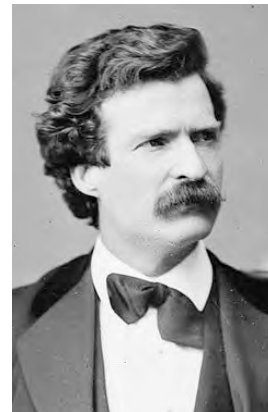


Twain A CONNECTICUT YANKEE IN KING ARTHUR'S COURT

A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court is an 1889 novel by American humorist and writer Mark Twain. It tells the story of tale of Hank Morgan, a 19th-century resident of Hartford, Connecticut who awakens to find himself inexplicably transported back in time to early medieval Britain. The work is a very early example of time travel in literature, anticipating by six years H. G. Wells' *The Time Machine* of 1895. While the book pokes fun at contemporary society, the main thrust is a satire of romanticized ideas of chivalry, and of the idealization of the Middle Ages common in the novels of Sir Walter Scott and other 19th century literature. *(Wikipedia)*
