

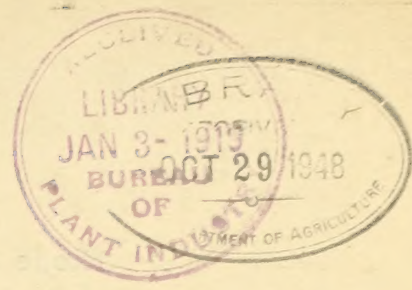

SPECIAL NOTICE.

These CHECK LISTS represent the seeds and plants which will be distributed this season, and are supplied to applicants for planting on their own grounds or on land controlled by them.

Unless directed not to do so we may substitute certain plants for others which are requested and which we cannot for one reason or another supply.

The Postal Regulations make it *unlawful* for this Office to send under Government frank from any one of our Plant Introduction Field Stations, to any one person more than a *single four-pound package* of plants at one time.

Applicants must keep this in mind and *if they desire more than a four-pound package of plants must indicate their willingness to pay expressage* on the plants they request, stating how heavy a package we may send and from what Field Stations they are willing we should ship from by express.

Owing to the great congestion in express traffic, where possible, plants will be shipped from the Field Station nearest the applicant's place of residence. The plants on the list marked Yarrow are grown and will be shipped, from the Field Station in Maryland, those marked Brooksville from the West Florida Station, those marked Chico from Northern California, and those marked Miami from Southern Florida. The figures following the names indicate the number of plants which will be distributed this season.
