Don Reid and Johnny Slean have opened up a large factory in Clemmons, where they manufacture cue-sticks and pool chalk.

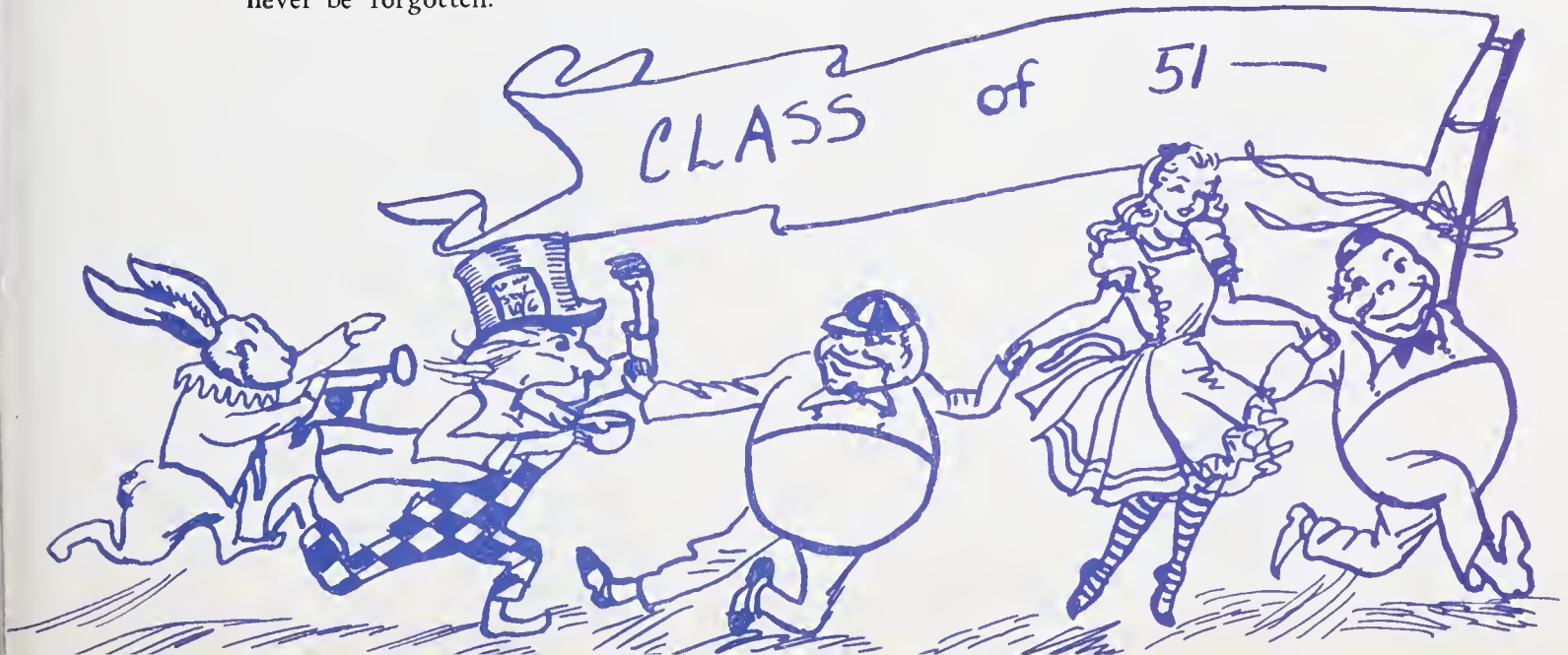
Jim Brewer is really going places in the business world. He is president of the largest cigar factory in Clemmons.

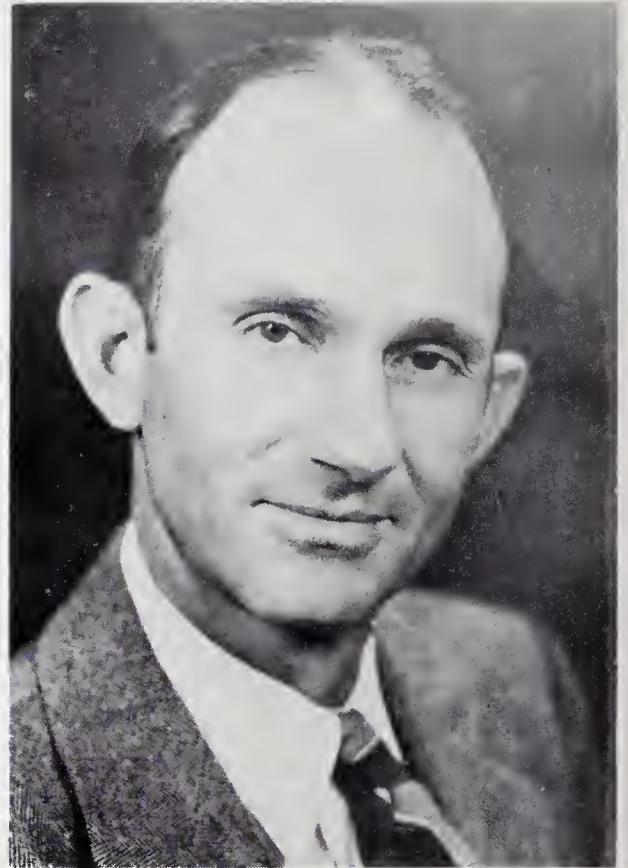
