YO-YO DIETING AND THE RISK OF GALLSTONES

Is your weight always going up and down? If so, you may want to be aware of the link between so – called yo-yo dieting and gallstones. A recent study shows substantial but temporary weight loss (in other words, crash-dieting) increases the risk of gallstones and boosts the need for surgery by up to 70%. Women with a moderate fluctuation in weight had a 31% greater risk but women with severe fluctuations in their weight had a 68% greater risk. In light of this it would seem that the slow-but-steady weight loss advice is best aiming then to keep weight constant. Have a good month




