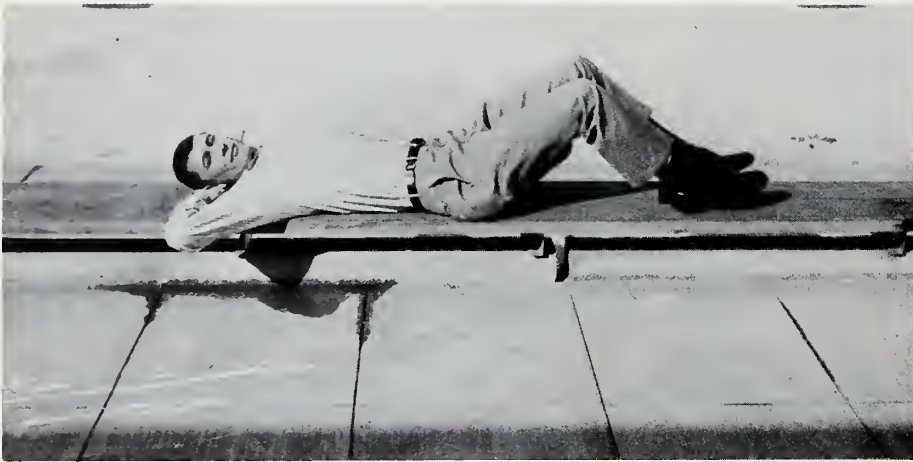
SUMMER THINKING

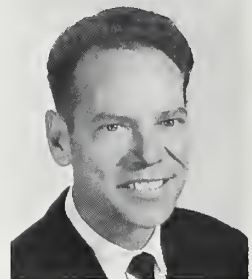
