Footcare dates for Delungra are June 25 July 23 and August 27 Easy ways to ease your discomfort of cold and flu symptons.

- (1) Eucalyptus or Tea Tree Oil can relieve congestion when you add a few drops to a basin of boiling water and inhale the steam.
- (2) When you have a cough, mix one tablespoon Slippery Elm Powder, with one cup boiling water and 1/4 cup honey. Take 1 teaspoon of this mixture every 2 -3 hours.
- (3) Apply lip balm to cracked lips and smear a little olive oil around nostrils.
- (4) Eat light fresh foods fruit and vegies and soups. Add a little cayenne pepper to your soups as it helps to loosen mucus and may prevent excessive congestion.
- (5) When resting in bed, make sure your room is well ventilated and at a comfortable temperature.

DELUNGRA TO INVERELL BUS

Last month was the last time that Di Brown's bus to Inverell under the Delungra Neighbour program operated. Thank you Di for the wonderful service that you have provided. Due to the decrease in patronage of this bus it has become an unfinancial proposition to keep it going. That's the bad news; the good news is that there will be a bus going through Delungra every age pension day commencing 4th July. This bus is funded by Inverell Community Transport and starts in Warialda at 9am going door to door picking up anyone who has booked with Delungra and Warialda HACC coordinator Virginia Boland. The bus will then proceed to Delungra where again it will go door to door picking up those that have booked. The bus will arrive in Inverell approximately 10.15am. It will then depart Inverell at 1.15pm for the return journey. This bus is provided for older people and people with disabilities but if space permits and it usually does anyone can use this service but I must emphasis that bookings are essential.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Lorraine Pollock has been our cook for sometime but now she has decided to move on to greener pastures. Thank you Lorraine for your time and effort in this service and we wish you well in your new position.

Denise from the Delungra Hotel will now provide meals. Denise has agreed to provide meals five days a week which will be great for our recipients, this means that a hot meal will be delivered Monday to Friday each week. Thank you Denise.

LUNCH CLUB

Due to Lorraine's resignation we have to make other arrangements for this to continue. At our Delungra Neighbour Aid Advisory Committee Special Meeting on Thursday 27th June. It was proposed to move Lunch Club to the Bowling Club where a Bingo morning will be held **every** Wednesday starting 10.30am; morning tea will be from 10am. The club is warm in winter and air conditioned in summer plus access is more convenient.

Worth Knowing! Your mobile phone has a unique serial number. To determine//check this serial number, key in the following on your phone: star-hash-zero-six-hash (ie.*#06#). A 15 digit number will appear on the screen. This serial number is unique to your handset. Take a note of this number and record it somewhere safe.

Should your phone be stolen or lost, you should phone your Service Provider (Telstra, Optus, Vodafone etc) and give then this serial number. They are then able to block your handset and even if ,say, a thief changes the Sim card, your phone would be totally useless.

You may not get your phone back, but al least you know that if someone found or stole it, they can't use is (at your expense) or on-sell it either.

You might tell this to as many people as you know with Mobile phones. If everybody did this, then there would be no profit to be made in stolen Mobile phones. It makes you wonder why this is not in your Owner instructions or more widely promoted.
