

The opposite illustration shows a ball of our grafting thread with a pencil run through the hole in the center. Many nurserymen prefer to suspend the ball of grafting thread from a wire to be unwound as it is used. We prefer to keep the grafting thread in warm water while it is being used, as described below. This can be used either way.

TO KEEP GRAFTING THREAD IN GOOD CONDITION WHILE USING

Put a ball of waxed grafting thread into a quart cup or pan (a tomato can will do) fill it half full of water and arrange over a lighted lamp or small oil stove to keep the water warm.
