Orders for less than ten of a variety or grade will be invoiced at an ADVANCE of 20% OVER THE TEN RATE, REGARDLESS OF THE SIZE OF THE ORDER, except Conifers and Broadleaved Evergreens where 5 plants at the 10 rate and 25 plants at the 100 rate are available.

Prices do not include packing charges.

GRADES

We grade liberally. All shrubs of specified sizes are well furnished and well rooted. Culls are as rigidly excluded from the lightest grades listed as from the heaviest stock. Our rule is, "WHEN IN DOUBT, PUT IT IN THE LOWER GRADE." Detailed information as to method of grading Hedge Plants and Roses is given under such heads.

CLAIMS

All claims must be made IMMEDIATELY AFTER RECEIPT OF STOCK.

ALL shipments will be accompanied by an Alabama Certificate of health. We are in no quarantined area.

LIABILITY and NON-WARRANTY

All quotations are for immediate acceptance and subject to stock being sold. All bookings are without liability to us should injury befall stock from frost, hail, fire, or other causes beyond our control, and subject to the standard form Non-Warranty Clause which reads: "**We give no warranty, express or implied, as to description, productiveness, or any other matter, of any nursery stock, seed or bulbs we sell.**"

IF FROZEN IN TRANSIT

If, on opening the bale or box, signs of frost are present close tight and bury in sawdust or dirt. Let the frost draw out naturally (requiring perhaps ten days) and no injury can result. **DO NOT EXPOSE TO LIGHT OR AIR WHILE FROZEN.**

COMBINING CAR AND TRUCK LOADS

We can often work out combination shipments, rail or truck, to our customers advantage. Refrigerated and Heated Trucks are available, on ample notice, to many points giving quick and safe service regardless of weather conditions.

PACKING CHARGES

Boxes and Bales will be charged at cost of labor and materials. This item will average around 5% of invoice. No charge for packing Car or Truck loads.

LATE SPRING PLANTING

With our cold storage facilities, we can now serve you until about June 1st with bare root stock. We closed down our coolers on June 1. On that day, we took out and planted as a test, *Lonicera Fragrantissima*, *Symphoricarpos Chenaulti*, *Euonymus Patens*, *Forsythia*, *Buddleia* and Flowering Almond all bare root. This stock grew off vigorously.
