The world it seems is crumbling down; I see ugly scenes in every town; What is right? What is wrong? How can I know? Where do I go?






They say there is happiness in a song, for if it is. I'll sing to you; And the decision about this song then will lie within you all.





Students participate in March of Dimes Campaign



Graduates in Nursing

The Chowan College nursing program is unique in that it combines a complete liberal arts background, plus courses in nursing in the same program. This program leads to an Associate in Arts degree as well as a Diploma.

The students begin their thirty three month program at Chowan College. They take regular college courses and begin their nursing experience at nearby Roanoke Chowan Hospital. After four semesters plus one summer session at Chowan, they then go to Duke Hospital in Durham, N.C. to complete their nursing experience. Here they remain for twelve months under the supervision of Chowan College faculty members stationed at Duke. When they have satisfactorily completed the programs requirements, they are awarded the A.A., degree from Chowan, and are eligiable to take the State Board of Nursing examination. This program is completely under the direction of Chowan College, and is administered by The Chairmen of the Department of Nursing Mrs. Almira Ockerman, R.N., B.S., and M.S.


The Brave's baseball team this season was, according to Coach Hawkins, "a well balanced ball club. We were a little stronger and a better team than we were last year."


The team had several promising new players, including four pitchers, one catcher, and two outfielders. With such great prospects, how could Chowan's team have had anything but a great baseball team?

TENNIS


