WEST SETS THEME

A time for evaluation,

A time for dedication,

A time for optimism

William West, new President of Pfeiffer College, outlines the college's future and the challenges of the college during his first address to the faculty and students.

While all of the constituents of the college are important, students, because of the central position they occupy, are most influential in setting the tone of the institution.

West stated that though he knew of the college's problems, he could not ignore them. He stated that in light of the greater potential and opportunities available to all those joined to Pfeiffer's present and future.

A college is at the same time both durable and fragile, and while an institution may live long after each of us has gone, for a college that the future belongs to, it is to be sure to be concerned for Pfeiffer College, the immediate years ahead can be what you and I want them to be. This college can become a center of quality what we will be. Dr. West stated.

West avoided a long overview of the college's past by observing that "We must not forget the contributions of leaders such as Harry Brubaker, Anna Cowell, Ruth Dwyer or its immediate predecessor Douglas Kent Decker."

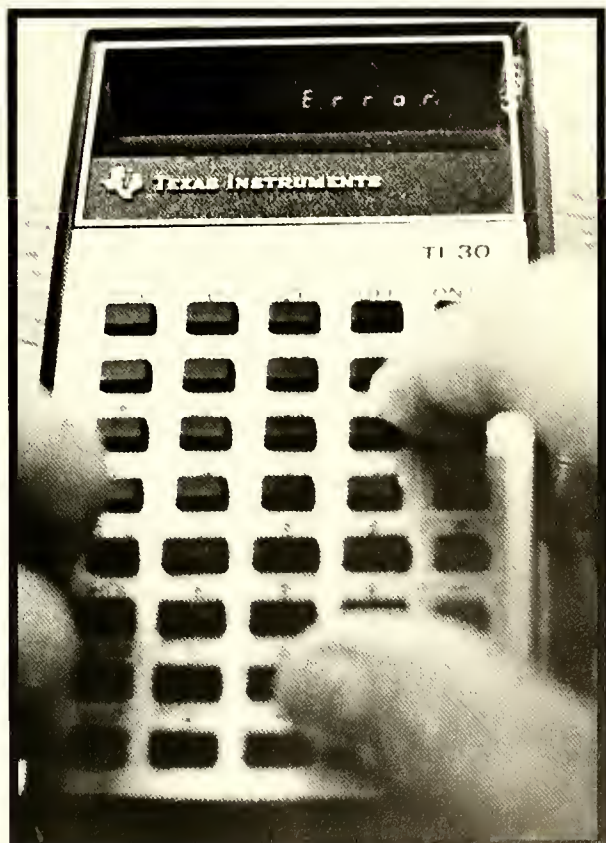

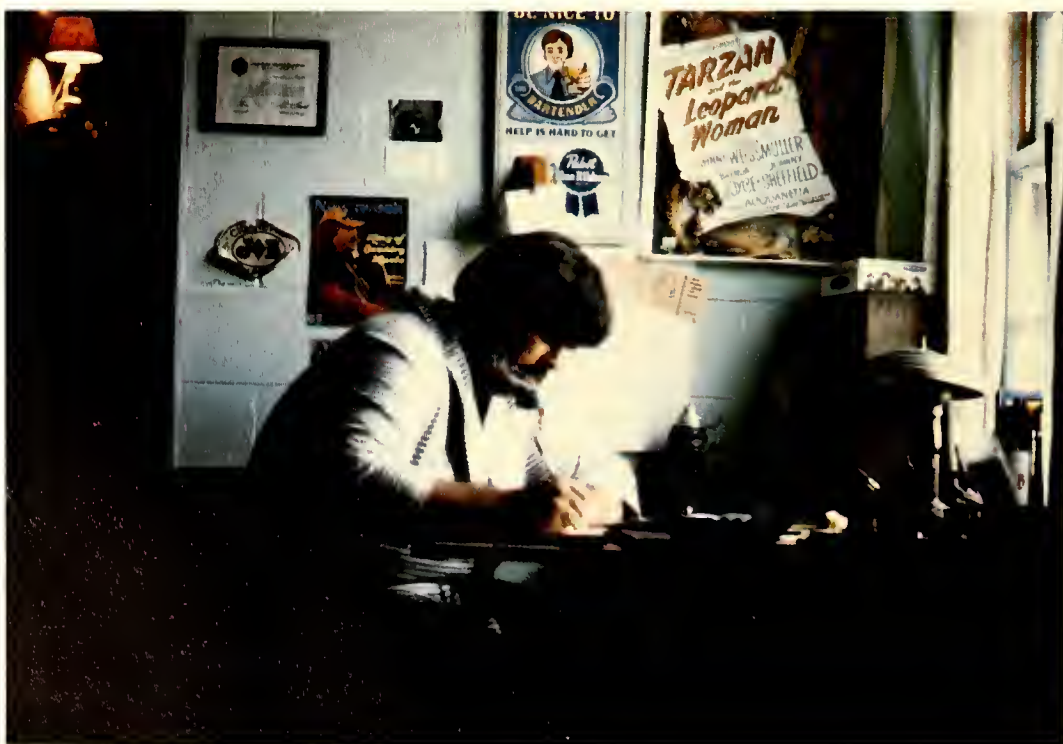














ride them high, those waves, simon says

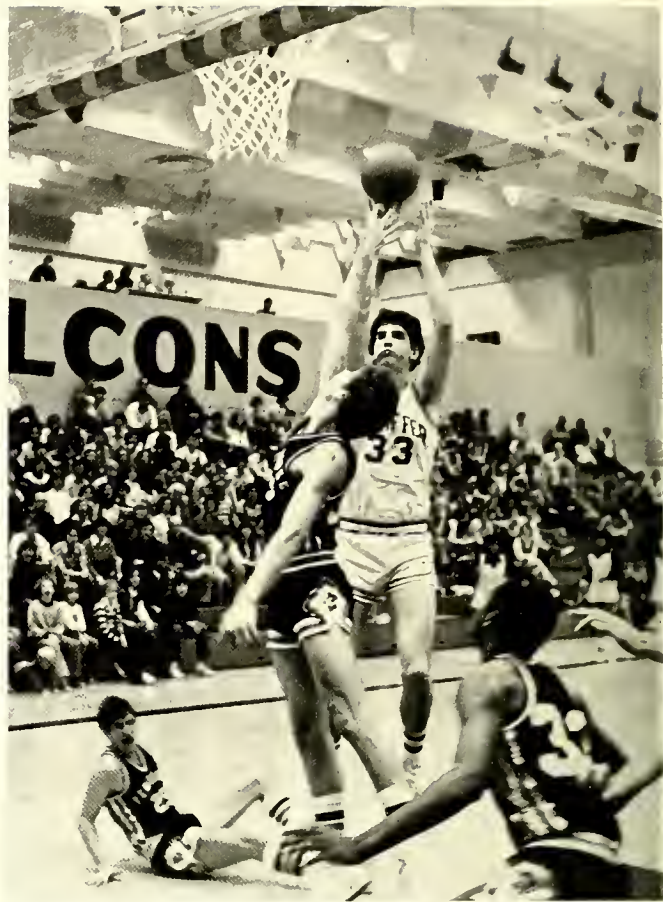

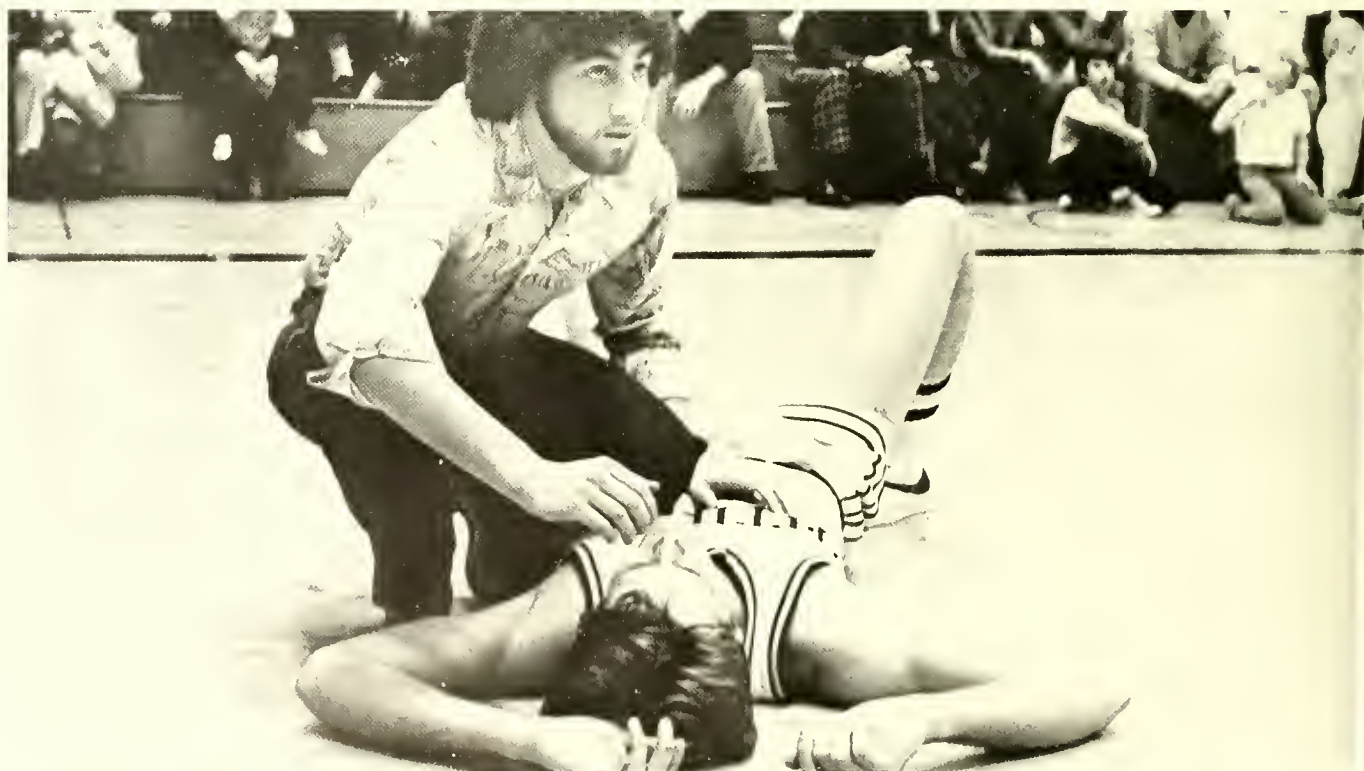

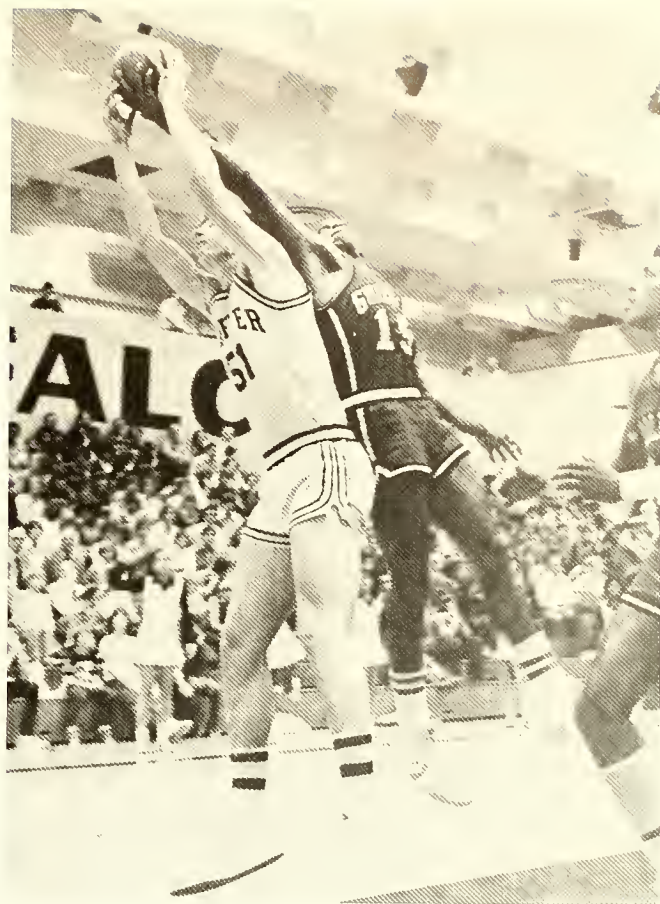

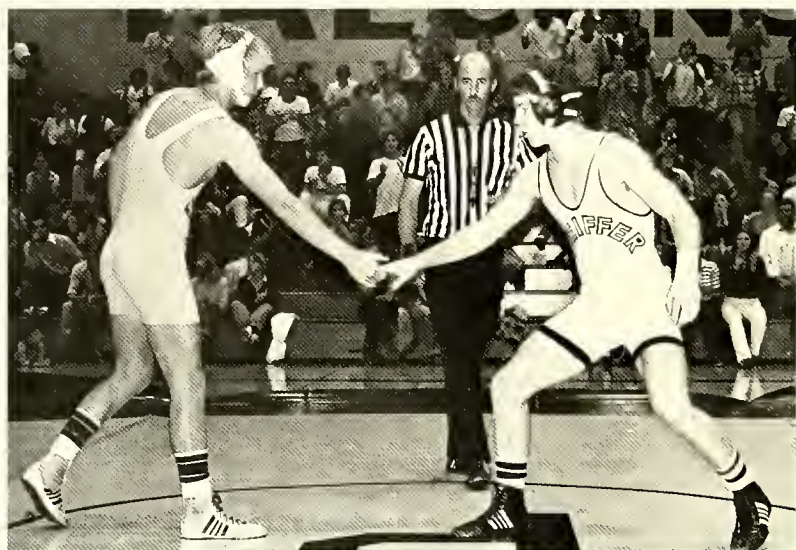

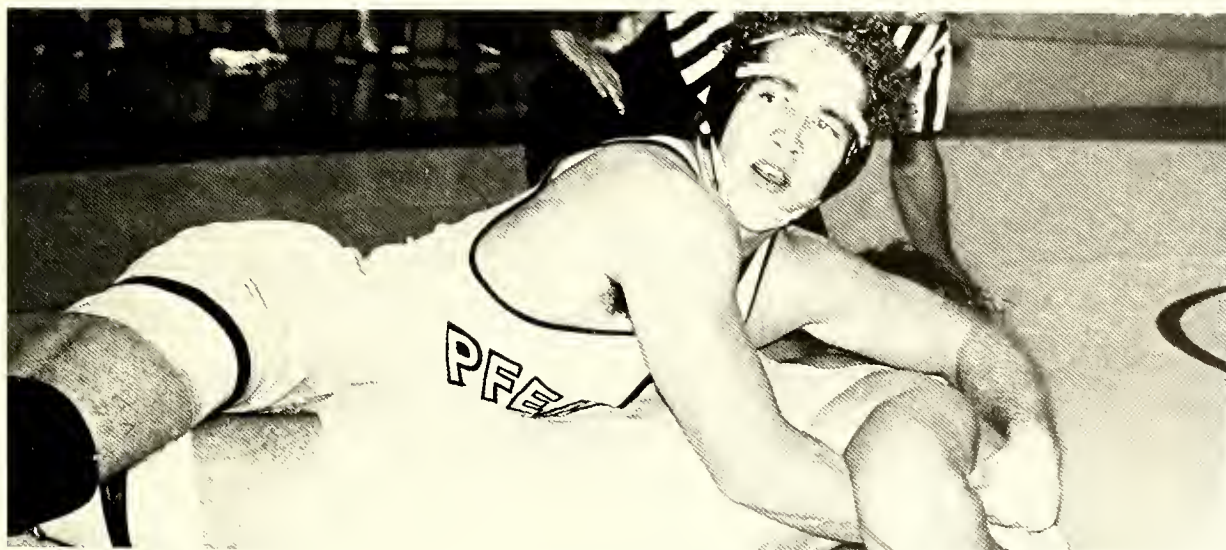

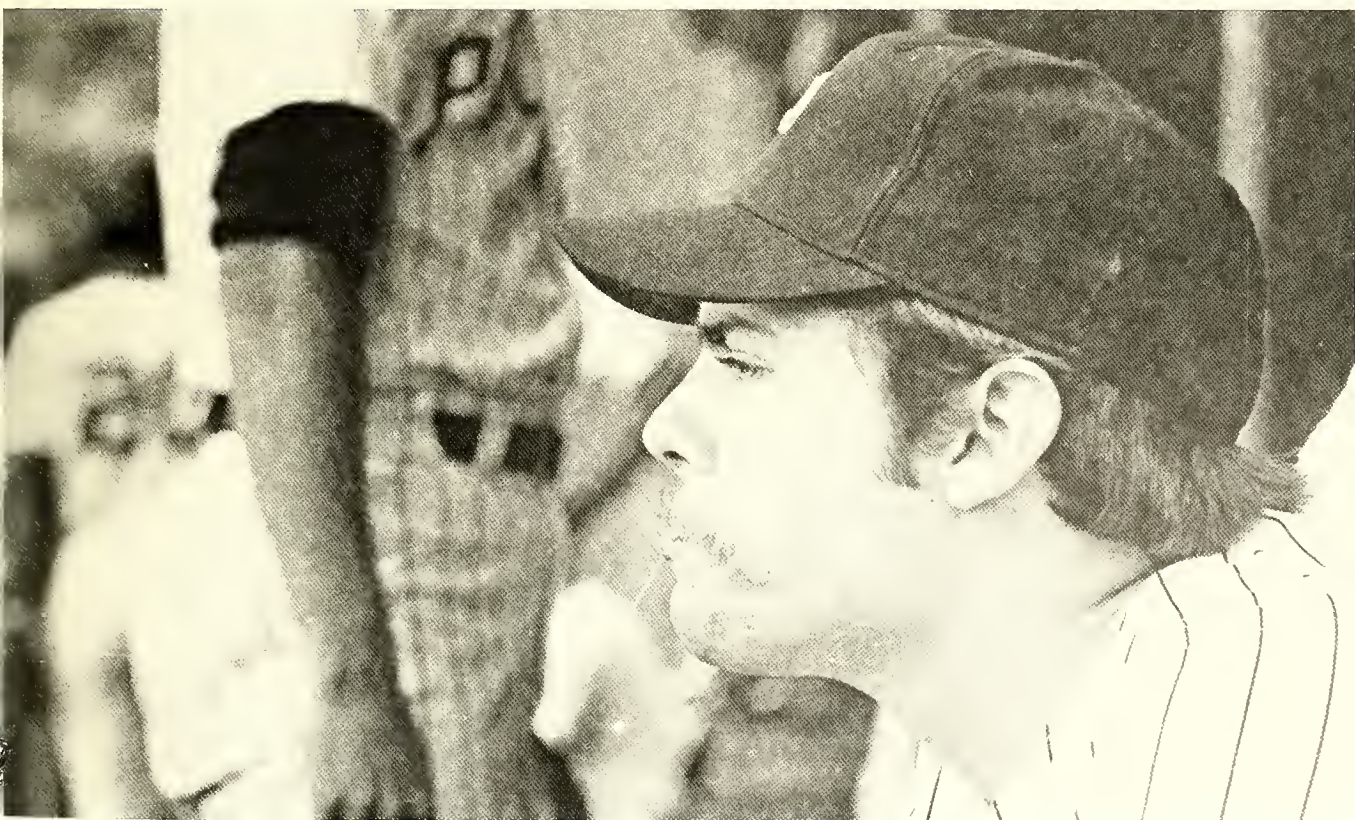

What you will recreate will be the sound of unprompted laughter, the scurrying feet and snickers forerunning a practical joke, candles on a cake, a guitar played softly down the hall, the all-night rap session when you found your unexpected Self expressing aloud a deeply-held conviction and — still caught in your first surprise — saw a responsive flash light the eyes of a dorm mate till this moment a stranger but now, of a sudden, a part of you.

CAFETERIA

Whether or not you could identify with any certainty the exact origins of the food put before you will no longer matter. Aesthetics will be a forgotten issue, and food fights will mean to you only in terms of who was involved in them. What will matter to you looking back in the din of human voices rising above the clatter of cutlery and the kitchen hiss of steam: voices of people you knew and yet did not know, people you liked or distrusted or pitied or respected, but whose lives were inextricably woven into the fabric of yours for four years: Community/Communion.

CLASSROOMS

I prophesy that grades will be insignificant and test-sweat but a momentary memory of your palm. Unless you've put them to daily use, once-vital words like "hypotenuse" or "scapula" or iambic pentameter" will bring only a ghostlike half-image to your brain. But those words first leapt at you from living faces and lively brains you remember as if it were yesterday. Whether you liked them or loathed them, your teachers helped to forge you by the simple power of being who they were.

Surging back into your life again
you, remembering
a Manly with that eternally unlit pipe
and that eternally-open-till-midnight-7-days-a-week door
and that integrity which gave him power to sit still when an unjustified ovation
swept others to unthinking feet . . .

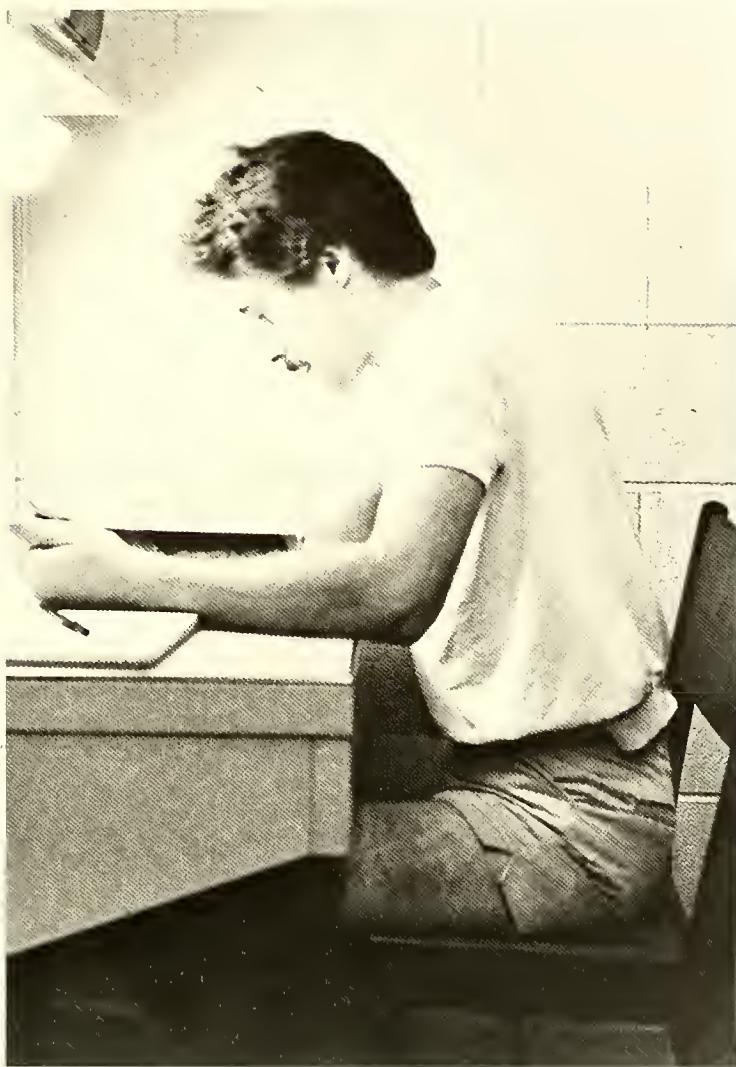
A Reflection on College

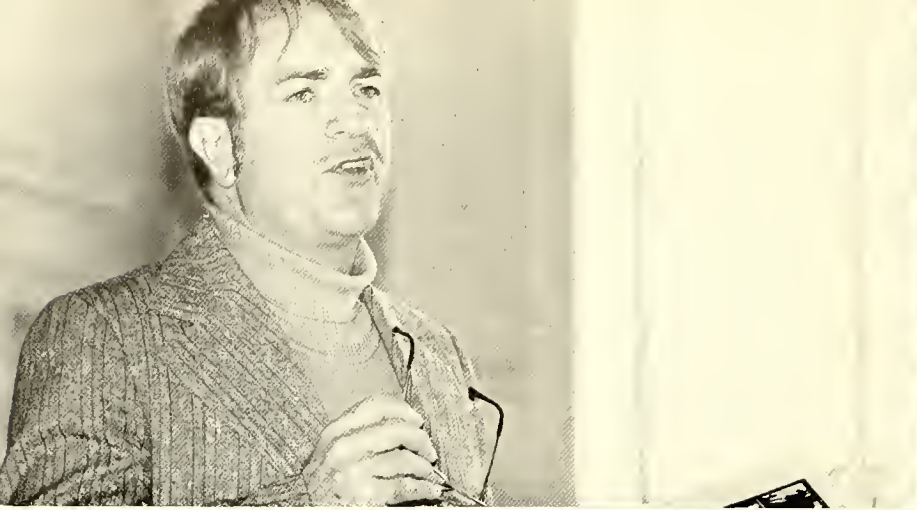
The Chimes.
