Copy of the letter written to Inverell Shire and the Development Council re Trees

"At the meeting of the Board of Directors held last week I have been asked to write to your Council with regards the request of Delungra District Development Council and the removal of six of the trees in the main street of Delungra.

We would like to lodge our strong disagreement with this decision and request that you give a great deal of consideration for the following reasons.

- 1. The Club is a continuing business of the District and employees 5 staff and would like to continue trading for the residents of Delungra and district.
- 2. The Club has been caring for the trees since their planting last year and are looking forward to the shade they will provide for our patrons whilst utilising all business's in the main street.
- 3. We are also looking forward to the possibility of angle parking in front of the club therefore gaining closer and expanded access to our facilities for many of our patrons who are elderly.
- 4. We are aware of the problems of trucks parking in the main street for some of our residents and the problems that can be left behind by some of these vehicles. We do not appreciate having to clean some-one else's problems when we find visiting truck driver's mainly do not utilise our business.
- We do not believe enough consideration has been given to ALL residents of Delungra and district. We had charts of your great beautification plan on display at our Local Post Office for some weeks and ALL residents were notified of where all trees were to be planted and we feel that ALL residents should be given the same opportunity as to whether or not the trees stay and improve our town.
- 6. We ask that Council will exceed to our request to leave the trees as planted and at the minimum decision will leave the trees in front of the Clubs facilities and Greens to provide shade for all drivers in the main street. We know that the Club that is a continuing business and should not be penalised (loss of shade and extra parking) for the possible effect it may have on a new business.

A copy of this letter has been forwarded to Mr Barry Johnson, Inverell Shire Council we look forward to the next meeting when we can deliver our proposals of all residents having knowledge on this decision.

Delungra District Development Council

The next monthly meeting of the Development Council will be held on Tuesday 16th April 2002, at 7.30 p.m. at the Delungra Bowling Club. This was delayed a week so that Shire representation could be made at the meeting and all residents notified of a request made by a new business to the Development Council that 6 (six) of the trees in the main Street be removed. These are four of the trees on the northern side between McIntyre Street and Gunnee Street and two of the trees in front of the Bowling This has been proposed to allow Truck drivers and Semi trailers to park in this area. Club and Green. Please come along to this meeting and voice your opinion and we need to know the effect it will have on residents in these areas and any effect it will have on the town as there is already designated areas for these vehicles set aside in the beautification program set down and accepted by the Development council after being shown on display to all residents from the Post Office. All interested residents very welcome.

An invitation was extended to Mr Ken Gray of Smoochies and Mr C Dick and any other interested parties to have written notes in this NEWSLINK but to date no replies forthcoming only

from the Bowling Club (see bowling Section).

An invitation was also given to all by Mr Peter Lloyd to attend the next Shire Council public forum to address Council on this matter but only two residents Terry and Margaret McGrath were interested and accepted his invitation and attended and spoke to Inverell Shire Council.
