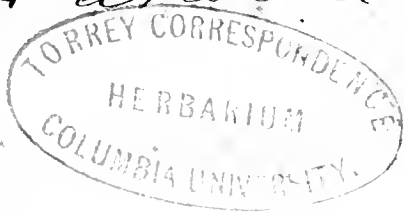

in my possession a box with

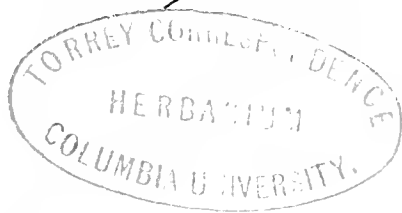
infects from Texas. The clerk
