(Degree, Diploma, and Certificate)

Robeson Community College maintains an "Open Door" policy for all applicants that are high school graduates or hold a high school equivalency certificate (GED) which satisfies North Carolina standards. The College serves all students regardless of race, color, creed, sex, disability, or national origin. All applicants may be admitted to the different curricula based upon individual preparation and readiness.

Admissions Procedures

To enroll in a credit program to earn an associate degree, a diploma or certificate, follow these Admissions procedures:

- Request an application. Information concerning completion/graduation rates for students who have enrolled at Robeson Community College on a full-time basis are available in the Office of Admissions (Fred G. Williams, Jr. Student Center, Room 1301).
- Return the completed application to the Admissions Office.
- Request all high school and college transcripts be mailed to the Admissions Office.
- 4. Complete placement testing and admissions interview.
 - Note: The test requirements may be waived for those who have prior college credits or acceptable SAT/ACT scores. However, this does not apply to Respiratory Care and Associate Degree Nursing curriculums. They must complete the ACT ASSET or ACT COMPASS.
 - Note: Allied Health programs and Cosmetology have additional admissions requirements. The requirements may be obtained from the Admissions Office.

When these procedures are completed, the Admissions Office will notify the student of his/her enrollment status.

Special Credit Admissions

A special credit student is one who is enrolled in curriculum credit courses but is not planning to earn a degree, diploma, or certificate. To matriculate as a special credit student, the student need only to file an application. Special credit students will be allowed to earn a maximum of twelve (12) credit hours. To continue beyond special credit status, the student must meet all admissions requirements before declaring an educational objective. After a special credit student selects a major, applicable credits earned as a special credit student will be applied toward his/her course requirements for graduation. Special credit students are not eligible to receive financial aid or Veterans benefits. Exceptions to the twelve credit hour maximum are outlined in the Student Handbook.

Auditing Students

Students who wish to audit a course should follow the same registration procedures as Special Credit Students. Audited courses carry no credit hours and earn no quality points. The tuition rate for auditing a course is the same as that charged for credit enrollment.

A student must declare his "auditing" status in writing to the Office of the Registrar by the last day of the drop/add period.

Financial Aid

Through the Robeson Community College Financial Aid Program, assistance is provided to qualified students to help with the costs of attending college. Financial Aid is available to qualified applicants in the form of scholarships, grants, work-study and loans. Students are also eligible to receive assistance through Veterans Benefits and Vocational Rehabilitation. To apply for financial aid, students must complete the Free Application for Federal Financial Aid. The application should be submitted by no later than December 1, 2003 for Spring Semester. Malpractice Insurance

Allied Health programs, Cosmetology and Early Childhood-COE students must purchase malpractice insurance. Cost: approximately \$15.00 for one year.

Laboratory Fee

A \$10.00 lab fee is charged for each physical or biological science course with a laboratory component. All students are charged a \$16.00 technology fee.

Refund Policy

Statewide Refund Policy for all North Carolina Community Colleges:

- A student who officially withdraws from the College prior to the first day of the College academic term will be eligible for a 100 percent tuition refund if requested (Students enrolled in fourteen or more hours after the withdrawal are not eligible for a refund).
- A 75 percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from the class(es) prior to or on the official 10 percent point of the term.
- Refund request forms are available in the Registrar's Office. Students enrolled in fourteen or more hours after the withdrawal are not eligible for a refund.
- If you are entitled to a refund, you must apply for the refund at the Records and Registration Office at the time of the withdrawal.
- Additional fees are nonrefundable. Example: lab fees, technology fee, student activity fee, etc.

Residency Policy

North Carolina law (G.S. 116-143.1) requires that "a legal resident must have maintained his domicile in North Carolina for at least the twelve months immediately prior to his classification as a resident for tuition purposes." For regulations and services, please refer to College catalog.
