts that require endurance, strength, flexibility and a number of other qualities that are required in many other sports. Cheerleading first started at Princeton University in the 1880s with the crowd chant "Rah Rah Rah, tiger lion bear, sis sis sis, boom boom, ahhhhhh; Princeton Princeton Princeton," to encourage school spirit at football games. Today 97% of cheerleading participants are female. In 1920 females started to participate in cheerleading because of the limited collegiate sports offered to them. Cheerleading is most associated with football and basketball. Other sports such as ice hockey, soccer, volleyball, baseball and wrestling rarely ever have cheerleaders. In the 1960s the NFL organized professional cheerleading teams to encourage the crowds with yelling, chants, and stunts. Today, many cheerleading teams entertain with dance performances, including the Luv-A-Bulls at JCSU.



Women's Tennis



The origin of tennis has been disputed; some believe that Egyptians, Greeks and Romans all played a similar game to tennis. The word tennis derived from the Egyptian town of Tinnis. Racquet evolved from an Arabic word, Rahat meaning "hands palm." In Egypt when the game was played they used the palm of their hands to hit the ball. Balls then were made of cork, wool or hair which eventually began to hurt their hands. Players started using gloves, and then paddles attached to handles, which then evolved into a racquet. Within 200 years a fully developed racquet was used; it had a wooden frame and was strung with sheep's gut. The interest in tennis reduced greatly until the 1850s when Charles Goodyear invented vulcanization (which improved the strength, resilience and texture of rubber by combining with sulfur or other additives under heat and pressure) which resulted in bouncier balls. In 1874, Major Walter C. Wingfield patented equipment and rules for the game similar to modern day tennis, he was also known as the father of modern day tennis. In Wingfield's rules the courts were shaped like an hourglass, narrow at the net and widened as it went out. He tried to revise this in 1875 but didnt have much luck. In 1877, the All England Club held the first Wimbledon tournament and soon after the members came up with more rules and modified the look of the court. Even then the net was still five feet high on each side and three feet in the center. In 1982, the rules were revised again and are the same rules we currently use today.

Indoor-track and field meets date back to 1863 with 100-, 200-, 440- and 880-yard races and the triple jump. Track and field is composed of running, hurdling, jumping and throwing events between people or teams involved in indoor or outdoor meets. Track events include running and hurdling whereas field events include throwing and jumping. There is no fixed number of team members and most athletes participate in more than one event. This is one of the worlds oldest sporting events; track and field was depicted in Ancient Egyptian Art. Records also prove that races took place in Ancient Greece before 1000 B.C. The first athletic group held its first collegiate races in 1873. The first modern track and field meets happened in 1837 and the first NCAA national championships were held for men in 1921. Women were not entered into events in the Olympic Games until 1928, and, up until the 1970s, women in track and field struggled for acceptance.

In cross country, teams of runners compete to see who can finish a course in open and rough terrain fastest. Cross country differs from road running and track running, in that the course usually includes grass, mud, woodlands ad water. Teams are composed of between four and twelve runners. This sport originated from England in the early 1800s where it was mainly offered just in public schools. (In the United States amateur running differed depending on the league and gender of the runner.) In the 19th century in England, cross country started with a game called hare and hounds known to some as paper chase. In this game a runner or a group of runners laid a trail by dropping pieces of paper or other markers while following a random course. Then a second set of runners set out to follow the trail in which they left behind. The English National Cross Country Championship was established in 1876. In 1880, cross country running was introduced at Harvard as a training event in the fall for track and field runners. After this other schools began to follow their example and in 1912 cross country became an Olympic choice.

This sport originated in Chicago, Illinois on Thanksgiving Day in 1887, when a group of 20 young men gathered in a gym to hear the outcome of the Harvard-Yale football game. After Yale's victory was announced and bets were paid off, a man picked up a stray boxing glove and threw it at someone, who then hit it with a pole. George Hancock who is considered the inventor who shouted "Let's play ball," tied the glove to resemble a ball and broke off a broom handle for a bat. New rules were written and the game was called indoor baseball. In 1897 a publication of an indoor baseball guide was printed and in 1888 the game moved outdoors. In 1895, the first womens softball team formed at Chicago West Division High School. This team didn't have a coach for competition until 1899 and it was difficult to create interest among fans. Softball, also known as "kitten ball" or "mush ball" derived from baseball and in two types: fast pitch and slow pitch. Though softball is played by both men and women teams, it is more popular amongst women. Championships are held at state and local levels but softball is played in over 100 countries around the world. Australia is the only country in the world that has four teams ranked in the top three in the world. In 1996, in Atlanta is when it was first introduced into the Olympics as a sport.

Mission: Tau Beta Sigma National Honorary Band Sorority provides service to collegiate bands, encourages the advancement of women in the band profession, and promotes and enriches an appreciation of band music through recognition, leadership development, and education of its members.

History: The first practical idea for establishing a "band sorority" as a national entity to meet the expressed needs of the growing number of women in college and university bands was presented by band member Wava Banes (Henry), along with her classmates, Emily Surell and Rosell Williams, to director D.O. Wiley of the Texas Tech University Band in the closing months of 1937. This discussion led to a group of bandswomen at Texas Tech University founding a local organization known as "Tau Beta Sigma," modeled in principle on the example of Kappa Kappa Psi. Much like the fraternity, Tau Beta Sigma's purpose at Tech was to serve as an honorary service and leadership recognition society, but it was designed especially to provide the important additional social, educational, and other positive experiences needed by women in the band. In January of 1946, the women of the Texas Tech Tau Beta Sigma Band Sorority, through their director, D.O. Wiley, graciously surrendered their name, "TAU BETA SIGMA," their constitution, ritual and jewelry designs to the local band club at Oklahoma State University, in order that the national organization could be established. By doing so, the Tech women understood that they were permitting the Oklahoma State group the title of "Alpha, the Mother Chapter," and accepted the status of "Beta Chapter," the second chartered chapter. On March 26, 1946, a charter was granted by the Department of State for the State of Oklahoma legally establishing "Tau Beta Sigma, National Honorary Band Sorority," later amended to "Tau Beta Sigma." On May 4 of 1946, the members of the Alpha Chapter traveled to Lubbock, Texas, to officially install the women of Texas Tech as the Beta Chapter of the National Sorority.

The History of Alpha Omicron chapter. Alpha Omicron Chapter was established on May 4, 1923. During the year of 1922, a visit was made to the campus of Johnson C. Smith University, then Biddle University, by Brother Victor R. Daly. The students there became interested in the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity. Acting upon the advice of Brother Daly, correspondence began with the General Secretary, Brother McGhee. The school year closed without any definite action being taken.

During the following school year, this group of students organized a club which was known as the "Alpha Aspirants." The application of this group was sent to the Fifteenth Convention at St. Louis. This application was referred to the Executive Committee for investigation. In March 1923, a notice was received from the General Secretary stating that upon the recommendation of the Executive Committee, the application of the "Alpha Aspirants" had been approved. On May 4, 1923, in St. Michael's Parish Hall, the Alpha Omicron Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity INC was established.

Since its founding on December 4, 1906, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. has supplied voice and vision to the struggle of African-Americans and people of color around the world.

Alpha Phi Alpha, the first intercollegiate Greek-letter fraternity established for African-Americans, was founded at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York by seven college men who recognized the need for a strong bond of Brotherhood among African descendants in this country. The visionary founders, known as the "Jewels" of the Fraternity, are Henry Arthur Callis, Charles Henry Chapman, Eugene Kinckle Jones, George Biddle Kelley, Nathaniel Allison Murray, Robert Harold Ogle, and Vertner Woodson Tandy. The Fraternity initially served as a study and support group for minority students who faced racial prejudice, both educationally and socially, at Cornell. The Jewel founders and early leaders of the Fraternity succeeded in laying a firm foundation for Alpha Phi Alpha's principles of scholarship, fellowship, good character, and the uplifting of humanity. Alpha Phi Alpha chapters were developed at other colleges and universities,

many of them historically black institutions, soon after the founding at Cornell. While continuing to stress academic excellence among its members, Alpha also recognized the need to help correct the educational, economic, political, and social injustices faced by African-Americans.

Alpha Phi Alpha has long stood at the forefront of the African-American community's fight for civil rights through leaders such as: W.E.B. DuBois, Adam Clayton Powell, Jr., Edward Brooke, Martin Luther King, Jr., Thurgood Marshall, Andrew Young, William Gray, Paul Robeson, and many others.











Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated



On January 15, 1908, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority became Americas first Greek-letter organization established by Black college women. Her roots date back to Howard University, Washington D.C. where the idea for formation was conceived by Ethel Hedgeman-Lyle of St. Louis, Missouri. The purpose of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority is to cultivate and encourage high scholastic and ethical standards, to maintain a progressive interest in college life, to help promote unity and friendship among college women, and to be of service to all mankind.








Kappa Alpha Psi

On January 5, 1911, 10 students attending Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana gave birth to a dream. Elder Watson Diggs, Ezra D. Alexander, Byron K. Armstrong, Henry T. Asher, Marcus Peter Blakemore, Paul W. Caine, George Edmonds, Guy L. Grant, Edward G. Irvin, and John Milton Lee founded a fraternity called Kappa Alpha Nu. The purpose of this fraternity was a need for the Black students at Indiana University to have support and camaraderie as there was no support for them among the other students. Kappa Alpha Nu did not warm over the principles or practices of other organizations. This Fraternity would seek to raise the sights of black youths and stimulate them to accomplishments higher than might otherwise be realized or even imagined. On May 15, 1911, Kappa Alpha Nu became the first undergraduate college fraternity to be incorporated by blacks as a national body. From those humble beginnings, Kappa Alpha Nu spread to other schools, giving other students the opportunity to experience the brotherhood that this growing fraternity established. On April 15, 1915, the name of the fraternity was changed to Kappa Alpha Psi shortly after the Fourth Grand Chapter meeting. Kappa Alpha Psi has grown from 10 members at Alpha Chapter at Indiana University to over 100,000 members in nearly 700 undergraduate and graduate chapters stretching throughout the United States, the Bahamas, Germany, England, Japan and Korea. The fundamental purpose of Kappa Alpha Psi is honorable achievement in every field of human endeavor. Kappa Alpha Psi is also dedicated to community service. Guide Right is the national Service Program of Kappa Alpha Psi and is probably what we are best known for. The Guide Right program is designed to improve the lives of youths in our community. Kappa Alpha Psi awards scholarships and provides mentoring the thousands of youths across the country.

In 1927, D.P. Young, Polemarch of the Southeastern Province, installed the Alpha Epsilon Chapter as the first chapter of the Middle Eastern Province, at Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte, NC. On December 10, 1927, the Alpha Epsilon Chapter began with its first six initiates: A.S. Powe, L.L. Blakney, J.A. Blount, J.H. Justice, J.A. Jones, and W.A. Perry. The first Polemarch of the Alpha Epsilon Chapter was J.H. Alston, the dean of the University's College of Liberal Arts and former member of the Epsilon Chapter. The Alpha Epsilon Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. is known as the "Mothership Chapter" of the Middle Eastern Province. This chapter has been known throughout history as being among the best in the country. The members of the Alpha Epsilon Chapter take pride in their fraternity and want to see their chapter continue to grow and make huge strides into the next millennium. The members of the Alpha Epsilon Chapter are leaders, and will continue to be leaders of our society. Each one of them possesses a strength or skill that will one day lead to his success. After the Alpha Epsilon Chapter was established in 1927, it was instrumental in the finding of three other local chapters in the Middle Eastern Province. They assisted in finding the Zeta Delta Chapter at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, the Zeta Sigma Chapter at Barber Scotia College, and the Kappa Sigma Chapter at Western Carolina University.



Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was founded on January 16, 1920 on the campus of Howard University in Washington D.C. by five distinguished ladies. Arizona Cleaver, Pearl Neal, Myrtle Tyler, Viola Tyler, and Fannie Pettie chose not to embrace the tenets of established black sororities, so they chartered Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. to epitomize the highest standards of scholarship, promote community service, demonstrate sisterly love, and exemplify the ideal of Finer Womanhood. Zeta Phi Beta's signature programs are Storks Nest, Z-HOPE (Zetas Helping Other People Excel), and ZOL (Zeta Organizational Leadership Program). The Sorority has adult and youth auxiliary groups, the Amicae, Archonettes, Amicettes, and Pearlettes. They are constitutionally bound to a brother group, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.
