WHITAKER LIBRARY

One of the assets and strenghts of the college is Whitaker Library, which becomes evident when measured by many standards. Since its construction in 1968, the facility has "broken through" to become a leader among libraries at other institutions throughout the state and nation.

A three-story structure, the library contains very adequate space for students and faculty in several reading areas with individual booths and tables where small groups may study and work together. Built to shelve 100,000 volumes, Whitaker Library is well on the way to reaching full capacity, and this year contains more than 88,000 volumes of books. The library also houses items of historical interest to the college and the region, as well as the "Baptist Collection" of materials in the Antiquities Room. A very wide variety of periodicals and newspapers is available with more being added each month.

Students attest that the library offers much more than books, reference materials, and periodicals, for it is a place for quiet study in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere. The very capable staff of librarians is always on hand to assist students in any way possible; whether it be in the operations of the microfilm and microfiche, rendering information on Early American novelist or a copy of a speech made by a past American president.








We'll shelter him with tenderness; we'll love


him while we may,

In Memoriam

Elected President of Chowan College on March 25, 1957, Dr. Bruce Ezell Whitaker, his wife, Esther, and son, Barry, moved to Murfreesboro in early May of that same year. A second son, Garry Bruce, joined the family in 1959. Thereafter — until the Whitaker sons grew to adulthood and assumed educational/professional responsibilities elsewhere — each member of the Whitaker household has been a familiar figure on the campus and in the community which they have called "home" for over three decades.

That academic procession which was to precede the Service of Inauguration of Dr. Whitaker as the nineteenth president of Chowan College, October 11, 1957, stands as representative of many similar occasions thereafter when the college community celebrated the realization of some noteworthy attainment or goal. For example, each of the thirty-three Commencement Exercises over which President Whitaker will have presided (1957-89) at the time of his retirement is a monument to the primary function of the institution which he has served as Chief Administrative Officer - namely, the education of youth for service to God and humankind.

President Whitaker has maintained the confidence of a succession of Boards of Trustees who have established sound educational policy and—then—supported and sustained their President in the implementation of that policy. Under this "partnership in education," total assets of the college have increased from some three-quarters of a million dollars (1957) to over twenty-five million dollars (1989); the annual operating budget from less than \$300,000.00 (1957) to \$8,660,000.00 (1988-89). enrollment, which stood at 293 in 1957, had climbed to 966 in 1988-89. In fact, current enrollment represents a "leveling off" to what college officials consider close to an optimum figure, following the attainment of an all-time high matriculation of 1533 students in the fall semester of 1971-72.

Created by authority of the Board of Trustees in 1965, the Chowan College Board of Advisors has assisted the governing board, the President, and the school in interpreting the mission of the college among broader constituencies than she had known and served in former years. Concurrence by the Board of Advisors in decisions of the Board of Trustees has issued in the identification and enlistment of numerous new friends of the college and her mission in higher education. While eligibility for membership on the Board of Trustees is limited by geographical and religious considerations. membership on the Board of Advisors is not restricted in the same way. Current members on the advisory board reside in five different states and are affiliated with several different Christian denominations.

A part of the secret of Dr. Whitaker's success can be attributed to his ability to attract and retain an administrative staff which - like him - has demonstrated a longterm commitment to the college and her educational mission. Prior to the death in 1988 of Bobby S. Cross, former Director of Development, those administrative officers who are accountable directly to the President of the College for the functioning of the major divisions of responsibility had accumulated a total of 144 years of service to Chowan College. This cumulative total averages out to 24 years per person, when considering the six administrators who are responsible directly to the President for the fulfillment of duties and tasks assigned.

Many faculty members have "come and gone" during the course of the Whitaker years at Chowan. Nonetheless, a major element in the strength of the college lies in the tenure attained by her faculty. The average length of service for current members of the faculty at Chowan — all but one of whom has been employed subsequent to President Whitaker's assumption of the reins of administrative leadership in 1957 — stands at 15.9 years. The cumulative years of service for the 57 full-time faculty members totaled 905 years at the conclusion of the academic year 1987-88.

Welcoming students to the campus community, and providing them with appropriate educational opportunities remains the primary "reason for being" for all that is encompassed in the work of the governing board, the administrative staff, and the instructional personnel of Chowan College, Fall Semester enrollments throughout the course of the Whitaker Years have witnessed over 32,000 students matriculate for college studies — a figure which far exceeds the cumulative enrollment throughout the first 109 years of the history of the college. Moreover, when considering those non-duplicating students who have also enrolled in Spring and/or Summer sessions, the enrollment statistic above would be considerably higher than indicated during the 32-year tenure of our retiring President.

Those members of the Class of 1989 who receive degrees or diplomas from the hand of Dr. Whitaker on May 14 will represent the last in a long chain of graduates to hear those familiar words from his lips: "By authority vested in me, I grant you these...with all the rights, privileges, and responsibilities thereto appertaining."

Since 1957, President Whitaker has presided over 33 Commencement Excercises, involving the awarding of some 5,837 degrees and diplomas. After Commencent Exercises are completed in 1989, Dr. Whitaker will have conferred just slightly less than 5 times the number of academic degrees conferred during the first 109 years in the history of the college.

The vision of what Chowan College should become during the Whitaker Years was conceived in the mind and heart of an administrator who had committed himself to the provision of the best possible educational opportunities for those who elected to begin their college careers in the setting of a church-related, junior college. Beginning in the late 1960s, that vision was conveyed to a broad constituency of friends through a series of Planning Conferences. Such conferences were designed to serve as both formats for communicating progress reports on the "State of the College," and as means for listening to the suggestions/concerns of many whose support could bring that institutional dream to fuller realization.

It was recognized that long-term objectives and goals for an educational institution must be undergirded by longrange efforts to secure financial resources above and beyond student tuition/fees, the annual support of the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, and the periodic gifts of loyal alumni and other friends. Accordingly, the college's Endowment Committee was revitalized. expanded in size and scope, and challenged to work towards the eventual procurement of a sizeable endowment fund. In the course of the past thirty-two years, the market value of the college's General Endowment has increased from less than \$7,000 to nearly 5.5 million dollars!

The first building to be constructed on the Chowan campus during the Whitaker Administration was Jenkins Hall, with groundbreaking ceremonies for this residence hall for women conducted on March 12, 1958. Eleven other major facilities have been constructed on campus during the succeeding years. Moreover, renovations/additions to existing structures, construction of on-campus athletic fields, and the acquisition of several properties adjacent to the expanding campus finds total plant assets valued at approximately \$20,000,000 in 1989. The comparable figure in 1957 was less than \$750,000.

As properties were acquisitioned and buildings constructed to accommodate the educational needs of an increasingly large enrollment, operating budgets showed concomitant increases throughout the fiscal years 1957-1958 - 1988-89. The "shoestring" budget for 1957-58 - which failed to meet actual educational expenditures - was less than \$300,000. In each succeeding fiscal year thereafter, budgets have been balanced, educational expenditures per full-time student have increased, and the average salary for faculty members has jumped sevenfold. Chowan's operating budget for 1988-89 stands at \$8,660,000 - with the virtual certainty that the annual audit at year's end will disclose another balanced budget on a receipt/expenditure basis.

Chowan College's indebtedness to the Baptist denomination, in general, and to North Carolina Baptists, in particular, has been a recurrent theme of President Whitaker's. Whether addressing trustees, faculty members, student assemblies, or potential donors, he has never allowed any constituency to remain unmindful of that particular Christian denomination which gave the institution birth, and which continues to support and sustain her as a seat of learning, within the context of an overarching faith commitment. Commencement Exercises have frequently provided occasion for graduates, faculty members, and other guests of the day to hear a sermon or address by some prominent spiritual leader of the Baptist denomination.

Establishment of the Oscar Creech Collection in Baptist History, which is housed in a special section of Whitaker Library, represents one aspect of the college's endeavor to preserve and to maintain records of our religious heritage for the benefit of students - and others who seek greater acquaintance with events, programs, and personalities related to that heritage. One of the earliest acquisitions for this special collection was that of a complete file of the Minutes of the West Chowan Baptist Association - a cooperative alliance of 60 churches located in the counties of Hertford, Northampton. and Bertie. Traditionally, these churches have also been among the strongest advocates and supporters of Chowan's educational mission.

Weeks of Religious Emphasis although inaugurated at Chowan prior to the Whitaker era - have continued to be something of an annual tradition among students and other members of the campus community. These are intended to supplement the daily role and function of the Chaplain to the College - an administrative innovation which President Whitaker introduced in 1959 — in focusing attention upon religious issues, themes, and practices. Student involvement in such emphases has been encouraged through both chapel/assembly programming, and through opportunity for person-to-person contact with those religious leaders who have been invited to share their faith pilgrimage and understanding among us.

Mutual support between Chowan and the Baptist denomination has often found the college utilizing facilities and personnel in the promotion of stewardship emphases, the scheduling/programming of church conferences or retreats, and in joint endeavors related to denominational emphases or programs. A feature of freshman orientation over the past several years has been the reminder that a sizeable portion of the actual cost incurred in educating each student comes as a "gift" with no strings attached from the Baptist churches of North Carolina. Students are encouraged to grow and mature, spiritually, as they grow and develop mentally, socially, and physically through the other aspects of the educational program which is accorded them.

While the frequency of scheduling convocation/chapel/assembly periods has been varied throughout the Whitaker years at Chowan, maintaining the practice of calling students together for periods designed for their value as worship, information, inspiration, or entertainment continues to be built into the weekly calendar of activities expected of all students who enroll at Chowan. An item in the job description of the President of the College notes: "[He] shall preside at...assemblies, but he may delegate these duties to another." Delegating this responsibility has been the norm, given the very demanding schedule of the President. However, he still presides at stated convocations, attends weekly assemblies on occasion, and keeps attuned to what is happening in Turner Auditorium on many occasions when he cannot be physically present.

Civic, political, and religious leaders from within the State of North Carolina — especially — have been invited to the campus on numerous occasions throughout the tenure of Dr. Whitaker as President of the College. Such visits have served the dual functions of (1) providing student access to personalities who are immediately involved in shaping the course of civic/political/religious affairs within the Region, and (2) affording these leaders the opportunity to witness firsthand the kind of educational community which the college has become and/or aspires to become.

President Whitaker has long recognized the significant role of the communications media in informing and shaping public opinion regarding events of both passing and lasting import to the college's constituencies and/or potential constituencies. Accordingly, his tenure has been characterized by significant advances in the institution's program of public relations and - especially - in the development of the Department of Graphic Communications. Moreover, some aspect of the "Chowan Story" has been featured in recent years through the weekly "Chowan College Today" program (radio), and occasional programming under the production auspices of one or more of the several television stations which serve the residents of eastern North Carolina and Tidewater Virginia.

Cooperative endeavors with the community and the greater Roanoke-Chowan Region have also found the campus hosting civic/political leaders of national prominence, on occasion. In this regard, President Whitaker has aligned the college — as appropriate — with every effort to foster commercial, industrial, and educational progress for Hertford County and northeastern North Carolina. He has also been a spokesman for progress related to bettering the quality of life available to the residents of the region. Moreover, he has encouraged faculty, staff, and students to assist, as appropriate, in all such endeavors which would prove mutually beneficial to the college and to that larger community within which she is located. and from which she derives a large measure of support.

Occasions for conversation members of the student body have always proved to be rewarding both for our President, and for those who have shared his company. While such occasions may have proved to be less frequent than either Dr. Whitaker or his student friends could have wished (due to his exceedingly busy schedule, necessary absences from campus, etc.), they have resulted in increased mutual understanding and appreciation. Our President has never tired of reminding professors and other mentors that it is for the benefit of students that any educational institution exists. He will be remembered among us as one who sought to foster this concern for students as a priority item in the shaping of the educational program and the educational agenda.

The civic spirit of the President has been demonstrated through his readiness to serve on the boards of managers or directors of various corporations and enterprises. He has addressed numerous churches, clubs, and other organizations on behalf of the college and his vision of the kind of educational program which he sought to make available to those youth who elect to begin their higher educational venture here. A consistent member of Murfreesboro Baptist Church and of Rotary International, Dr. Whitaker has also encouraged the members of the faculty/staff to identify themselves fully with the local community through exemplary churchmanship, participation in civic affairs, and as participants in the political process which is a vital part of the American heritage of democracy.

Our President has even been known to place a "friendly wager" upon the outcome of a contest involving his Braves. An avid sports fan who loves to be a winner, he has encouraged his share of athletes on the gridiron, the hardwood, the diamond, the mats, the courts, the track, or on the fairway to "bring home the bacon" - his favorite expression for coming away from a contest with a victory to show for the effort. As suggested by the photo at the right, President Whitaker might even be found

guilty of gloating a bit when the Braves have emerged victorious in a game involving particularly "high stakes" in terms

of institutional prestige.

An advocate of the role and value of intercollegiate athletics as an integral segment of the total educational experience. President Whitaker has played a significant role in advancing the athletic program of the college to a position of national rank and prominence among American junior colleges. At the same time, he has always encouraged student athletes to give proper attention to curricular studies which will lead to the attainment of an academic degree, while pursuing their athletic interests and goals. Attendance upon athletic events (as schedules permit) has been something of a recreational priority for President Whitaker throughout the years of his long tenure with Chowan College. His recent induction into the Chowan College Sports Hall of Fame serves to underscore his commitment and contribution with regard to this aspect of the educational program.

From entering freshmen . . . to "graduating seniors" . . . to alumni who distinguish themselves in service to God and humankind through a broad spectrum of professions and vocations - such is the kind of journey envisioned for all who begin their collegiate experience at Chowan. Many of that number who began their college adventure during the tenure of Dr. Whitaker are already giving evidence of their commitment, as alumni, to the pursuit and promotion of those values and ideals for which the college stands. Others will join these in future years, perpetuating a long tradition of devotion and service which was established by earlier generations of college alumnae.

That journey from bewildered freshmen to distinguished alumni may take many a winding turn in the lives of those men and women of the future who will prove themselves to have imbibed, deeply, of Chowan's educational tradition. For these, the names of professors and classmates who "helped along the way" are very likely to be remembered with fondness and deep gratitude. Other "names" of dedicated men and women - who may have remained personally unknown to any given generation of students - will also be numbered among those whose long-term philanthropy contributed significantly to the provision of an educational program which made Chowan a distinctive kind of institution in which to embark upon the higher educational adventure.

Numerous buildings on campus which have been erected during the Whitaker Administration bear the names of friends or alumni whose commitment to Christian higher education included the provision of funds used to offset the cost of constructing and/or equipping a particular facility. Among these are Jenkins Hall, Simons Hall, Marks Hall, Thomas Cafeteria, Penny Infirmary, Belk Hall, Daniel Hall, Parker Hall, Camp Hall, and Horner Hall. Other buildings - such as McDowell Columns, McSweeney Hall, Mixon Hall, Green Hall, Whitaker Library, and Helms Center - bear the names of earlier benefactors or other persons who have been recognized for having devoted years of outstanding educational and/or public service

In some cases, three or more generations within a particular family have continued a tradition of love, lovalty, and support for Chowan College which began during the earliest years of the life of the school. The Thomas Family, of nearby Cofield - in memory and in honor of whose members Thomas Cafeteria is named - stands as representative of this type of family loyalty which had sustained Chowan through many difficult earlier days. One legacy of the Whitaker Administration has been the continued involvement of such families in helping to chart the progress and growth of the college far beyond that educational role which earlier generations could have possibly envisioned.

To be able to explore one's visions for the future of the educational enterprise with those whose expertise and judgement are respected and admired has been the happy experience of President Whitaker throughout his tenure at Chowan. Members of the Board of Trustees, with concurrence of the Board of Advisors. have established broad educational policies, after a thorough exploration of alternatives and consequences related to their decisions. Strong reliance has been placed upon the data which the Administration has amassed in support of such recommendations or suggestions as may have been forthcoming for the consideration of the governing board. Our President, in turn, has relied upon the wise counsel of numerous colleagues. associates, and friends as he sought to provide executive leadership for the college he has served since 1957.

The most recent construction on campus preparation of the "old" President's Home for occupancy by those who would succeed the Whitakers as the Number one family of the college community. Just as the initial construction of this facility (1948) had been made possible through the gifts of time, labor, and money on the part of friends of the college, the "new" President's Home will bear the name of a member of another of those families who are indelibly linked to the growth and service of Chowan College. The President's Home is to be known as the Ella Cobb Camp House.



Whitaker Library, completed in 1968. stands as the most obvious on-campus monument to the recognition of that untiring labor which Bruce Ezell Whitaker has exerted on behalf of Chowan College throughout the course of his distinguished tenure as President of the College. It is particularly fitting that the Board of Trustees should have chosen this particular structure to bear and to perpetuate the name of the nineteenth president of the institution which first opened her doors for the admission of students in 1848. Of all those material resources which are essential to the pursuit of an excellent education, Dr. Whitaker would certainly rank the library and its holdings as primary to that task. Accordingly, he is particularly proud of the library's acquisition record over the course of the last three decades. both in terms of volume and scope.

Retirees can sometimes be quickly forgotten, as they lose contact with those institutions they served - and their former "employers" with them. Not so with the Bruce Whitakers! Not only do we expect to see them frequently on campus. But, in a very special sense, we are aware that they will continue to "look out" for our interests from the vantage point of their lovely new residence on the southwestern shore of Lake Vann. This residence - a gift of the Board of Trustees, Board of Advisors, and other friends - was provided the First Family in view of their long-term devotion to the mission of Christian higher education as envisioned and pursued at Chowan College.

DAY STUDENTS



Most of the students at Chowan live in one of the campus dorms. However, some students attend Chowan that drive, walk, or ride bikes daily to the college. These students are considered as Day Students. The Day Students meet at the end of Wednesday assemblies with their advisor, Mrs. Batchelor to conduct the business of electing representatives for the Homecoming and Spring Festival Courts. They also organize various other fund raising activities from which the proceeds are put into a scholarship fund. At the end of each year, the freshmen day student with the highest academic average and who participated in the Day Students activities receives the scholarship. The Day Students, because they do not live on campus, they may not participate in as many activities as resident students. Even so, they are a vital part of our campus and academic life.

International Students Add Culture



International students are an important part of Chowan College environment. There are presently 40 students on campus from foreign countries such as Japan, Thailand, India, Kenya, Nigeria, Jordan, England, The Netherlands Antilles, and the Bahamas. These students major in a variety of programs such as fine arts, liberal arts, printing technology, photography, science, math, music, pre-engineering, business administration, computer programming and applications, and pre-athletic training. 

FOOTBALL

The Chowan College Braves and veteran Head Coach Jim Garrison finished the 1988 regular season with a 604 overall record and a 4-1 mark in the Coastal Conference. The Braves finished the regular season 10 points from an undefeated season as the Braves dropped 4 cliffhangers. The Braves lost 3 games by a field goal and one game by an extra point, as Chowan flirted with greatness, but came up a bit short.

The Braves were lead all season by the "Great Spirit" defense, named after the 3 Guilford College Quakers, Dan Surface, Charles Arrington and Marc Scott who coached the defense. The "Great Spirit" allowed only 63 points all season, recorded 3 shutouts and only had 3 teams score touchdowns all season. The "Great Spirit" gave up only 5 touchdowns all season, 3 through the air, and 2 on the ground. At mid-season Chowan ranked 3rd in the NJCAA against the run and 8th in total defense. The defensive leader and team captain was All American candidate, linebacker George Koonce (New Bern), who had 70 solos and 52 assists for 122 total tackles. Koonce also recovered 3 fumbles, knocked down 3 passes, intercepted 1 pass and had 1 sack.

Offensively Chowan was lead by 3 tailbacks, Brian Hamm (Clifton Forge, VA), Butch Moses (Lancaster, SC) and Ervin Bryson (Abbeville, SC). Hamm lead the Braves with over 600 yards, and 5 touchdowns, while Moses had 521 yards and 6 T.D.'s and Bryson added 270 yards. Tight end Craig Thompson caught 6 passes for a 31.0 average per catch and scored 3 touchdowns.

Chowan struggled offensively all season, especially passing for touchdowns, but the Braves tailbacks were a threat to score from anywhere.

The Braves entered the East Bowl after dropping 2 heart-breaking losses, 6-3 to Mongtomery and 13-10 to North Greenville. Montgomery kicked a field goal late in the 4th quarter while North Greenville broke a 10-10 tie with 21 seconds left.

Coach Garrison and team were excited about the East Bowl and to the 1st Bowl game since 1981. The Braves defeated Dean Junior College by a 50-7 score. Chowan set 9 new East Bowl records in that game.







Students Come Alive to Support Braves to National Ranking

The Chowan Braves finished the 1988-1989 season with a 25-7 record, a 78 percent winning edge. Chowan finished 13-3 in Region X of the NJCAA and 9-3 in the first season of the Carolinas Junior College Conference. The Braves averaged 88.2 points per game offensively, while allowing 72.7 points on defense. Chowan hit 52% of its field goal attempts and 69% of its free throws, averaged 32.6 rebounds, made 677 assists, 403 steals, and blocked 79 shots.

Sophomore center, Billy Coles, "Mr. Inside", and Sophomore guard Terry Massey, "Mr. Outside", were both named 1st Team All-Region X and 1st Team All-Region X and 1st Team All-Conference. Coles played in 31 games, averaged 22.5 points, and 8.0 rebounds per contest. The 68" center hit 62% of his field goal attempts and 71% of his free throws, had 53 assists, 67 steals and blocked 27 shots. Terry Massey averaged 17.3 points and hit 48% of his field goals and 68% of his free throws. The 6'2" guard had 73 steals, 71 assists, and hit 64 3-point shots.

In addition to Coles and Massey, Chowan will also lose sophomores, Tabarris Hamilton, Jeff Whitaker, and Dean Houpe. Hamilton, a starter at forward averaged 12.5 points, Whitaker, a back-up point guard, averaged 3.8 points and Houpe, a reserve forward, averaged 2.6 points per game.

Freshman Bernard Terrell with a 13.1 scoring average and guard Taro Knight at 7.4 will be the top two returning lettermen for next season. Terrell averaged 7.5 rebounds per game, while Knight had a team leading 196 assists for a 6.1 average per game.

Conference Co-Champions Region X Co-Champions

The Chowan Braves ended the 1988-89 season with a 25 and 7 overall, 13-3 in Region X and 9-3 in the Carolinas Junior College Conference. Chowan's season ended on a disappointing note as the Braves were upset by Spartanburg Methodist 67-65 in the semi-finals of the Region X Tournament.

The Braves ended the regular season with one of the best games ever played in the Helms Center, and 89-87 loss to North Greenville. The Mounties came to Murfreesboro with a 9th place National ranking and a 26-3 overall record. Chowan led 35-30 at the half, but North Greenville hit 5, 3 point bombs in the second half to get the hard-fought victory. Sophomore Terry Massey was the game's leading scorer with 24, Taro Knight had 20, Sophomore Billy Coles added 19 and Bernard Terrell scored 12. The loss left Chowan and North Greenville as co-champions in Region X and co-champions in the confrence.

In the 2nd round of the 12 team Region X tournament, Chowan took on arch-rival Louisburg and put the Hurricanes away by a 67-59 score. The Braves led 31-29 at half-time and defense proved to be the difference in a very physical contest. Terry Massey had 17, Billy Coles and Bernard Terrell both scored 16 and Tabarris Hamilton with 10 led Chowan to victory.

In the semi-final action, Chowan playing its 3rd game in 5 days, gave out of gas down the stretch to lose by 2 to Spartanburg Methodist. The Braves had a 9-point half-time lead, but could not break away and the dream of back to back trips to Kansas ended in Louisburg.

They will form the nucleus of a very strong squad next season.

After completing regular season play, the Lady Braves traveled to Brevard to enter the Region X Tournament and faced the strong, number one seeded team, Anderson College. Even though the squad was eliminated in the first contest, 80 to 54, the five freshman starters were outstanding in the battle. Tammy Harvey, Rebekah Reasor, Bobbi Fluellyn and Michelle Carpenter all scored in double figures, with teammate Doris Kelly scoring also.

With the strong Freshman class returning with much experience, coupled with a good recruiting year, the Lady Braves should be a very strong challenge for Region X honors next season.



Chowan Wrestlers Finish Season Nationally Ranked

The Chowan Braves team finished the 1988-89 season as the 11th best Junior College in the country. Head Coach Jody Taylor took 4 wrestlers to the NCJAA National Tournament in Chicago, Illinois and returned to Murfreesboro with two All-Americans.

Sophomore team Captain Daron Heggie won 4 matches and lost 2 in the two-day tournament to finish 5th in the country. Heggie finished the season with a 33-8-1 record and a 57-20-1 record over two years.

Heavyweight Freshman Melvin Crosby became the second highest finisher in Chowan history when he became the National runner-up in Chicago. On the way to the Finals, Crosby defeated Robby Benjamin (1987) National Champion, and John Hikely who won the award for the most falls in the tournament. In the Finals, Melvin wrestled Paul Weltha from Iowa Central and was defeated on a last second takedown 5-4. Crosby finished the rookie season with a 29-7 record and All-American Honors.

Joining Heggie and Crosby in Chicago were James Wall finished the regular season at 26-6-2, 6-0-1 in conference action and he was 1 and 2 at Chicago. David Wilderman was 16-3, 9-2 in dual matches, but he went 0-2 at the Nationals.

The Braves finished the regular season 12 and 4 ranked 17th, but Chowan surprised all the experts with the 11th place finish, second highest in the schools history. In the two years in Murfreesboro, the Braves under Taylor have a combined record of 25-6-1 in dual matches. Chowan has had 4 Mid-Atlantic champions, 9 National qualifiers, a National runner-up, 2 academic All-Americans and an 11th place national ranking.



All-Americans

George Koonce, a 6'2", 235 pound middle linebacker helped to lead the Braves to a winning defensive season. Defensive coordinator Dan Surface calls Koonce "a natural linebacker." By the end of the season he had made 74 solo tackles and 57 assisted tackles for a total of 131. He had one interception which he ran back for 48 yards, 3 fumble recoveries, 1 quarterback sack, and knocked down 3 passes.





Daron Heggie, a 164 pound sophomore team captain, won 4 matches and lost 2 in the National Tournament. Heggie placed 5th in his weight class, making him only the 8th wrestler in Chowan history to receive All-American honors. He finished the regular season with 33 wins, 8 loses 1 tie and a career record of 57-20-1.

Melvin Crosby was 2nd highest national finisher in Chowan's history and only the 9th All-American. On his way to the finals in the National Tournament he defeated the 1987 Junior College National Champion. In the finals Crosby met last year's runner-up Paul Weltha from Iwoa Central, who scored a last second takedown to defeat Crosby 5-4. Crosby finished the season 29-7 and will be back next year.
