Dear Dick:
I think we have some sort of a record now. An orchid collected in the paramo near Bogotá on Sept. 25 is described in Cambridge, Mass. on October 7 as a new species.

First the orchids. The oncidium I have not bothered With because better specimens will come when you send your plants up. No. 1025 (is that number right?- it seems very small for all of the collecting that you have done) is Pachyphyllum Schultesil L. Wms. n. sp. This is one of my favorite genera and I Iove to determine them. I hope that you can find a lot of them. I think this one is about the smallest of the genus al though there is one that has smaller flowers, -about half the size of these.

I wonder if Dugand would be interested in a paper for Caldesia? I have a number of things that I have thought of getting together and sending down there. Host of them from specimens collected by cuatrecasas. I have a lot of his stuff on my desk now.

I have a Iready written to Patiño and Keufann in Guatemala and Chaipas. I will write to Cortes today. I will write in Spanish in case that he does not understand English. If gou see hin again explain this and my poor Bpanish. I have your letter of november 13 wich arrived this mornine. The British cencor eot it. It has a censor date of 17 llovember, robubly Bermuda.

Pirst concerning a puper for Caldesia. Dr. Dufand's letter of otober 30 was received here on the afternoon of November 5. I hurriediy typed up what little manuscript I had thet mas complete enough to go, a very little, and nailed it out air mail on November 6. It certainly should have been there by the time that you wrote your letter. There were only five paces of ms, and one plate. It is pos ible that it went by the Bermuda and the Eritish censor is still puzzine over it as it was written in my om inimitable Spanish and Latin.

Pachyphyllum Schul屯esil was the n. sp. in the paper which I sent to Dr. Dueand. You wi 1 mobsbly see a copy of it before I do.

I got a letter from illilp a couple of days ago (after I had written him that I had more than Half of some of Cuatrecasas orchids determined) and he aske dor spolmens back so that he micht return them to Colombis. His remerk was w before shippine ceta impossible or dancerous". Tie may be a ilttle too pessumistic but I hand it on for what it may be worth.

I think that we are in this war rieht now and that it isn't going to be very long before there is an open break. It is comon Enomledee that $U$. S. merchan boeta begin putting in to the yards the moment the the neutrality bill was kilied and began puttine euns on - and the guns were there and ready for ther. U.S. bottoms are already in convoy to England. If there is a definite break the Germans my becin taxe eoing after shipping along our atlantic seabord and make it somenhat more hazurdous than it is at the monent. Ihis may fave been What killip had in mind.

Dear Mr. Schweinfurth:
Yesterday your Christmas card arrived with one from Mrs. Bierweiler. Thanks so much. I was glad to get the greeting even though the mails were so poor that it took it from Nov. 21 to Febr. 8 to arrive. I thought that I had written to you about the article on orchids for the Revista de Ciencias. In December, I corrected the proofs. The issue has been held up unmercifully because of lack of paper. I expect it to be out within several months, however. Your article looks nice and is well presented. It is good to publish in South American publications, I think, and you will be well pleased with this job. Incidentally, I have sent some plants to Lyman. There are several collections of orchids in the packet. These are from the high sandstone hills of the Vaupes -- hills isolated for hundreds of miles in the flat Amazonian forest --- where Dugand and I are finding so many endemics in Bombax, Hevea, Sapium, Ficus, Mauritiella, etc., etc. I would not be at all surprized to find that these orchids are new or interesting. They are on an extremely xerophytic mountain within a vast wet rain forest. I'd appreciate your giving them a glance when they arrive. There isn't mucg news and I am trying to get off se veral long reports to Washington. Thank Tracy for his fine note on the Christmas card which I shall answer when things are less rushed. Remember me to every one at the Museum and tell them all I thinkof the place a great deal You cannot appreciate what a wonderful place it really is until you are deprived of its facilities for several years.

Thank you for your letter about the orchids of Colombia, Peri, etc. The information was very useful to me for a little article I have. written entitled "La Riqueza de la Flora Colombians". This will be out shortly and I shall see that a copy is sent bo you.

Thanks also for the copy of Prof. Ames book which arrived last month. I am hoping to trengm Late the Last chapter of it into Spanish for publication here. I have a lot of time often on my trips when it rains, and I hope to use part of it in this way.

I wonder if you could help me in a matter of Greek. In 194I, I discovered what appears to be a new genus of Solaneceae in southern Colombia, but I have never described it waiting for more material. Finally, now, I have abundant material of it. All these years I have thought to call it Methytucodendron Anesianum, the generic name meaning "narcotic tree". Now, however, I wonder if I could x o all it something honouring Prof. Ames in the geo nus. There is so much difficulty getting a generic name which hos not utilised Ames or Oakes that I have thought perhaps that Dendramesiamight possibly be good. But I don lon om enough about Greek to be sure whether I can use dendros in that way and use the personal name as the surfeit. Can you holp me out?

I shall be making a trip shorty up to Costa Ria to see the flowering of the Hover trees. Last mont, Louis Wililaras and his wife were in Bogota for a few days. Is Mrs. Marsh still drawing for you? If so, give her my regards and tell her that very soon now I shall have several thing for her to draw, maps of distribution especially.

For some time now, I have been planning to write the orchids of Colombia, but until recently I have not been in a position to permit myself to make definite plans to that end. Now that I shall have the time and facilities at the Ames Herbarium to do such a long range task, I have planned to begin.

Recently -- in fact, only yesterday -- I Learned that you have borrowed the Colombian material from Washington. I had no idea thet you were committed to do the orehids of Colombia, nor did Mr. Schweinfurth know of it. I want to write and ask you whet your plans are. If you have not started, would it be possible for you to shift to the orchids of Ecuador or Venezuela, both of which need doing and both of which are, of course, allied to the Colombian orchid flora?

I ask you this for several reasons. I have just terminated 12 years of active field work in Colombia and have a good knowledge of the terrain and the general picture of the orchids there. Furthermore, a number of Colombian scientists and amateurs have asked me to undertoke this work. If I dowork on the orchids, the logical course would be to work on those orchids from the area

- with which I am most familiar.

As I say, I do not know how far you have gotten into the orchids of Colombia, but I would appreciate hearing from you and would be grateful for your consideration of my suggestion in this letter.

Dear Leslie:
I want to acknowledge with thanks your good letter of June 12, 1956.

The news that Mr. Dunsterville is willing to loan us the negatives of his drawings of orchids is indeed good. However, I do not know whether we can arrange for immediate copying because I am going away next week for two or two and a half months and Charles will be away for at least one month this summer. With 350 negatives to print, it would cost more than we would like to invest, since we could do the work ourselves for a small fraction of that amount. If, of course, Mr. Dunsterville insists on immediate return of the negatives, I suppose that there will be no way out but have them done, and if you find out that this is so, I hope that you will write to Charles during the summer, so that he may have them done. The Epistephium was published in the Bulletin of the American Orchid Society for April.

The negatives of the Dunsterville drawings were sent to the Nev York address which you gave us in Wovernber, to await Mr. Dunsterville's arrival there. We have here your notes which Irs. de Irate is copying off in her spare moments. Do not worry about them because they are safe and this work Will co slowly because she sandwiches it in with her other work Which is of a more urgent nature.

We have not yet been successful in getting Smith to draw the Erythrodes. In fact, he has not even been near the Herbarium. Last week I called him on the telephone and made a date for tomorrow because this thing must be done, as well as a lot of other work which we have pending.

There are separated a few duplicates of North American orchids which you can look at when you come down this way. There may be more. We are going through Professor Ames' herbarium which vas stored at North aston, at his home, and we find that there are a number of orchid duplicates there. I am separating them in packages with the ammodion "Attention: Gray".

I have not heard any rumours about how the Guggenheim is shaping up for you, but there is no reason why I would hear of that, inasmuch as I have already sent in my own strong recomendation. I do not want to raise your hopes unduly but $I$ will say that it will be a disappointment to me if this grant is not made.

It would be easier for me to pay for this (and it will be expensive, as he has put some time on it) if published in the Museum. Also in this Leaflet, we might together make the transfer of Trizeuxis pygmaea to Cuekettia, which you pointed out and with which I am in aggeement. There are a number of new records, etc. that have come in since my last paner, so all together it would be worthy of a second one.

I am also wondering if you would be willing to helo out Charles and me by putting provisional names on the Mutis plates of Stelis, Lepanthes end Pleurothallis drawings. As you know, we are plugging away on these plates and I would like to get the entire set of 285 roughly determined so that Charles could go to Madrid perhans this Sneing and anyway before Franco falls: Mr. Franco will put up the money for the trip. Charles must see the originals with colour, etc. to be sure in many cases. Now, if you'd be willing to devote a little of your free time to this, I'd send you the plates. In return, I can promise you for your own herbarium a complete set of the colour plates of all 285 orchids when the volumes are published.

We have negative photostats of the orchids in several of the Linnean volumes which I am putting away for you when you come down. These were done when we released several of the volumes to Mrs. Ames, and we are binding 耳p the positives for our library, but the negs. are also just as useful.

I am making a slight change in your Erythrodes description, as Smith and I discovered a little apicule on the lip which you did not mention in the description. I am asking Vienna to loan us the type material in Aganisia, as I am trying to do this little genus (incl. Acacallis) and it seems to me that A. coerule must be called A. fimbriata, if, as I suspect, they are the same.

Terrestrial herbs. Roots arising from base of stem or from intemodes of rhizome. Stams orect or ascending, loaly. Laaves short-petiolate, ovate or lanceolato, ususlly roticulato-voinod. Inflorescence a loosely or densely many-flowored spike. Flowers usually small, subsossilo. Bracts small. Sepals free, orect or spreading, nearly equal. Petals adnate to dorsal sopal to form a galea. Lip slightly adnate to column, entire or lobed, somotimes with a saccate spur; spur usually with four or more calluses basally within. Column short or very short, wingless. Pollinia sectile or granular. Capsule ellipsoid or ovoid, orect.

Erythrodes: from the Greek for "appearing red", in reforence to the flowercolour of some species.

Lip 3 -lobed, oblong in outline, constricted above, 3.5 mm . long; terminal lobe clawed, transverse, broader than long, lunate, papillose, spur 2 mm . long, much shorter than ovary. Capsule elongato ovoid, 6-angled, pilose, 8 mra . long, 3 mm . in diameter.
