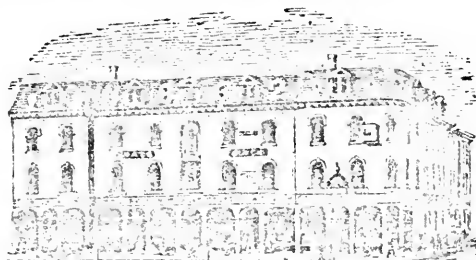

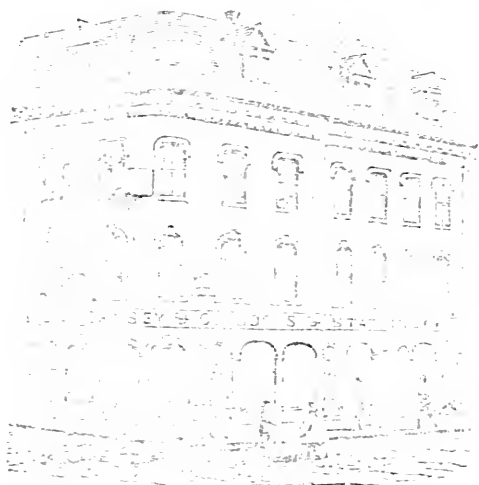

LIST OF STREETS.

ACADEMY STREET, westerly of Spring street, extends from Cambridge to Washington street.

ALLISON STREET is south of West street, and extends westerly from Turnpike street.

BADGER STREET is west of State street, and extends from West to Allison street.

BEAVER STREET extends from Cross to Monroe st.

BLAKE STREET is between Pleasant and Warren streets, and extends from State to Green street.

BRADLEY STREET is west of State street, and extends from Franklin to Penacook street.

CAMBRIDGE STREET is between Center and Washington street, and extends from Spring to Rumford st.

CEDAR STREET runs westerly from State street, and is opposite Montgomery street.

CENTER STREET extends westerly from Main street, over Sand hill, where it intersects with Washington st.

CHAPEL COURT is on the north side of the Methodist church, and runs easterly from State street.

CHURCH LANE extends northerly from Park street to Center street.

CHURCH STREET is on the south side of the Methodist Institute, extending westerly from Main to State st.

COURT STREET extends westerly from Main street, by the north side of the City Hall, to State street.

CROSS STREET extends westerly from Main to South street.

DOWNING STREET extends westerly from Main street, by J. S. & E. A. Abbot's carriage manufactory, to South street.

ELM STREET extends southerly from Wall to Thompson street.

ESSEX STREET extends northerly from Center to Washington street.

FAYETTE STREET is north of Thompson street, and extends westerly from Main to South street.

FOREST STREET runs westerly from High street.

FOSTERVILLE extends easterly from the north end of State street, to Merrimack and Conn. River Railroad.

FRANKLIN STREET extends westerly from Main street to High street.

FREMONT STREET extends from Pleasant street northerly, by the house of R. H. Sherburne.

FREIGHT STREET runs easterly from Main street to the Freight Depot.

FULTON STREET extends easterly from South to Spring street.

GREEN STREET is west of State street, and extends northerly from Pleasant to Center street.

HENRY STREET is next westerly of Jackson street, and runs from Franklin street to Church street.

HIGH STREET extends from Washington to Franklin street.

HANOVER STREET is west of Spring street, and extends northerly from School to Center street.

HILL'S AVENUE runs easterly from Main street, by the house of James R. Hill, to Railroad Square.

HUNTINGDON STREET is west of Rumford, and extends northerly from Warren to Center street.

HUTCHINS STREET runs easterly from Main street to the Passenger Depot.

JACKSON STREET is west of Bradley street, and extends from Franklin to Church street.

JEFFERSON STREET extends southerly from Thompson to Cross st.

LIBERTY STREET is west of Pine street, and extends northerly from Pleasant to Warren street.

LINCOLN COURT is northerly of Fulton street, and extends easterly from Spring street.

MAIN STREET runs from the Turnpike road northerly to Horse-shoe Pond.

MAPLE STREET extends westerly from Union to Spring street.

MERRIMACK STREET is west of Rumford street, and extends northerly from Pleasant to Center st.

MONROE STREET extends westerly from State to South st.

MONTGOMERY STREET extends westerly from Main to State street.

MYRTLE STREET runs from Thompson st. to Cross.

ORCHARD STREET is north of Pleasant street, and runs westerly from Merrimack to Pine street.

PARK STREET is on the north side of the State House, and extends westerly from Main to Center st.

PEARL STREET extends westerly from Main to State street, opposite the State Prison.

PENACOOK STREET extends from Main to State street, at Horse-shoe Pond, westerly, by the residence of R. Bradley, to the foot of the hill on Little Pond road.

PERLEY STREET is north of Downing street, and runs parallel with it.

PINE STREET is west of Merrimack street, and extends northerly from Pleasant to Centre st.

PLEASANT AVENUE is south of Pleasant street, and runs westerly from Spring street.

PLEASANT STREET extends westerly from Main st., by the South church, to its junction with Washington st.

PRINCE STREET extends westerly from Green street, by Horace Call's house, to Spring street.

RAILROAD SQUARE is between Main Street and the Depot.

RUMFORD STREET is west of Spring street, and extends northerly from Pleasant to Washington st.

SCHOOL STREET extends westerly from Main to Washington street.

SOUTH STREET extends southerly from Pleasant street to Mrs. Benjamin Wheeler's residence.

SPRING STREET is west of Green street, and extends northerly from Bog road to Washington street.

STATE STREET is west of Main street, and extends

from the Turnpike road northerly, to Wood brook, on the Boscawen road.

SUMMER STREET runs north from Winter to Court st.

TAHANTO STREET is west of Merrimack street, and extends northerly from Warren to Center street.

THOMPSON STREET extends westerly from Main to South street.

THORNDIKE STREET is south of Monroe street, and extends westerly from Main to South street.

TREMONT STREET is on the north side of the State Prison wall, and extends westerly from State street.

TURNPIKE STREET extends south-westerly from Main street, by the head of State street.

UNION STREET extends northerly from Center to Washington street.

WALL STREET is south of Pleasant, and extends westerly from State to South street.

WALKER STREET extends westerly, by the house of Professor Vail, to the land of Judge Perkins.

WALNUT STREET extends northerly from Washington to Franklin street.

WARREN STREET is north of Pleasant, and extends westerly from Main to Washington street.

WASHINGTON STREET runs westerly from Main street by the North church, over the hill, where it intersects with Pleasant street.

WEST STREET is north of Turnpike road, and extends from Main to South street.

WINTER STREET is north of Montgomery, and extends easterly from State street.

The North and South Lanes, running westerly from State to Green street, and under the arches of Call's Block, are private ways.

The Biblical Institute commenced its operations in April, 1847, since which time 100 students have graduated. The following extract from the last annual catalogue, relating to expenses, may be considered of interest:

"It is the design of the Trustees and patronizing Conferences to reduce the expenses of the students to the lowest possible sum. Hence no charge is made for tuition. The boarding house is occupied by the students free of rent, and their board and washing is secured at cost. The average cost per week has been \$1.25, while the expenses of some are brought much lower by boarding themselves. The Institution makes no charges upon the students except \$6 per year, for contingent expenses, upon those who occupy rooms in the Institute buildings, and \$3 per year upon those who room out, payable in advance.

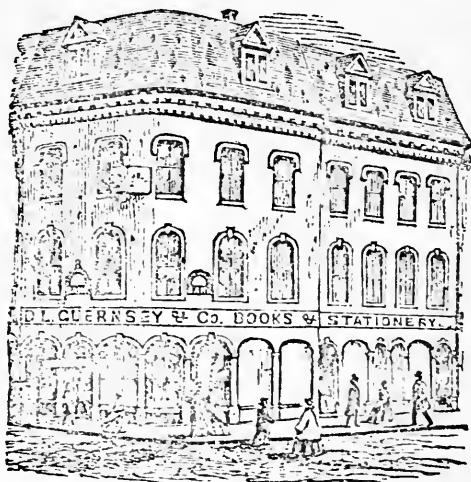
