Donna McDaniel and Joyce Kennedy went out for cheerleading and were elected. Benny Beeker, Joyce Kennedy, Larry Wright, and Donna McDaniel lettered in sports. By the end of the year we felt we were really a part of the High School.

The first things we noticed when next we met, in the fall of '56, was that we still had twenty-five members and again had Mr. Robison as our advisor. When we returned as juniors, we were very much aware of the responsibility placed upon our shoulders. There were our rings to be ordered, class play to be given, and numerous activities leading up to the all important Junior-Senior Banquet at which we were to be hosts. Finally the date and place for the banquet were set. On May 3, 1957, we entertained the Seniors with a semi-formal banquet in the Cleveland School cafeteria. Everything was grand, and it will long be remembered by those who attended it.

Three more members of our class, Mildred Dillon, Donna McDaniel, and Larry Wright, were initiated into the Beta Club. Six members of our class were selected as marshals with Anita Dillon as chief.

In May of '57 we were sorry to see the seniors graduate, but we were glad to be replacing them.

Returning for our final year in August, 1957, under the guiding hand of Mrs. Ruby Gulledge, we were fully aware of the tasks ahead. Finally the goal was being reached.
