
Foreword

Future Farmers of America



"Set your goals high, but yet let there be obtainable; then get busy working to obtain these goals." This statement was made to a small group of juniors and seniors in September, 1960. The picture painted by this young teacher of vocational agriculture was met with laughter and disbehef by all eleven members of the class. Half-heartedly, the class members stated they would try. Success did not come easy, though, for a chapter that was struggling to compete with chapters well grounded in many argas of FFA work.

What began as a laughed-at dream of a first-year agriculture teacher has turned into individual and team success for the past five years. Student awakening, plus the desire to compete and do well, has brought Chicod five straight Over-all Federation Banners, a team each year reaching State Finals, and three individual district honors.

The highest honor came in the school year 1964-65 when Chicod FFA Chapter received one of the highest awards attainable in FFA work-The Bronze National Chapter Award. Only two per cent of the chapters in the United States are eligible for this award, and Chicod was one of the six chapters in North Carolina to receive this covered award.

These accomplishments were attained through hard work, earnest desire, and concentrated efforts.

ELEMENTARY

To the elementary school the young, innocent child comes with an intense and open mind. He is willing to learn and must be educated physically and mentally if he is to grow into a well balanced teen-ager and adult. The all important basic educational foundation is competently laid by his teachers.
