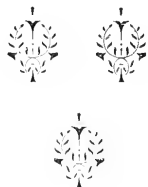

<b>ANCHUSA (Alkanet)</b> —Hardy Perennial.		
<b>Italica</b> , Dropmore Variety—A beautiful variety of the Italian Alkanet with large, hairy leaves and tall spikes of beautiful blue flowers. In deep, well enriched soil reaches a height of six to seven feet. Makes a beautiful background in borders, and physostegia is very effective planted in front of it, as the latter takes its place when through flowering; 5 ft.....	\$.25	\$2.50
<b>ARMERIA</b> —Cephalotes—Giant Thrift; hardy perennial.		
A large, handsome "thrift" with showy flower heads on foot long stems; colors range from white to very deep pink. A clump of these in bloom is very attractive.....	.25	2.50
<b>AQUILEGIA</b> —Columbines—Hardy Perennial.		
Beautiful border plants with graceful foliage and dainty, long-spurred flowers in early summer, the colors of the new hybrids being particularly handsome. They thrive in shade or sun but prefer a moist, well drained soil in a partially shaded position. If not allowed to go to seed and not covered too heavily in winter, they will flourish for years and will not change their colors. Coal ashes put around the crown in the fall will help to prevent their decay.		
<b>Glandulosa</b> —Blue Siberian Columbine—An exquisite species; flowers very large; beautiful, clear blue with snowy white corolla, borne on slender stems; 1 ft.....	.25	2.50

A rich, well-drained soil suits them best and they excel when hanging over the side of a rock or a sloping bank. They begin to bloom very early in the spring and continue until July. ### DELPHINIUM—Hardy Larkspur—Hardy Perennial.

The hardy larkspurs are among the choicest subjects in the perennial border and the varieties we offer are among the best of the named varieties. They are of easy culture and perfectly hardy and will flourish in sun or shade. They like a rich well drained soil, being careful to keep manure away from the roots. They should be well staked when about three feet high, as the stalks are very brittle and strong winds break them down easily.

Coal ashes around the crowns in fall are excellent to protect them from the white grub, and a dusting of soot is also of benefit.

Cornstalks, so placed that they do not mat down, are ideal. Plenty of fertilizer and water during dry weather, will give fine plants that will reach five feet in height.
