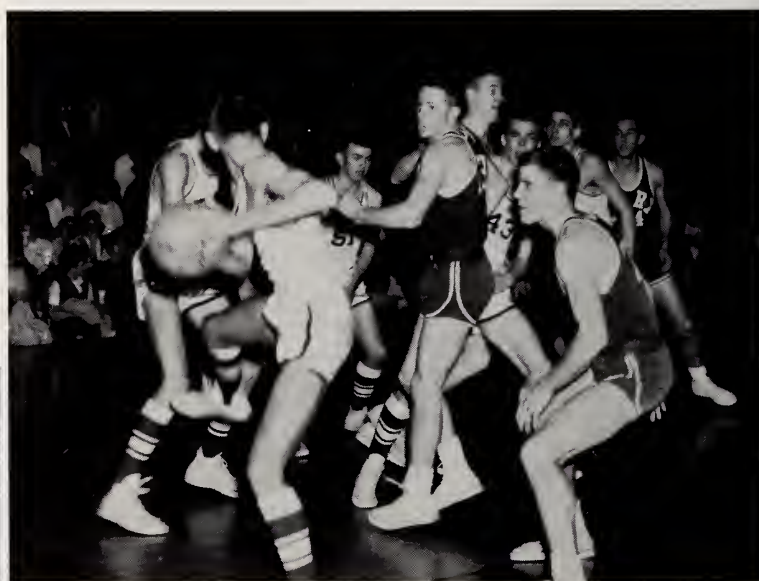
Defensively, the Comets stick to two defenses—the 1-3-1 zone and the basic man-to-man defense.
