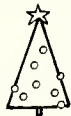
This year in addition to dancing and costumes there was a T.V. set up for all the Braves and Twins fans. Many people enjoyed being able to dance and party and still keep up with the score.

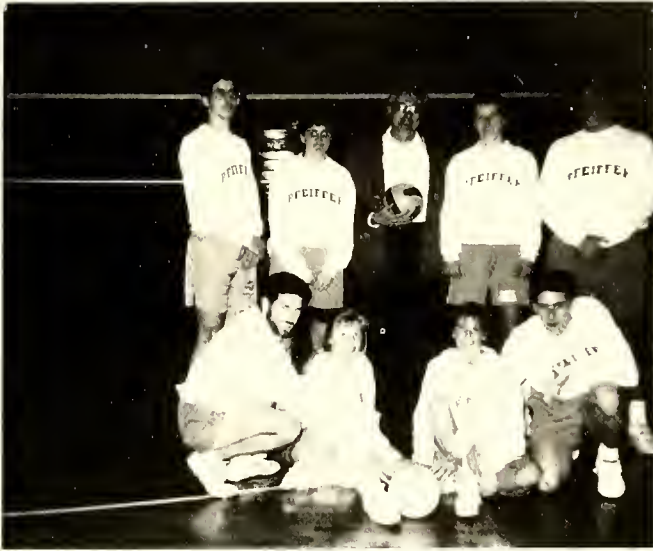

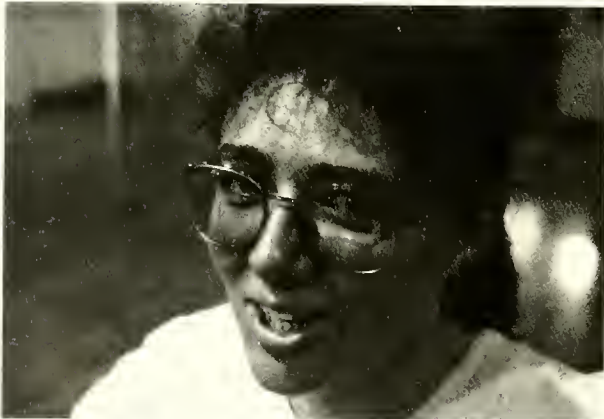

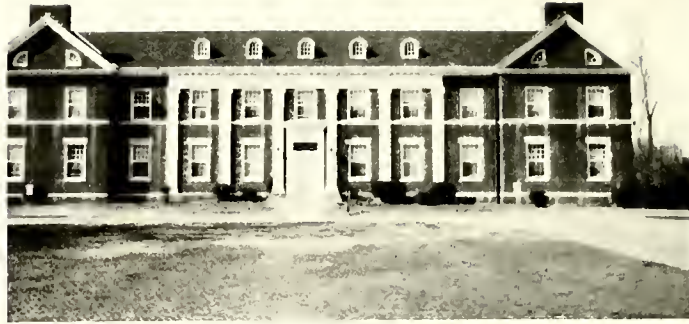

Takes Pfeiffer by Storm

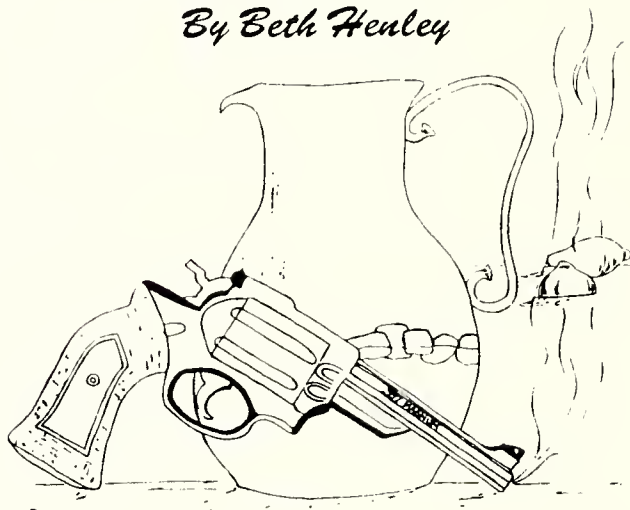

Crimes of the Heart

A Pulitzer Prize-Winning Tragicomedy

The lights slowly dim. The audience becomes still, and the theatre quietens. A spotlight brightens the stage. The time is no longer October, 1991, but October, 1974. The place is Hazlehurst, Mississippi, not Misenheimer, North Carolina.

During the week of Homecoming, Pfeiffer College students, faculty, and friends travelled back in time to visit the Magrath family in Pfeiffer Theatre's season opening, "Crimes of the Heart."

The play begins with Lenny Magrath, actress Jeanette Hackett, awaiting the arrival of her younger sister Babe Botrelle, actress Debbie King. Babe had been recently released from prison on bail for the attempted murder of her husband. Upon arriving home, she contacts her lawyer Barnette Lloyd, actor Matthew Wackerhagen, who has a personal vendetta against Mr. Botrelle.

Another plot includes the rekindled romance between the middle sister, Meg, actress Glowyn Shackford and Doc Porter, Alpha Psi Omega member Tyler Elam. To end their former relationship years before, Meg left town to begin a singing career, not knowing that her attempts would fail. She returned to Hazlehurst upon hearing about Babe's troubles to find Doc Porter married. Despite the complications, their relationship grows stronger. However, playwright Beth Henley leaves what type of relationship to the audience.

Although the intertwined plots were serious, the production was comical. The over dramatized gossip concerns of cousin Chick Boyle, actress Deborah Gaddy, brought comic relief. Also the comical production of Babe's suicide rampage set the audience in laughter. The set portrayed the small mid-southern town in the 1970s. The set designer, Karl Kissenger, used the Magrath farm kitchen and porch as the center of the play's action.

Overall, several Pfeiffer students and faculty members said they felt the production was a success. "We had a good play to start with," said Shackford, "and that really helped."

Medieval Mummers



The Pfeiffer Theatre presented "Medieval Mummery," a collection of plays from the Middle Ages, on February 27-29 and March 1.

The Second Shepherd's Play, a parody of the Christian nativity scene, centers around the idea of a stolen sheep and three shepherds' attempts to recover it. Mak, who steals the sheep while the shepherds are sleeping, is played by Roger Davis, and his wife Gill is played by Jeanette Hackett. As husband and wife, they parallel the Biblical Joseph and Mary, whereas the stolen sheep symbolizes the Christ child. The three shepherds, of course, represent the shepherds who travel to Bethlehem to worship the newborn king.

Tales of Sherwood includes two Robin Hood tales, one involving a drunken friar with whom Robin has a quarrel, and one regarding a potter who passes through Sherwood Forest for seven years without paying proper passage. Robin, played by Matt Steed, makes peace with both characters in the end, but not before some exciting fight scenes take place between the merry men and their enemies.

Everyman is an allegory that centers around the idea that all must take the pilgrimage to death, carrying only their good deeds with them. The character of Everyman is played by Matt Steed. Kerry Zabonik, Jeanette Hackett, and Craig Mutch. By emphasizing moral correctness above all, this play is the most religious of the three.

According to director George Bellah, the presentation of the plays offers a logical progression, from the bawdy humor of *The Second Shepherd's Play*, to the moral/political commentary of *Tales of Sherwood*, to the extremely spiritual implications of *Everyman*.

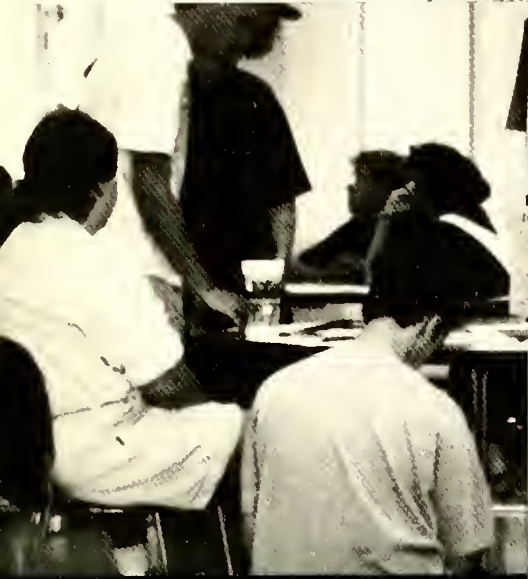
"We tried to be more true in spirit rather than in literal accuracy," stated Bellah. I found this attempt to be a complete success.

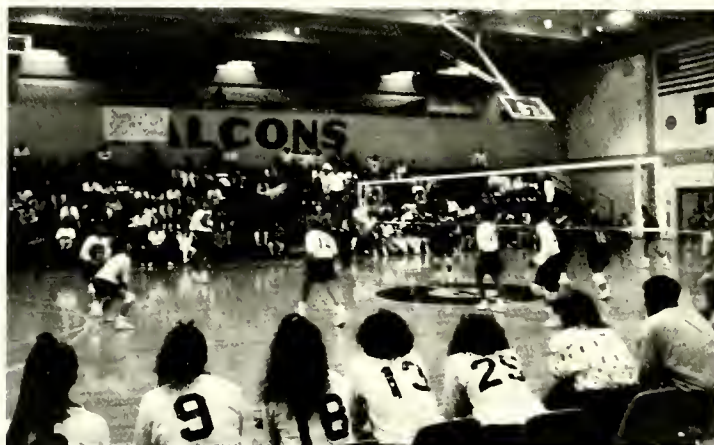

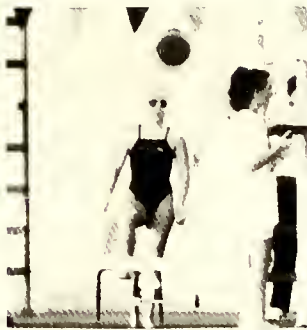
