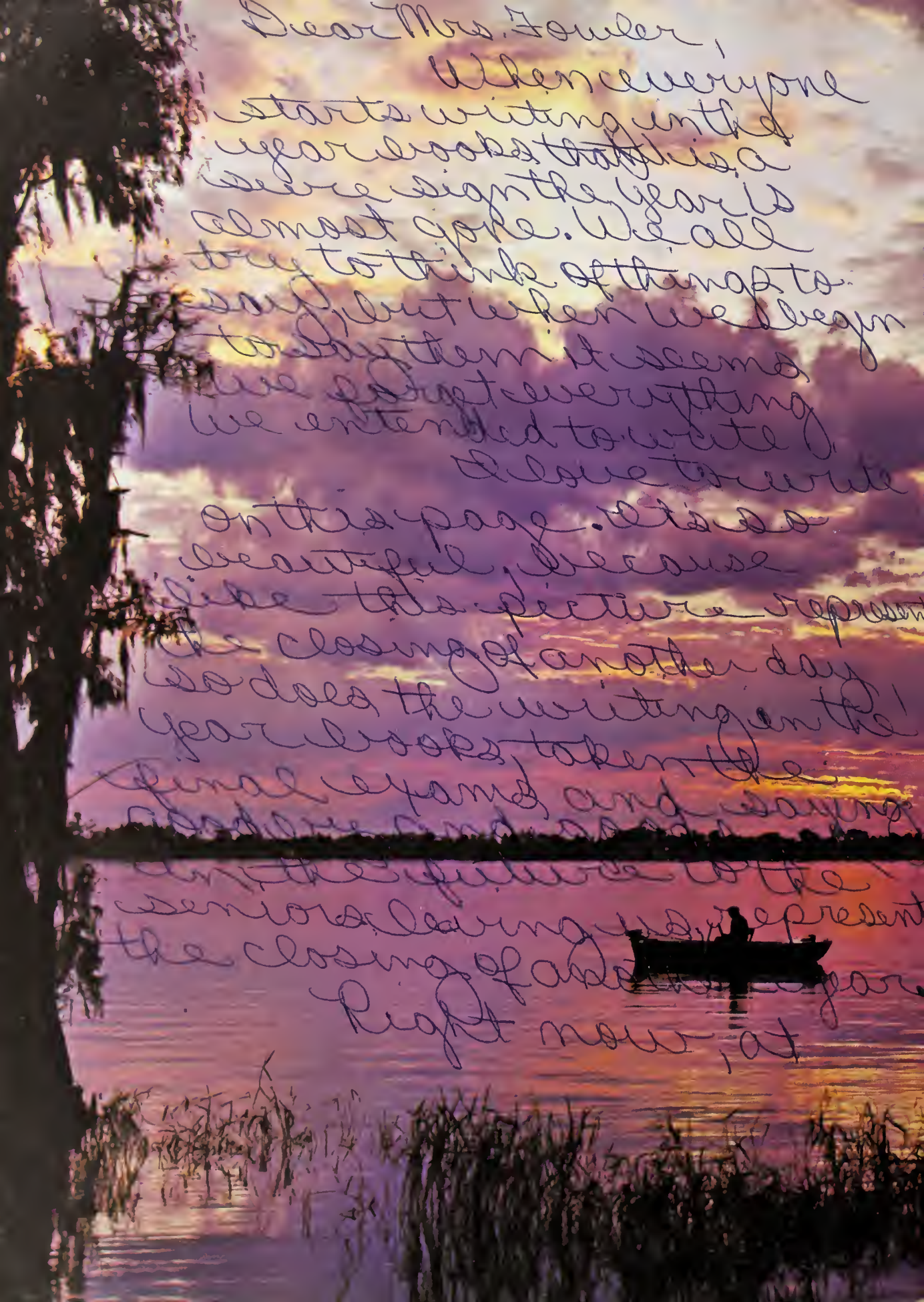




Dear Mrs. Fowler,

OUR HOMECOMING QUEEN

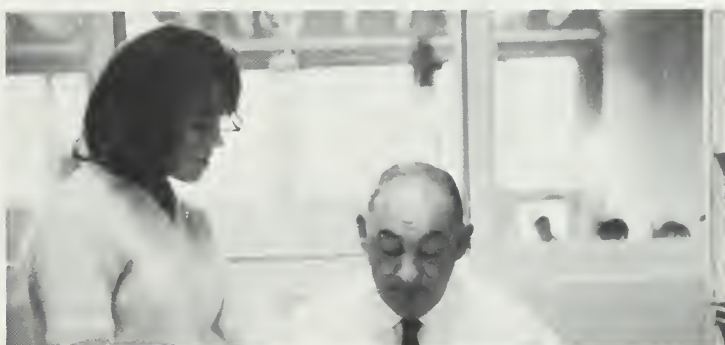
PENNY CARRIKER
