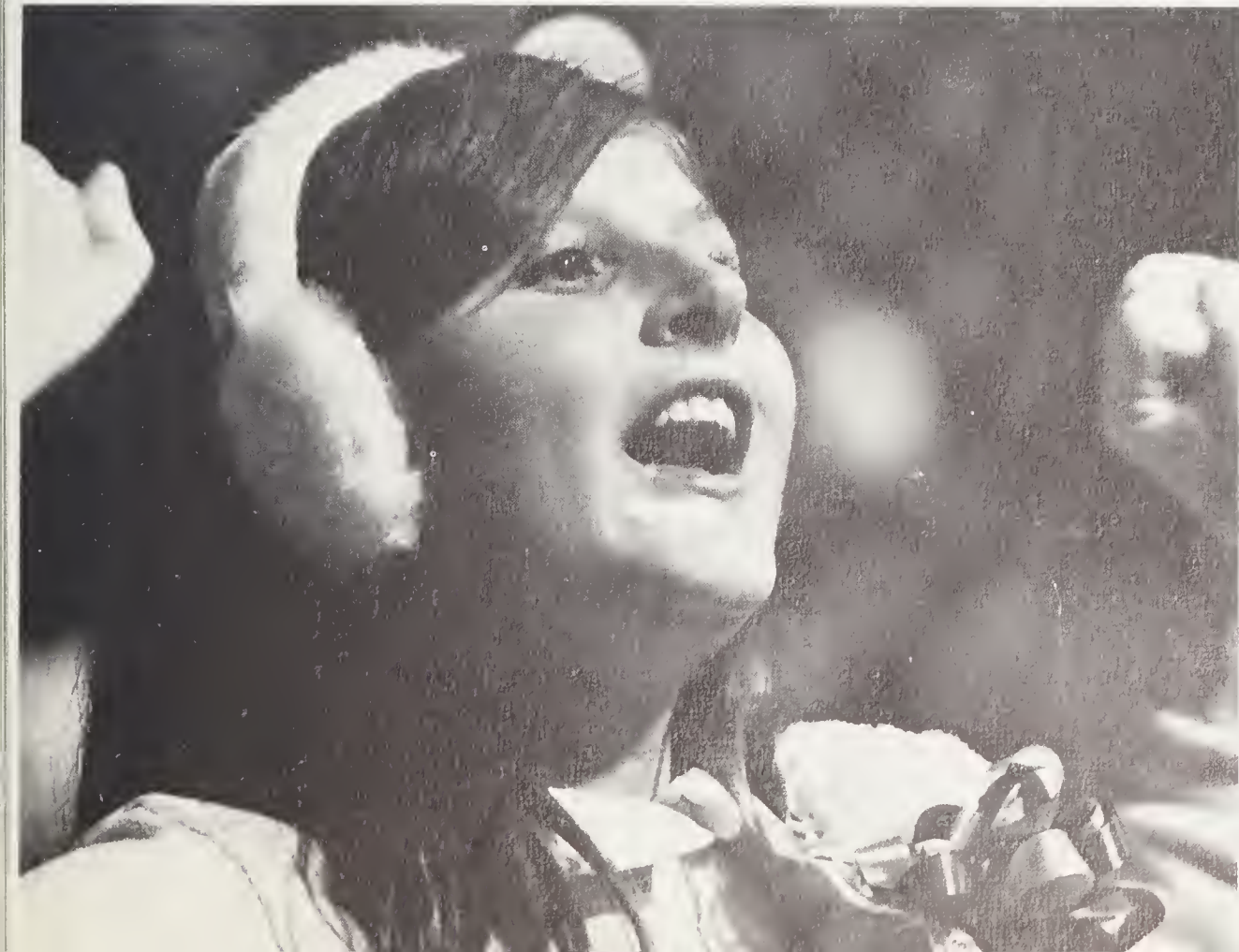




# and a 13-11 victory over Burlington

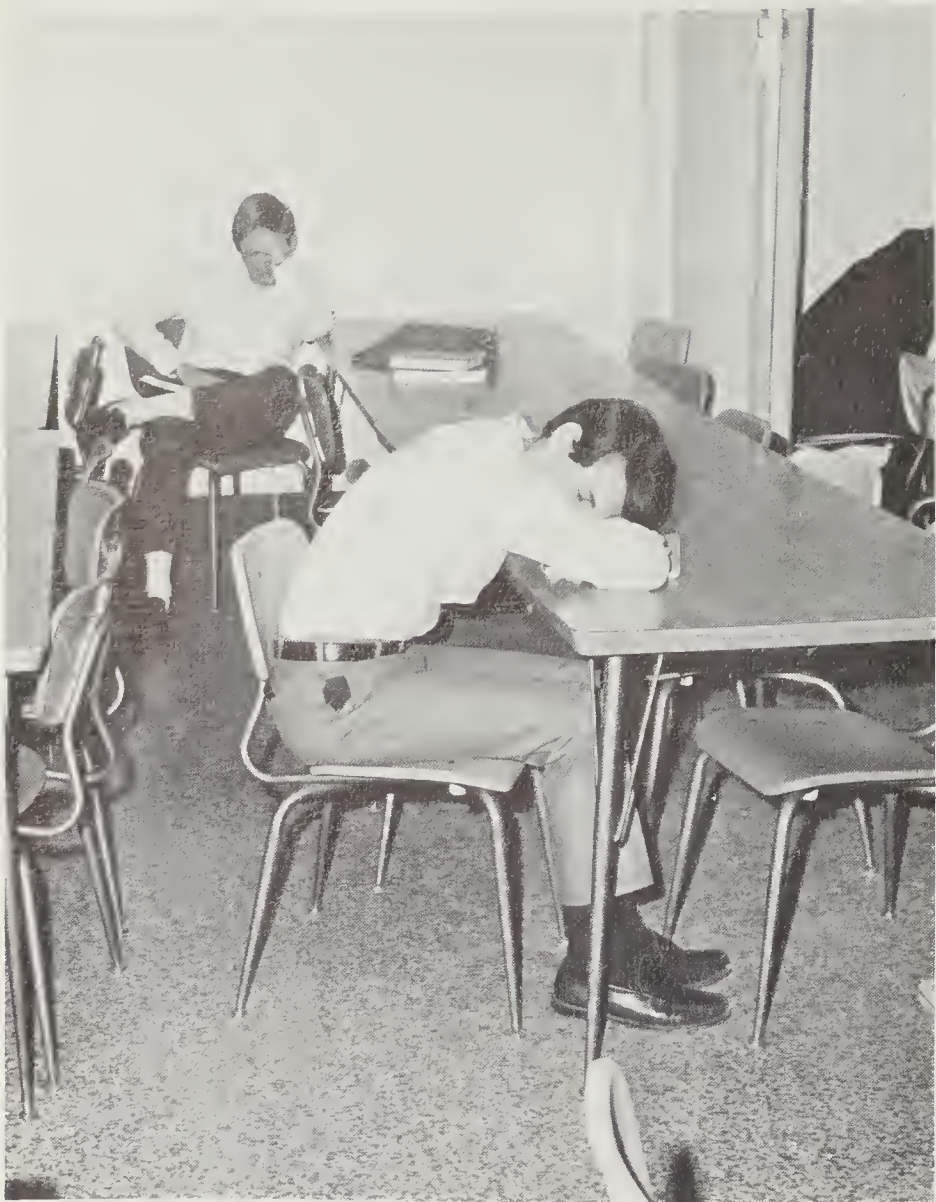


## We can't take our eyes off you — Angela Carol Butner!

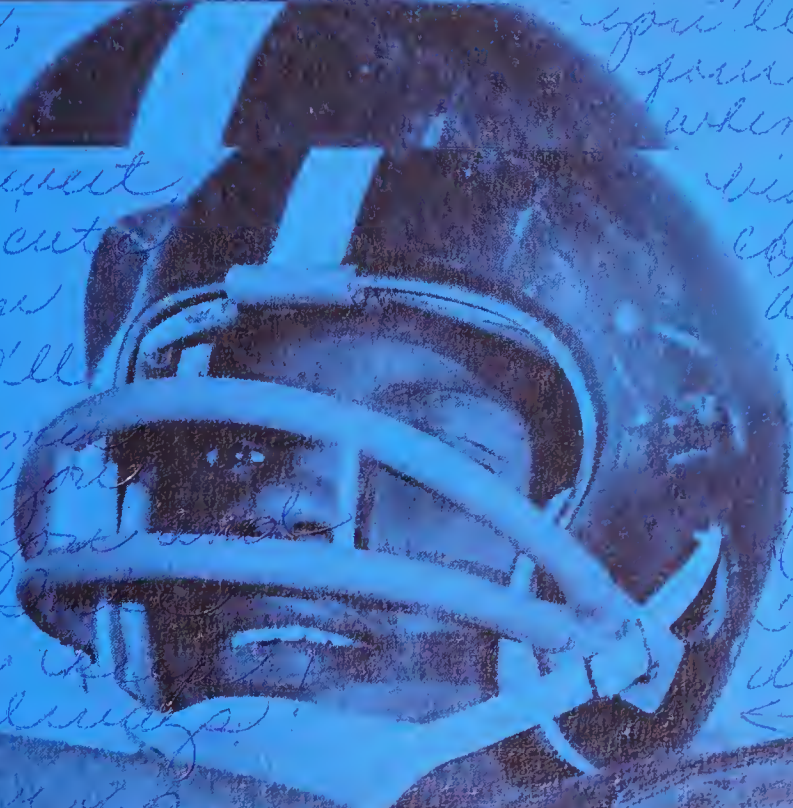
# SPORTS

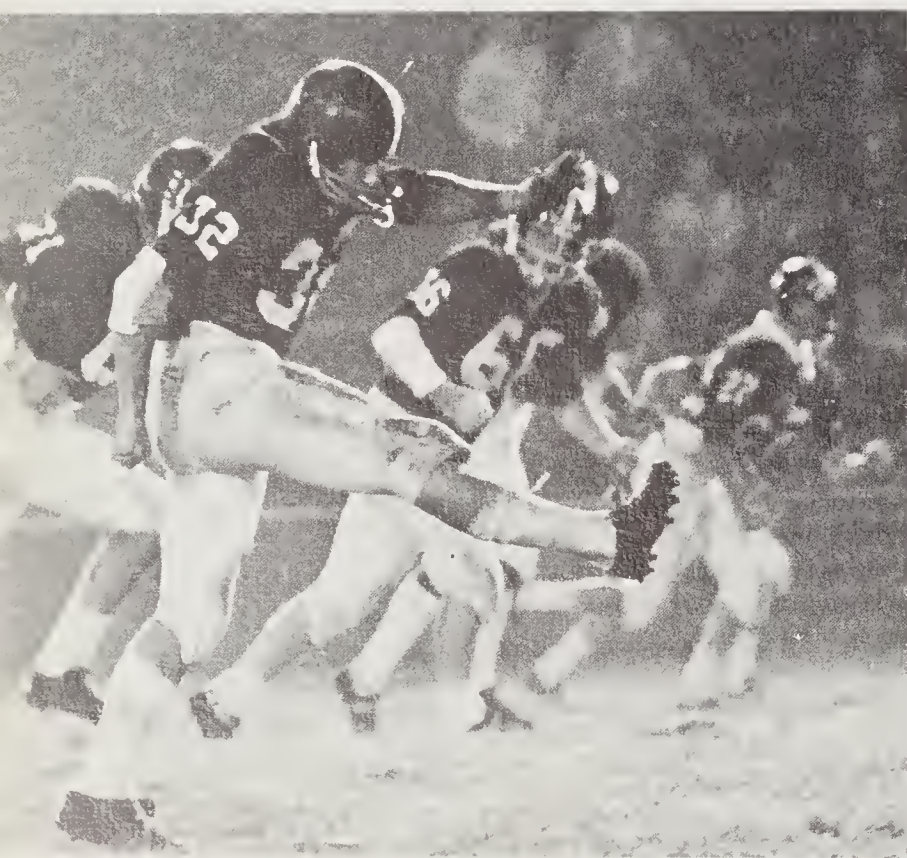
Indeed they are a great boost to the morale of our athletes. The group sold "booster badges" and distributed "beat tags" to all Viking supporters.

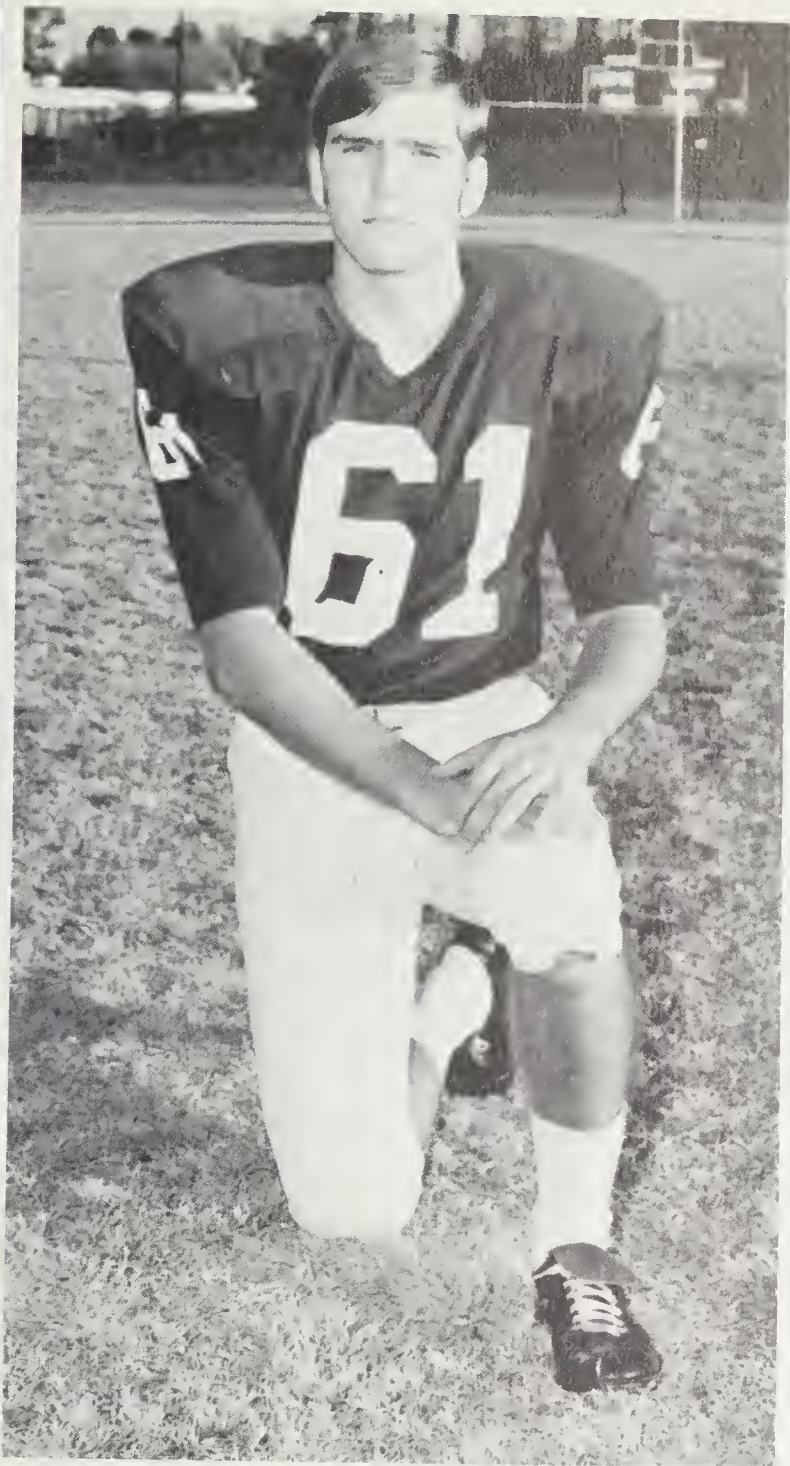

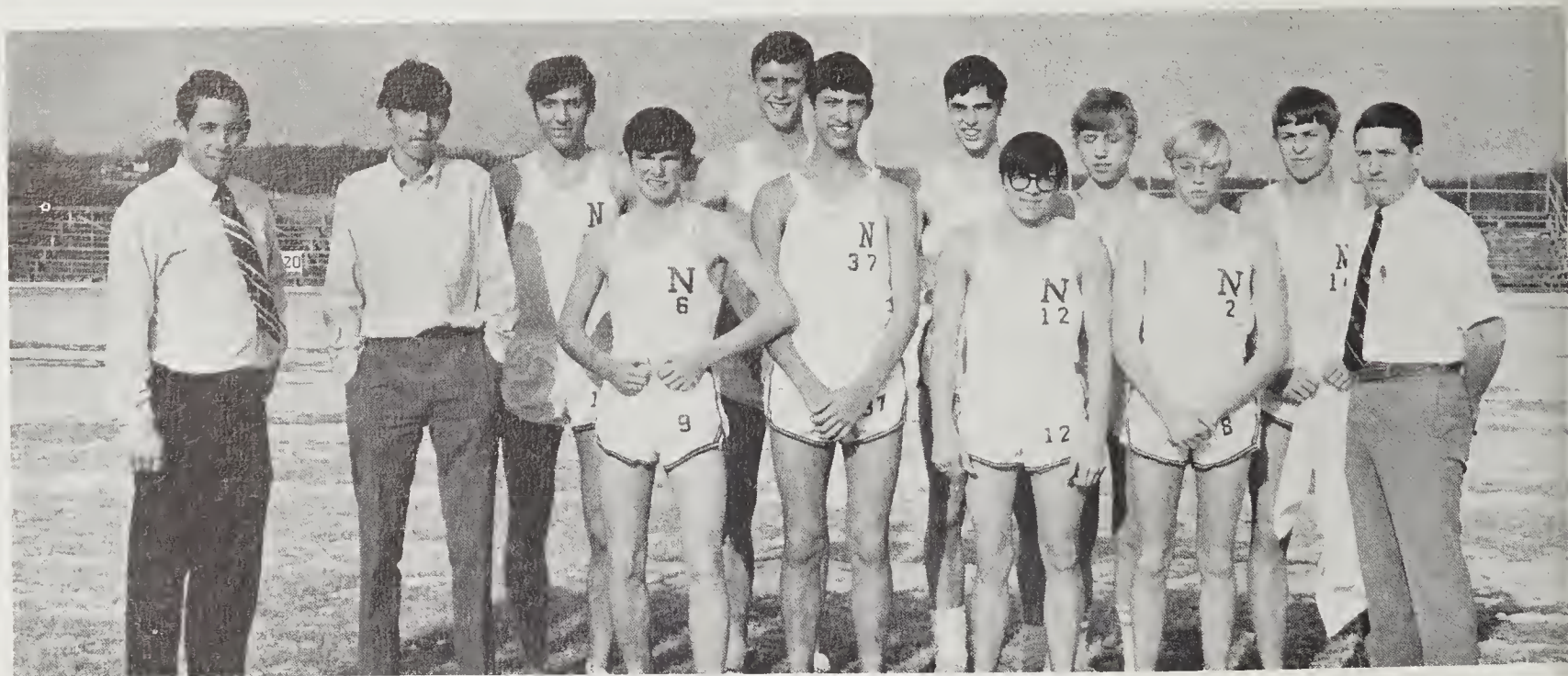

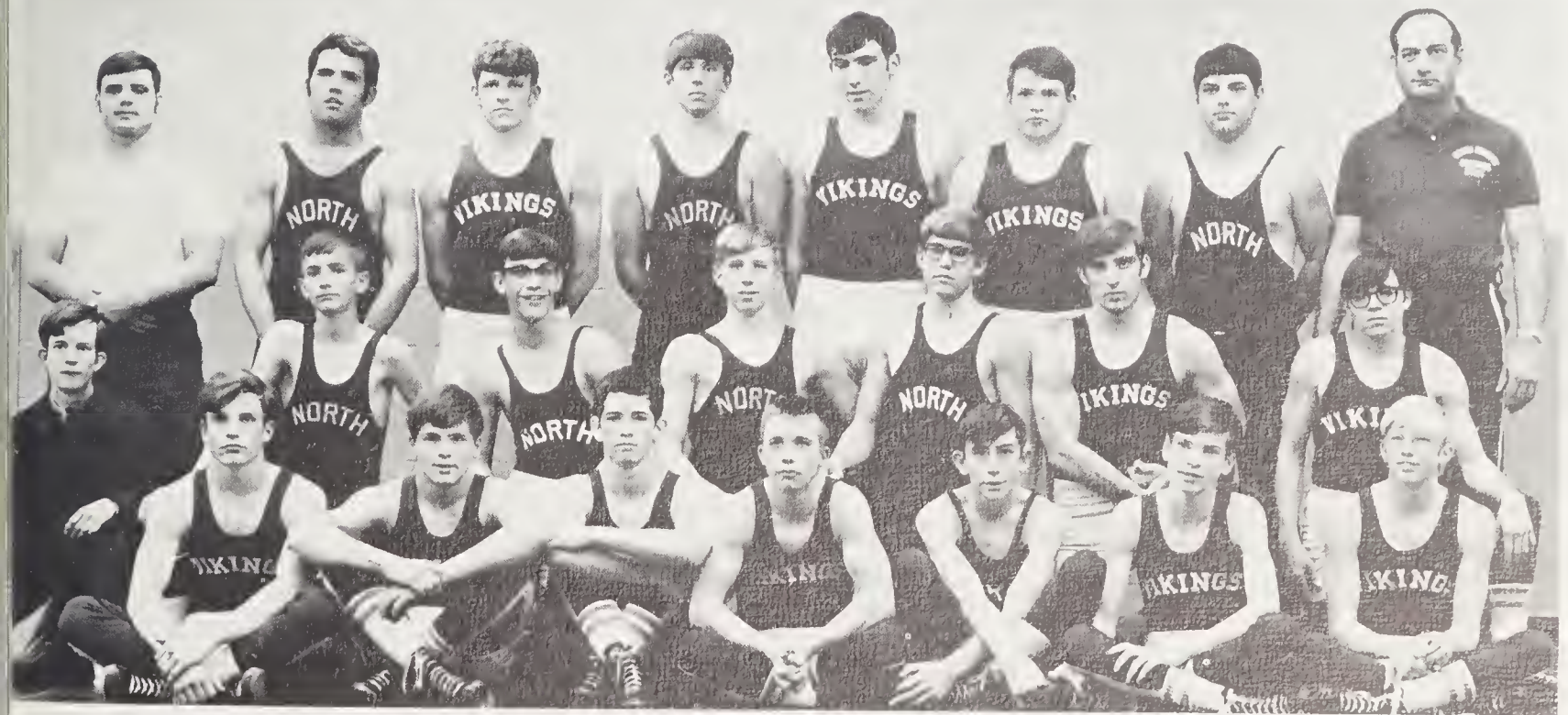
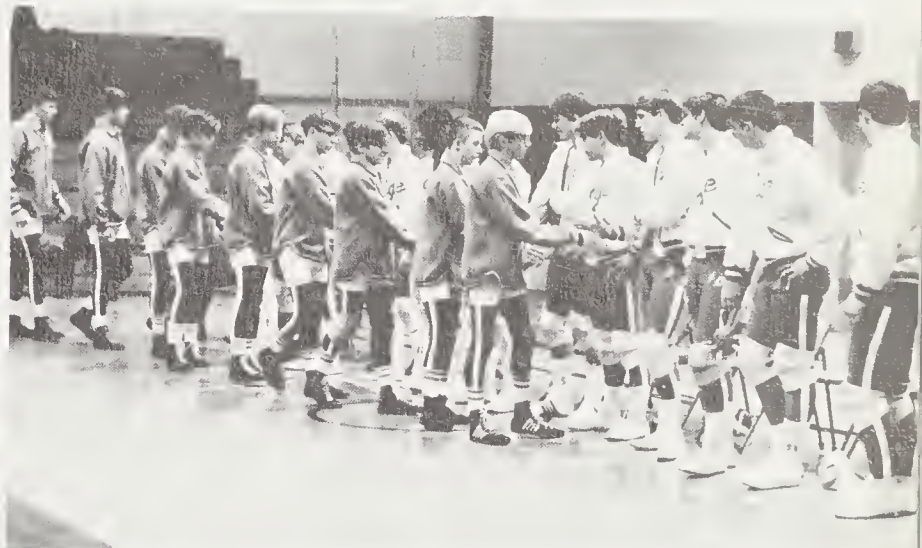




# Wrestlers show strength in fierce competition

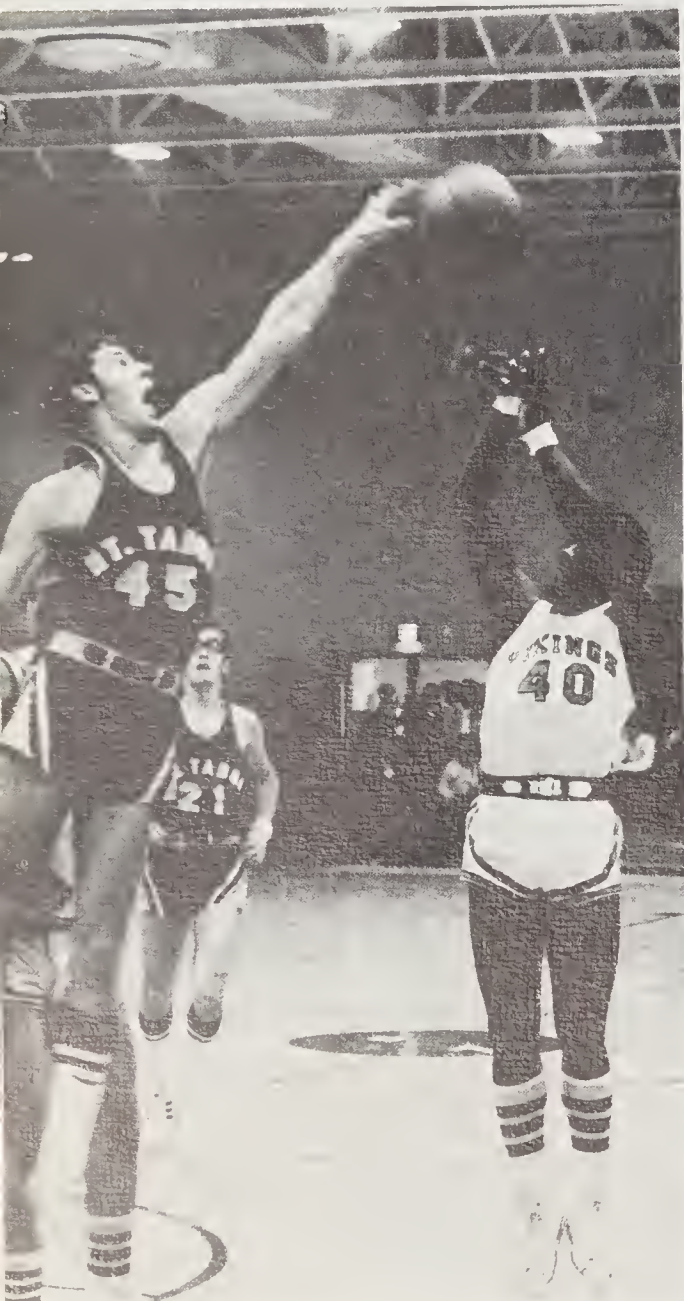

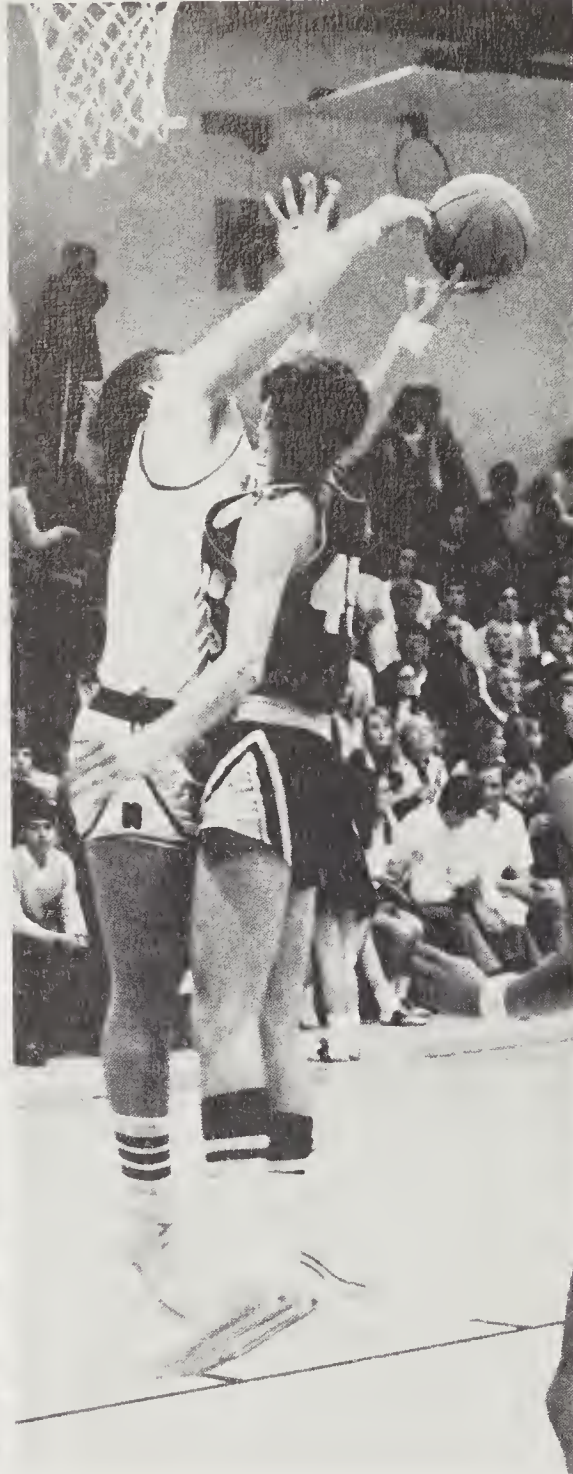
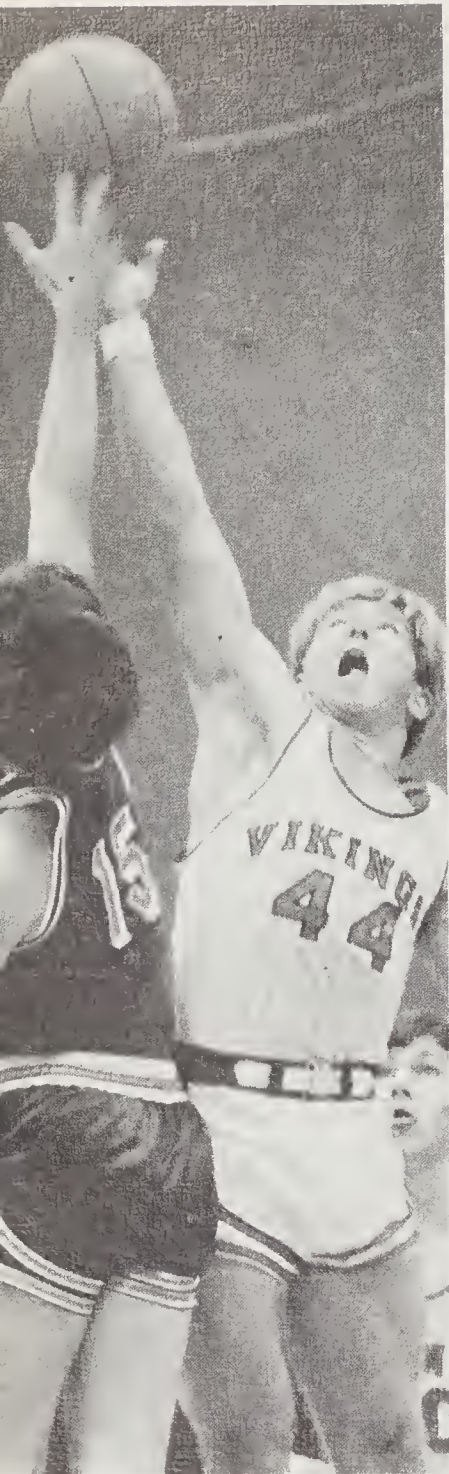
## Varsity cagers begin season with 4 wins

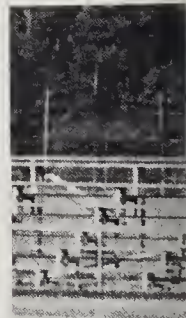

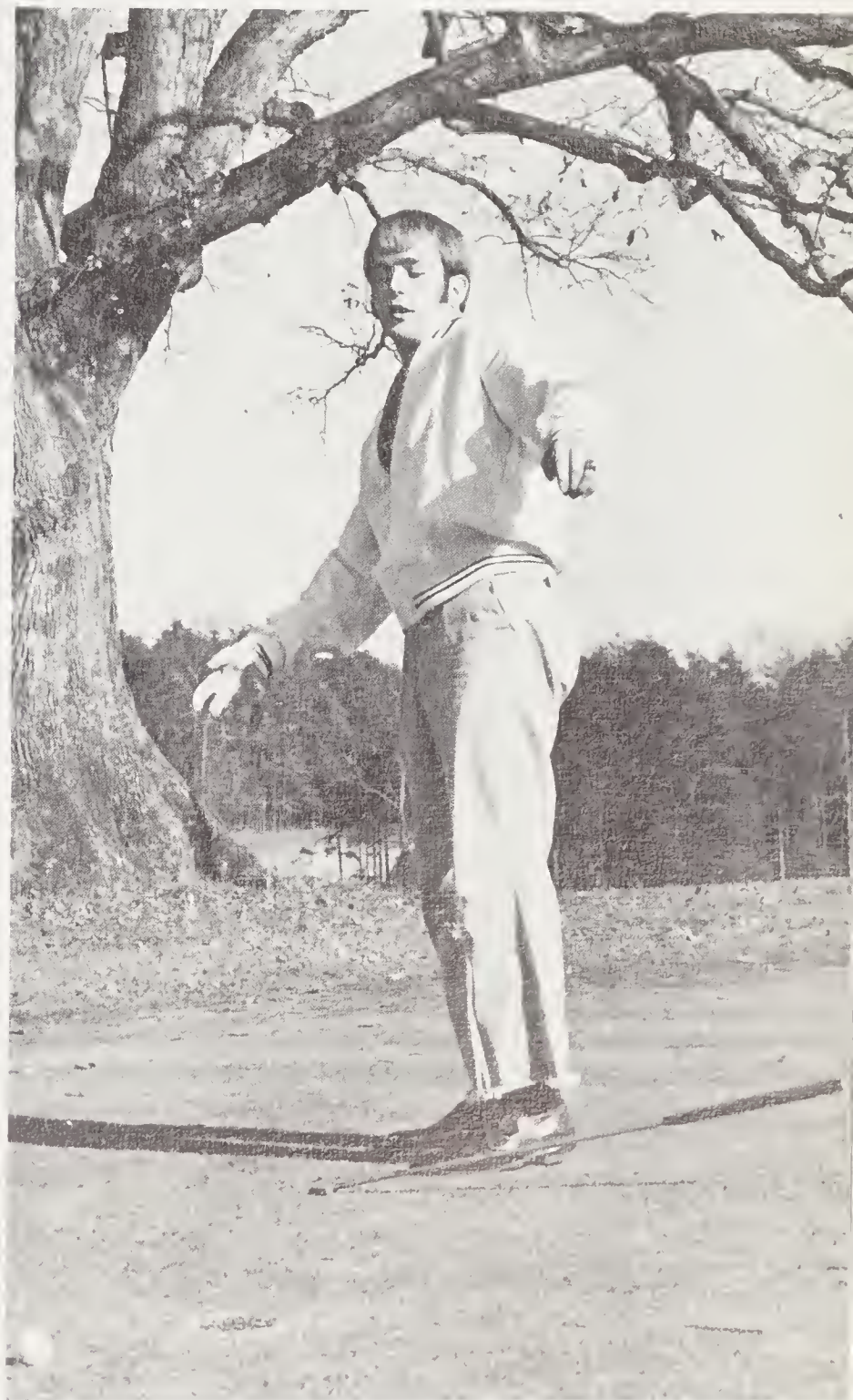
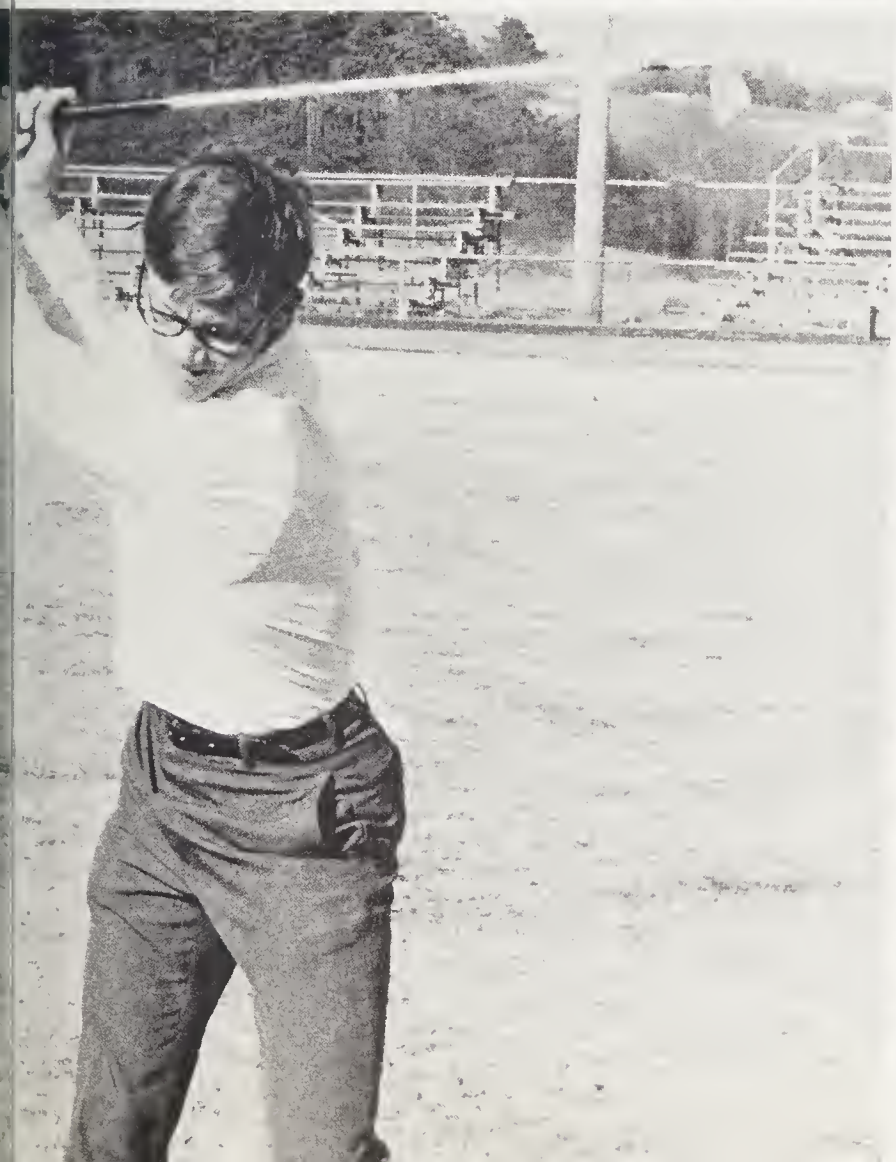




# Rate high in State Tournament

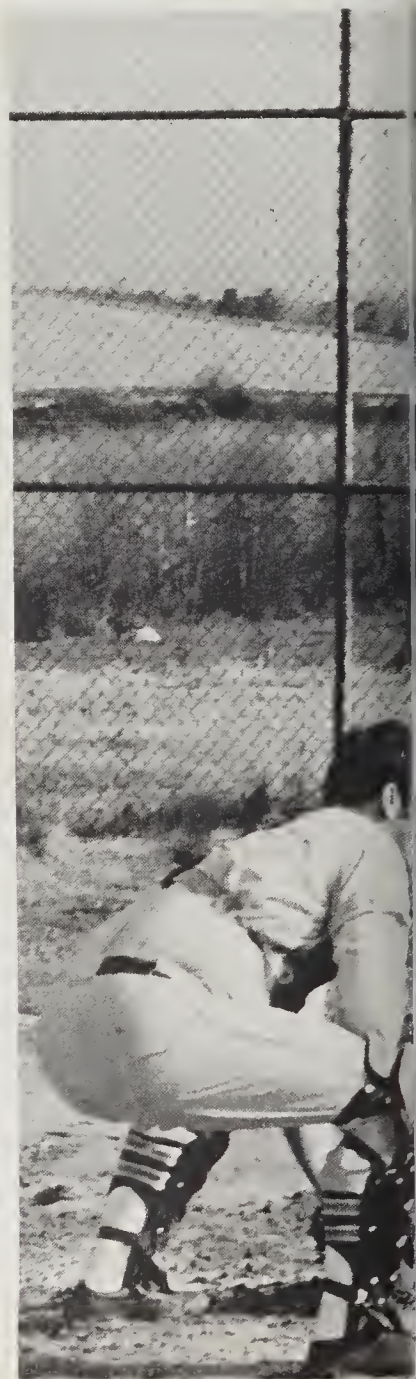
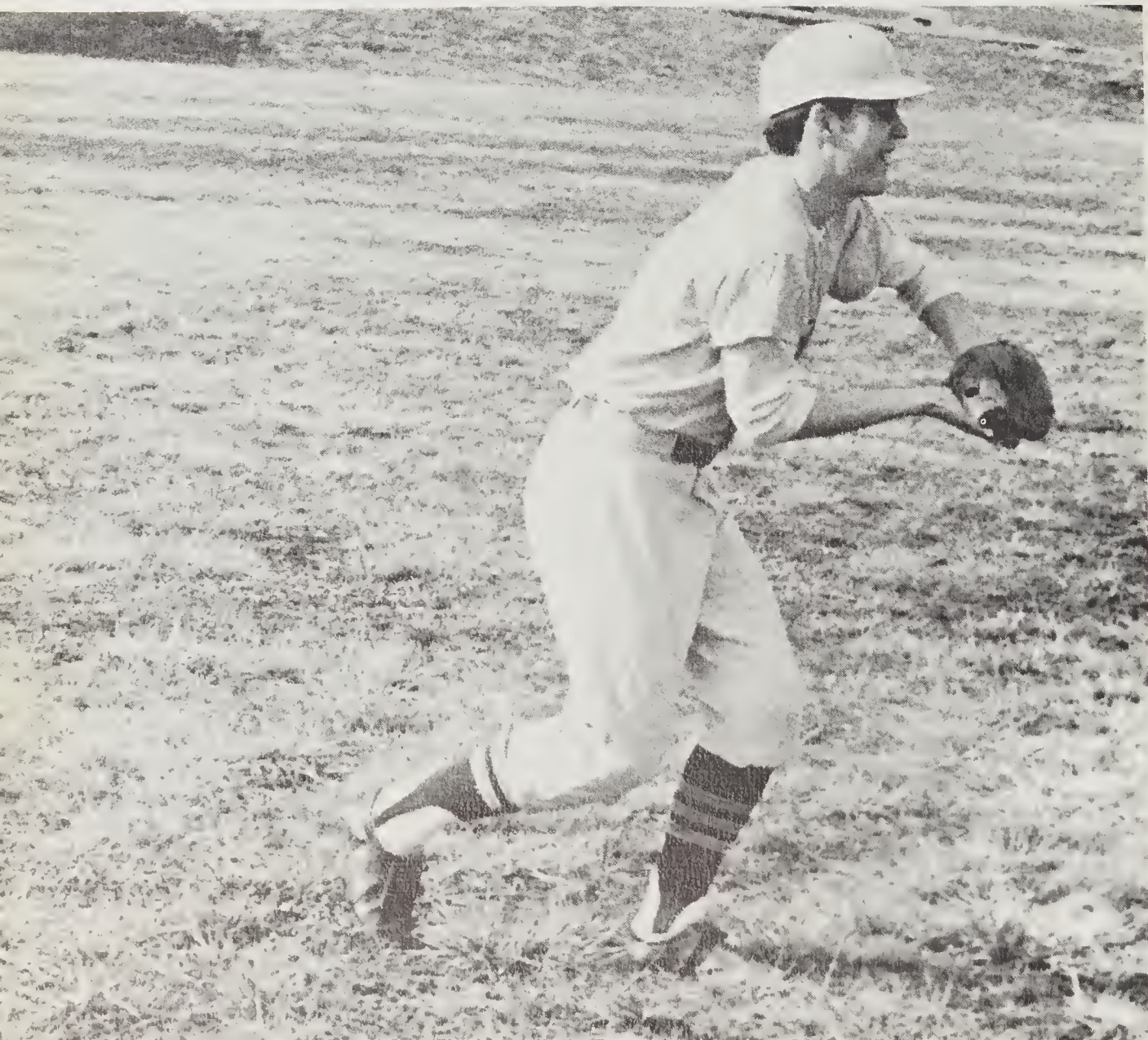
## Coach Barringer directs baseball team to admirable record

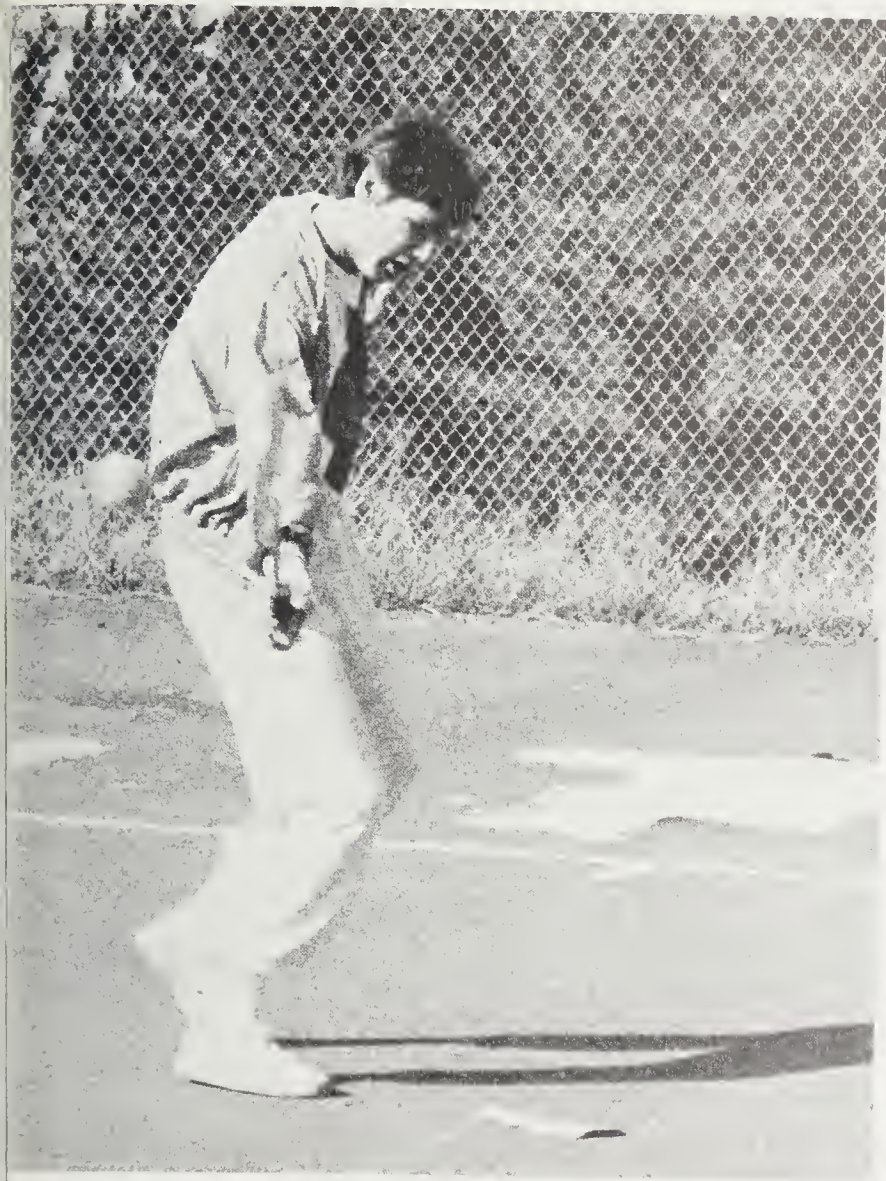

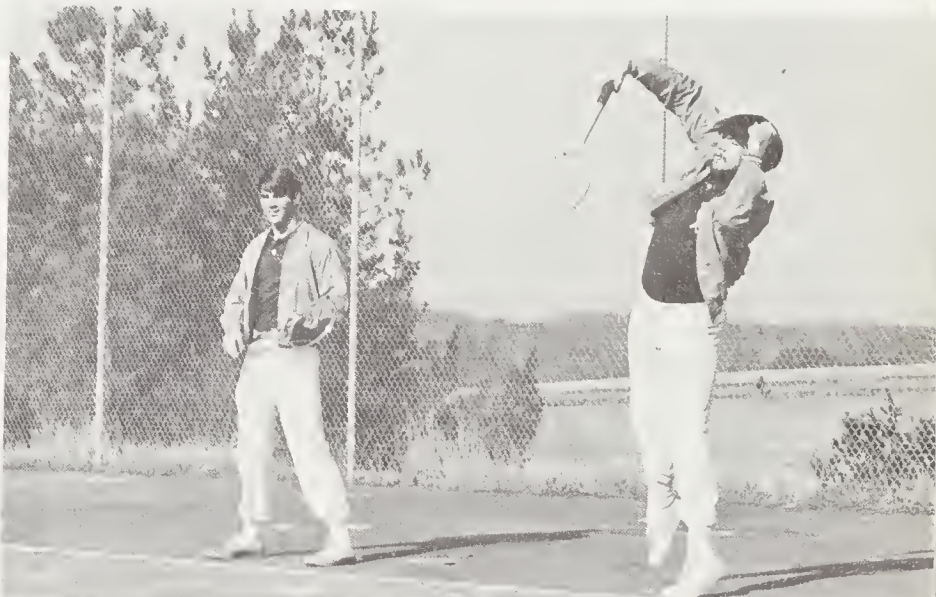

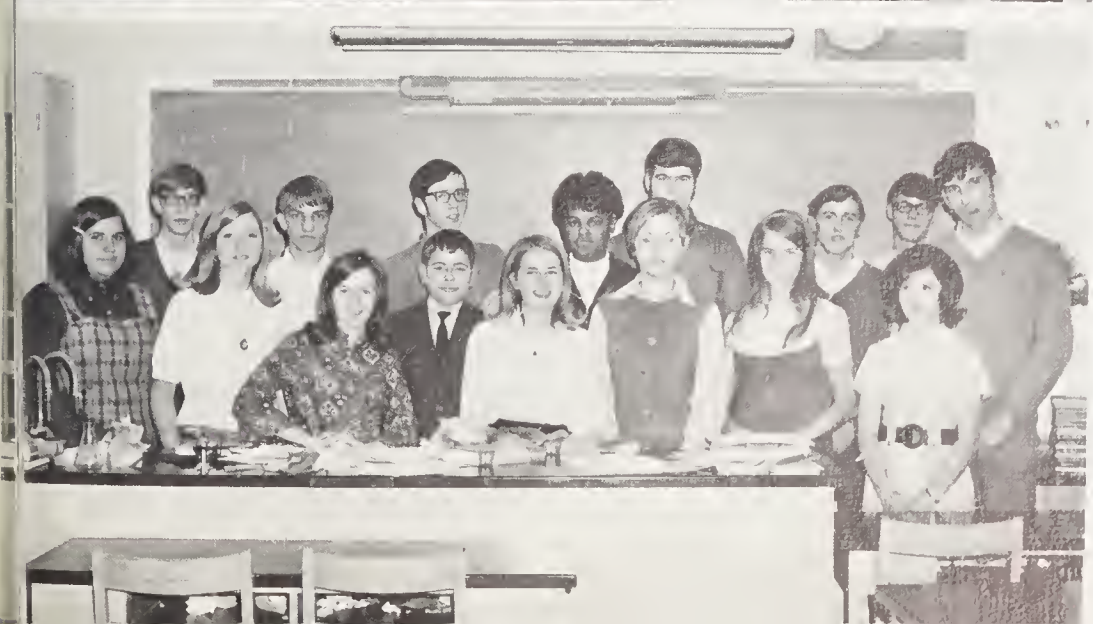

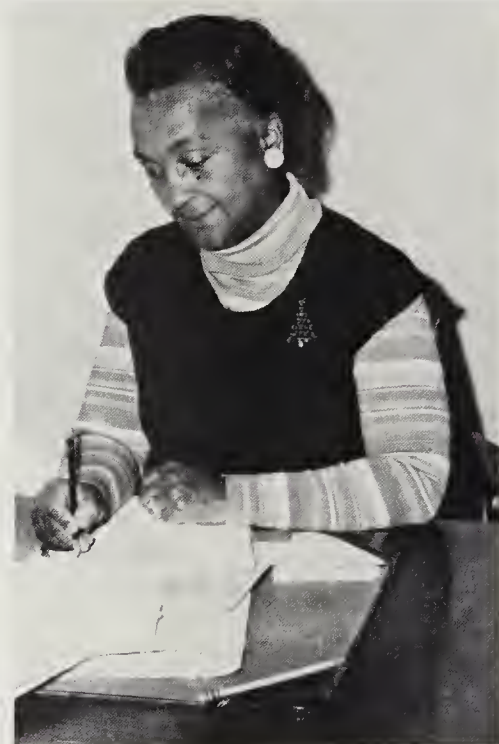
technical advice and administrates school business and finances. Two assistant principals are responsible for the specific details of school bus transportation, textbook distribution, and absentees.
