Praises for everyone. The Play-makers had just scored another hit.

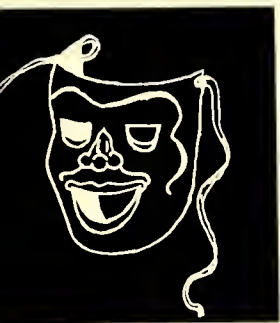

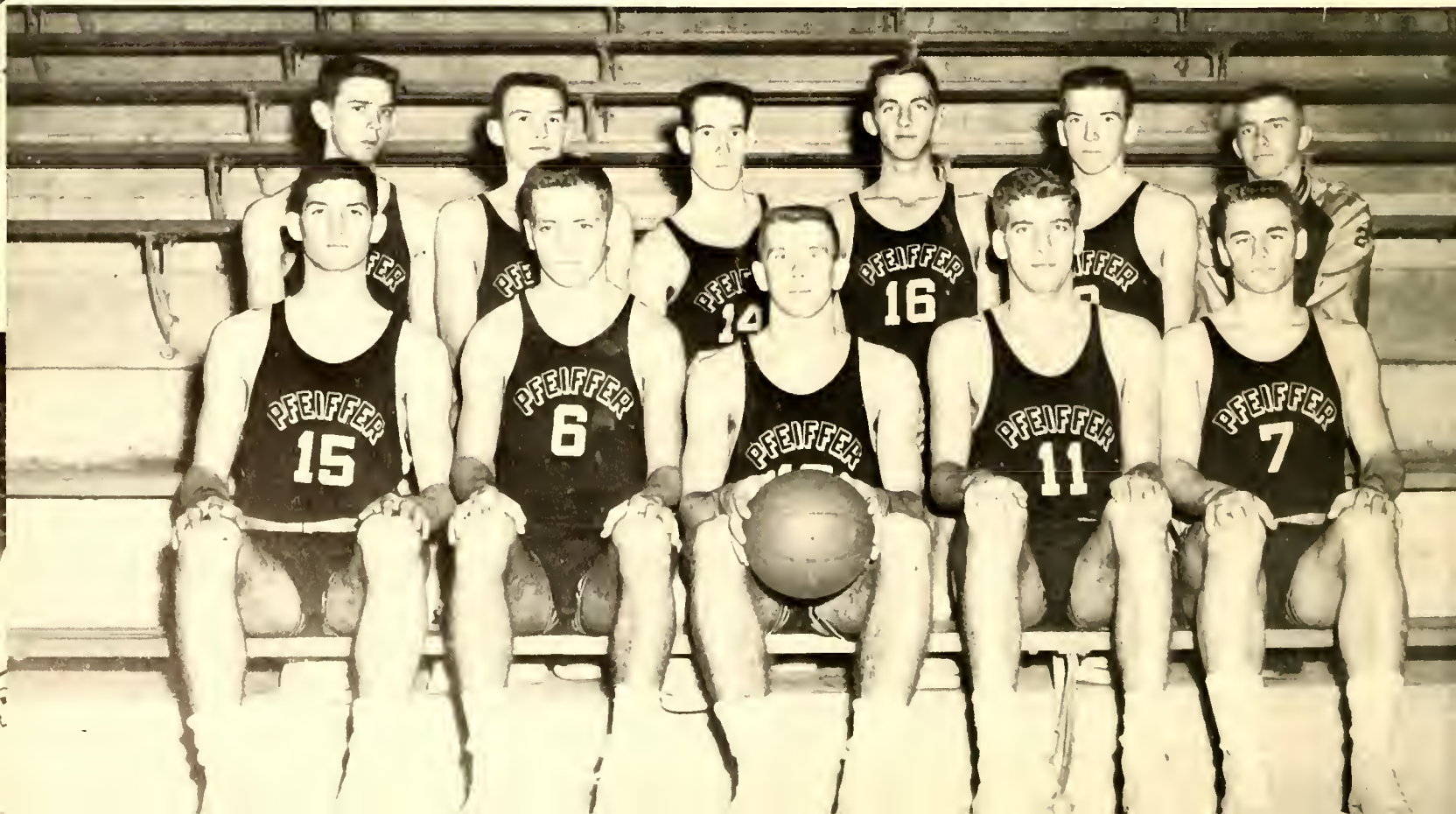
As this annual goes to press, the record of the Panthers might not be too impressive; but with ten games remaining on the schedule, our possibilities for a good season are still bright.

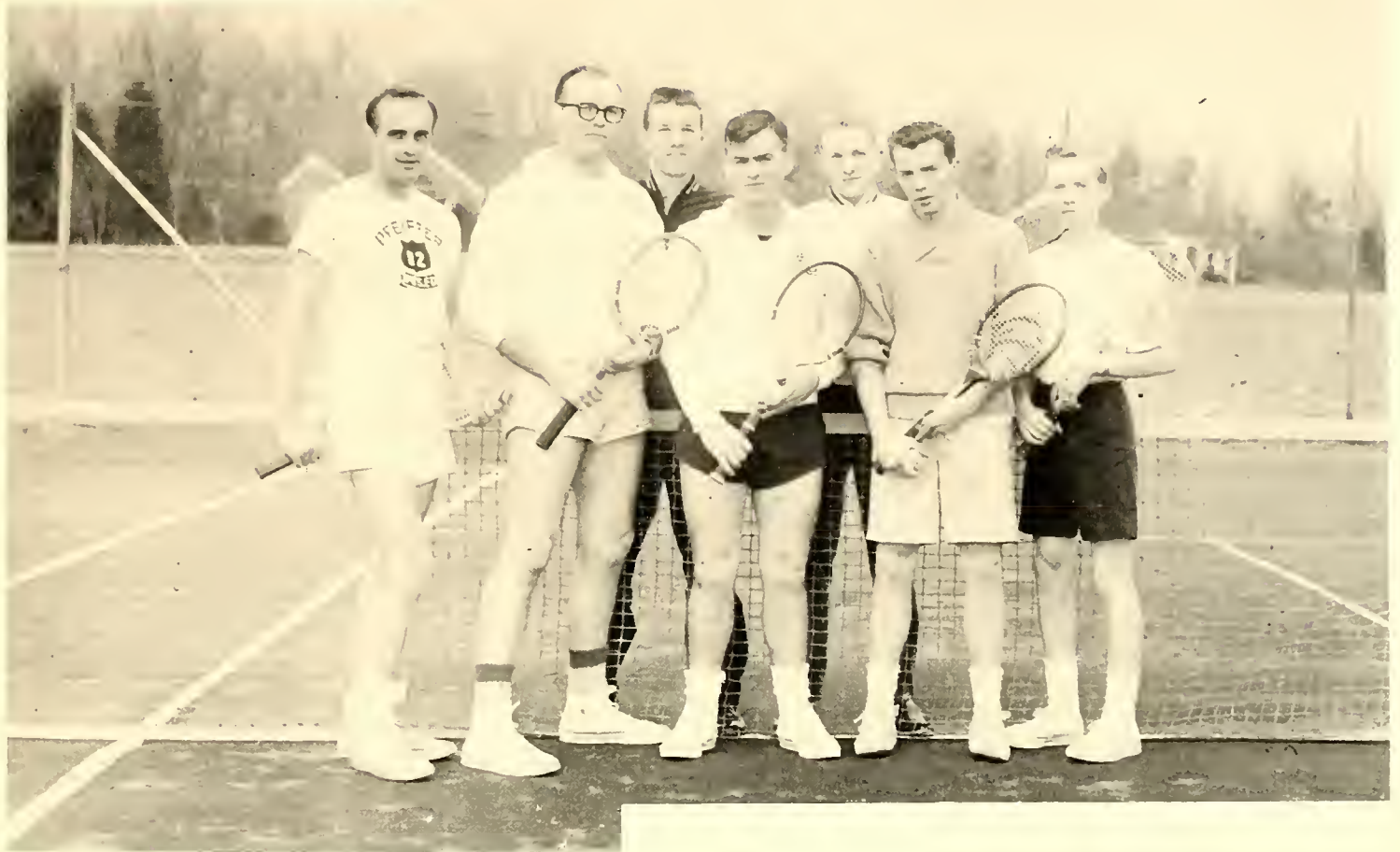

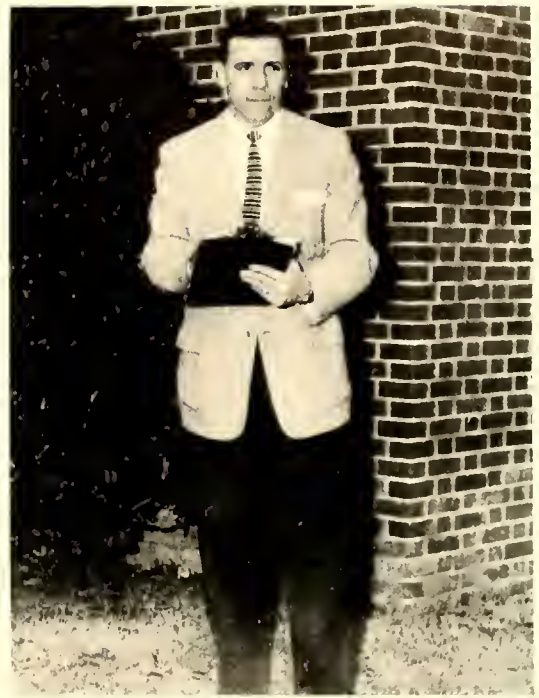

PFEIFFER BUILDING PROGRAM

In the past year Pfeiffer College has made tremendous strides in development, improvement, and enlargement through its building program. Completed during this past year have been an estimated \$670,000 Science Building, a sewage disposal plant, a renovation of attic space into a new floor in the Administration Building, additions to the dining hall, and new classroom and office facilities on the ground floor of Goode Hall.

This same spirit of expansion can be sensed in the plans for proposed buildings to be erected in the near future. Included in this program are plans for a Student Center, which will house an infirmary, a kitchen, dining rooms, and an auditorium which will seat one thousand students. Dormitory expansions in the form of new wings to be added on Rowe and Merner and a new dormitory for men will offer facilities for ac-

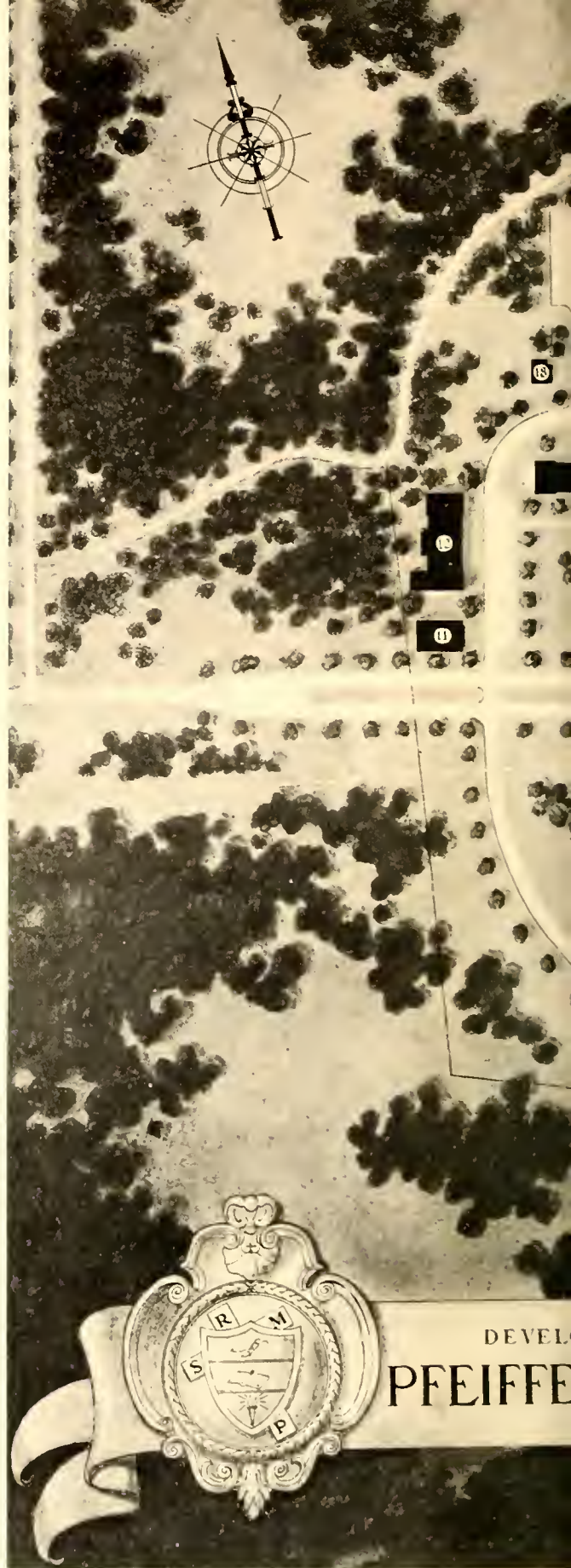

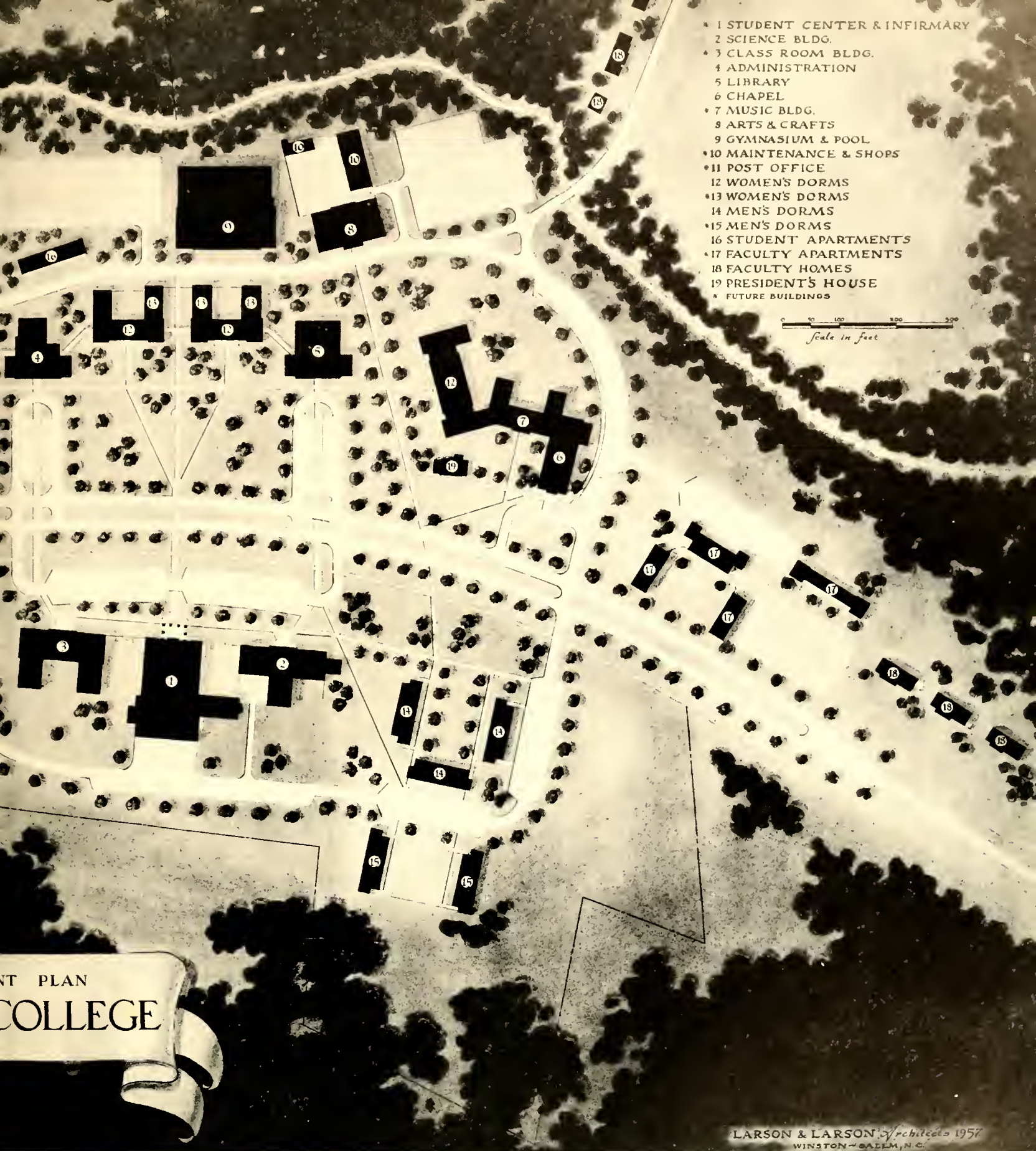
