




## 74i-School Building



The above picture is the high school building, which was erected about ten years ago. It houses the high school classes, home economics, principal's office, and library. The agricultural vocational department has quarters in the basement. In addition to the above building there is an older building, a Rosenwald type, known as the elementary building. However, it is inadequate to house the elementary school. Hence, some classes are held in the church and masonic hall which are adjacent to the school grounds. Plans are being made to break ground for a new elementary building which will relieve some of the present congested conditions.
