




After much hard work these boys finish their project. These projects will be inspected and graded by Mr. Sorrell.

After work comes cleaning up. At the end of the period the shop is swept thoroughly. A clean shop makes for better work on the part of all students as well as the machines.








Since the Clayton Band has been organized it has contributed a great deal to the school as well as the community. It represents the school in parades, sporting events and in daily activities.
