

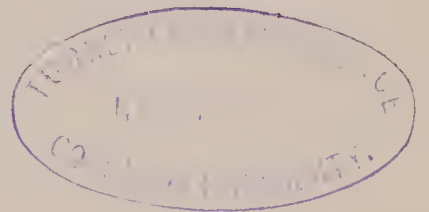
Sundz eop wöck
