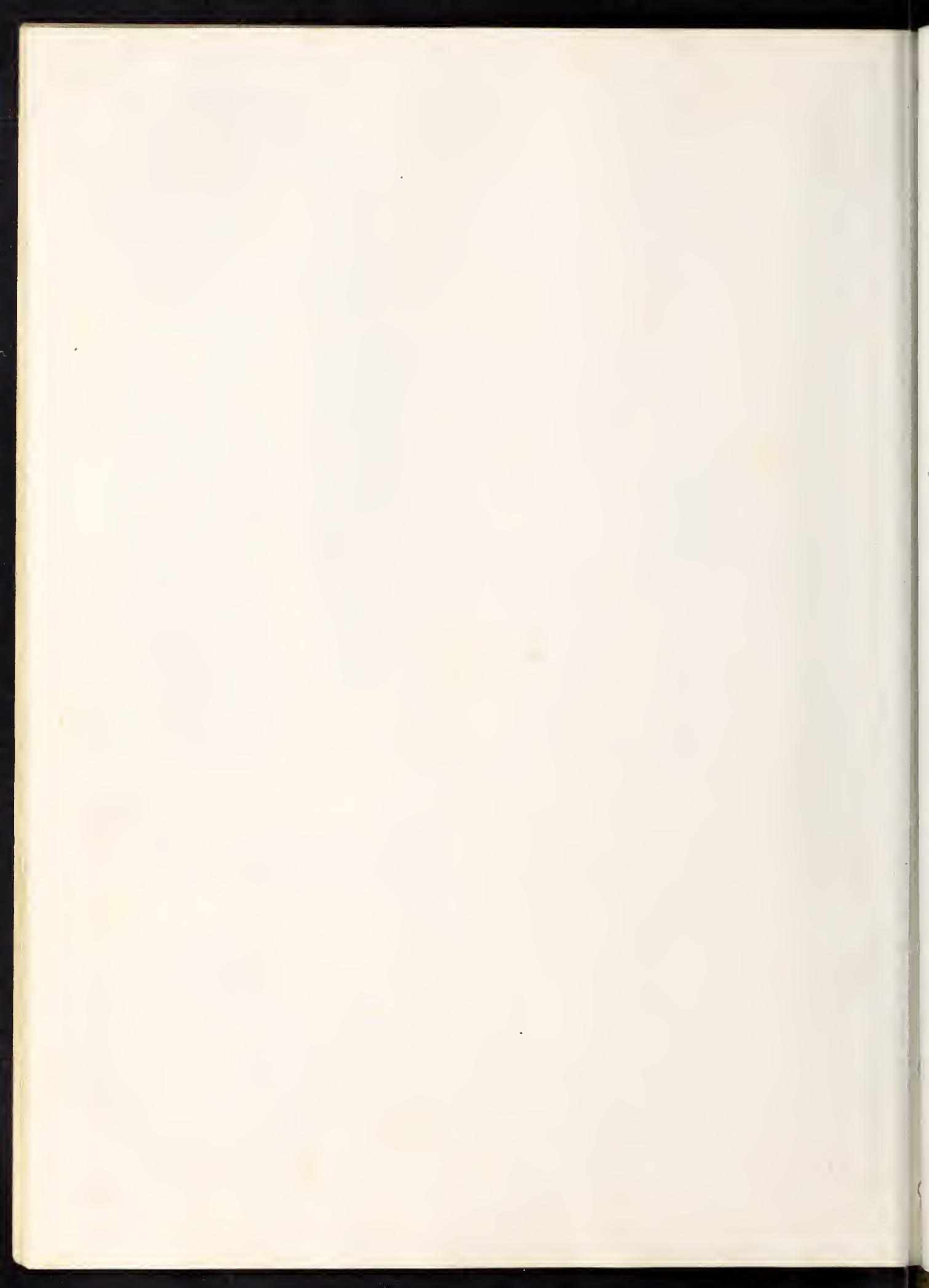
Now that all the seniors of 1955 had been found, they were tried and found guilty of having a very successful life.
