Everyone plunged headlong into the defense program by entering into the scrap drive, the tin-can drive, and the organization of the Victory Corps. This year's carnival was very successful. The members of the school entered whole-heartedly into the buying of War Stamps and Bonds, and purchased enough to buy a jeep for our armed forces.

As our last petal has fallen, our high school career is ended. The fragrance of that rose will linger in our hearts forever. Many times it has wavered in the strong winds, but has never been uprooted. Although this rose has faded into the past, others will blossom forth in future years, and "no other rose will ever seem so sweet to us."

To the members of the faculty and the friends who have enriched our lives and made our rose glow more brightly, we leave our fondest wishes for the future.

Truly, our high school career is at its end; but in our minds it shall linger always.
