We are located in Southwestern Iowa, fifty miles southeast of Omaha, Nebraska. The soil here is especially adapted to the growing of a general line of nursery stock. The railroad facilities are excellent. We are on the Wabash, Chicago, Burlington & Quincy, and Keokuk & Western railroads. We take pleasure in showing visitors over our grounds at any time.

TERMS OF SALE

SHIPPING—Parties ordering goods should indicate whether they wish them sent by freight, express, or parcel post, also route. In the absence of these instructions, we forward them to the best of our judgment, but in no case will we assume responsibility after consignment to purchase. When losses occur by delays or other causes of whatever nature while goods are in transit, make claim AT ONCE on the forwarding companies. All shipments travel at the risk and cost of the purchaser.

TERMS—Cash or security before shipment of goods, except with established firms, when, if unknown to us, satisfactory references will be required before goods are forwarded. Order to be sent C. O. D. should be accompanied by one-fourth cash.

PRICES—Are limited to Spring 1927 and supersede all previous lists and are subject to change without notice. On amounts above 5 and under 10 apply ten rate. On amounts under 10 apply ten rate. On amounts 25 and over apply 100 rate. On amounts 250 and over apply 1000 rate.

CAUTION—We accept all orders upon condition that they shall be void should any injury befall stock from frost, fire, hail storms, or other causes over which we have no control.

SUBSTITUTION—If you wish us to substitute in case we are sold short of any variety ordered, please so state, as we do not substitute unless requested to do so.

CLAIMS—FOR ANY CAUSE WILL RECEIVE CONSIDERATION ONLY WHEN MADE WITHIN TEN DAYS AFTER THE ARRIVAL OF GOODS. IN NO CASE WILL WE ENTERTAIN CLAIMS MADE AFTER THE GOODS HAVE BEEN ACCEPTED.

PACKING—Prices contained herein are net; cost of boxing and baling will be added. No charge is made for loading bulk cars.

GRADES—We grade carefully; in some cases by caliper, in others by height. When graded by both caliper and height, the caliper must govern.

CERTIFICATE OF INSPECTION—Will be furnished with each shipment.

GUARANTEE OF GENUINENESS—IF ANY NURSERY STOCK, ETC., PROVES UNTRUE TO DESCRIPTION UNDER WHICH IT IS SOLD, WE HOLD OURSELVES IN READINESS ON PROPER PROOF, TO REPLACE ALL SUCH NURSERY STOCK, ETC., THAT MAY PROVE OTHERWISE, OR REFUND THE AMOUNT PAID, BUT WE SHALL IN NO CASE BE LIABLE FOR ANY SUM GREATER THAN THE AMOUNT ORIGINALLY RECEIVED FOR SAID NURSERY STOCK.
