We were allowed another day away from school to attend Career Day at Greenville at East Carolina College. The students visited the different departments and were told the purpose of a good college education.

We also worked hard on the Senior Play, "The Ghost House," which we presented on Friday, the thirteenth of November, under the direction of Mrs. Elizabeth Scott. This should prove we are not superstitious.

At Christmas, the Seniors decided to do something nice for all the high school students and teachers, so we gave them a Christmas Party in the Home Economics Department the last hour of school.

Now we are looking forward to the banquet that will be given to US this year and our long-awaited trip to New York and Washington the week of April 4-8.

After all this, we will have our last graduation ceremonies for high school. This will bring back fond memories of all the wonderful things people have done for us. We shall never be able to repay our parents, friends, and teachers, but we all hope that our futures will prove our thanks to all of them.

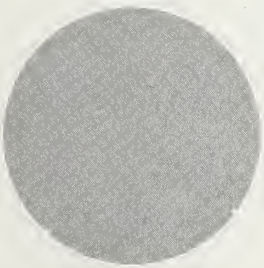
