Sir,



The last letter with reference to the laboratory is your Gardens 769/14 dated 16th. August 1915, which was a reply to a letter of mine apparently lost which asked for the building of the Field Assistants' quarters also. A reference to the quarters will be found in File 4851/14.

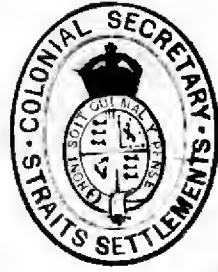
