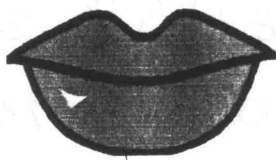

Once again we paid for meals for some that did not come but our finances came to quite a substantial amount so we are very pleased with our day.

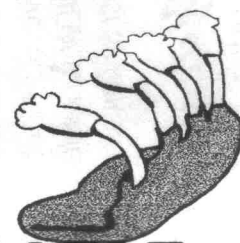

FARMING TALK BY STUART DICK - DELUNGRA PRODUCE

What a difference rain makes.....

The markets for all livestock have strengthened –

Steers 300 – 400 kg - \$2.00 per kg

Cows 400 – 500 kg - \$1.48 per kg

Bulls 600+ - \$1.89 per kg

But a lot of us had to sell a large number of stock through the drought and can't take advantage of these better prices. The sheep and lamb markets continued to hold strong with heavy lambs carrying good skins nudged \$120.

The turn around in the season brings me to remind owners of stock that putting hungry or poorstock – sheep or cattle on lush pastures ie. River flats, pasture improved country, legume enriched pastures (Lucerne), you need to inject animals with 5 in 1 vaccine 4 – 6 weeks apart as to prevent pulpy kidney and grass tetani. A lot of animals wrongly diagnosed that do die under these circumstances are often said to have suffered bloat.

The district has been alive with the roar of tractors. Most of us have now completed our oats paddocks for winter even though grazer oats soared to \$1020 per ton. We are now turning our attentions to preparing paddock for wheat and barley. Interesting this week feed barley was quoted at \$170 per ton, feed wheat \$133 per ton ex Brisbane.

With Winter approaching all you bird and poultry lovers (like myself), it's time to drench and get your stock worm free for those cold mornings ahead.

Last Winter many budgies, canaries, finches all 'fell off their perches' so don't delay. Paint your chook legs and perches with ½ diesel sump oil/1/2 diesel to prevent scales and mite on feet and legs, check under wings for mites and/or lice

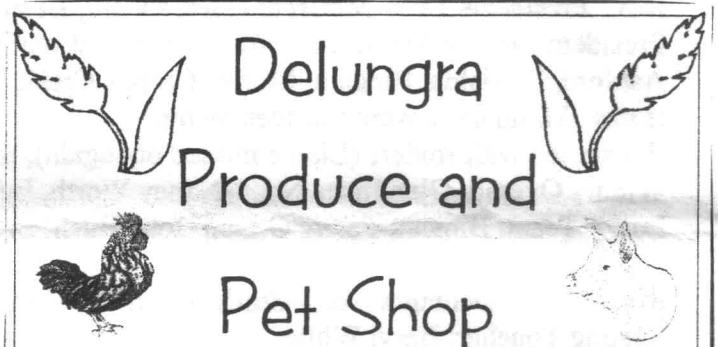
