





## **CRIME REPORT**

Each month I hope to bring to you information on what's been happening in and around Delungra. By spreading this information, you may be able to assist to solve some of these crimes.

I would like to begin this months report by congratulating everyone for their efforts in relation to the wearing of seat belts. Last month I reported that this issue was causing concern however it is pleasing to report that minimal problems have been detected. The wearing of seat belts will be monitored for the next couple of months, however I encourage you all to click clack front and back.

The matter of the missing water from the disused service station in Inverell Street has been finalised. I can only hope that this matter does not need re-investigation in the future.

Roaming dogs has resulted in numerous complaints over the past month. Some complaints have been quite serious and have involved roaming dogs attacking a group of horses in the vicinity of Gleno/Wallangra Street. The dog involved in this attack has been described as a black dog about the size of a collie. The dog was wearing a red collar. The attack resulted in one horse becoming lame and unavailable for up coming camp drafts and other riding events. Dogs caught attacking other animals will be destroyed. Another complaint saw a dog bail up a group of school children in the laneway behind Burnett Street. This is viewed very seriously and dogs of this nature can be declared as dangerous dogs with orders for destruction being made by the Courts. Roaming dogs are becoming a concern and the law states that a dog must be on a lead when being walked. I have no problems with people walking their dogs which are not on a lead, providing the dog owner or person in control of the animal is with it at all times. I do have a problem with dogs that just wander freely and cause fear or disruptions to other local residents. The Inverell Ordinance Officer and Police will attempt to address this issue, so I encourage you to make sure your premises are secure to prevent your dogs from escaping (if you own any). Any dogs found wandering at large will be impounded by either police or local Ordinance during random patrols. If you happen to own a dog which gets impounded, it could become an expensive exercise in relation to fee's and/or fines. Please address this issue before your dogs get impounded.

On a crime front I can report on the following:

On the 24<sup>th</sup> July 2004, following a domestic disturbance in Burnett Street Delungra, a 40 year old Inverell man has been charged with Negligent Driving and Burnout offences. This person will appear at the Inverell Local Court later this month to answer these charges.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2004, following a complaint received by the RSPCA office in Sydney, Police were required to attend a residence in Burnett Street Delungra to view the current state of some dogs who resided at those premises. Following preliminary investigations and examination of the dogs in question, the dogs were found to be malnourished and in need or care and treatment. The owner of the dogs agreed to voluntarily surrender the animals to Police. The dogs were conveyed to the Inverell

Pound with the intentions of finding the animals new homes. Due to the age of the dogs owner and because the owner agreed to voluntarily surrender the animals, no legal action was instigated by the RSPCA against the dogs owner.

Sometime between the  $8^{th} - 21^{st}$  August 2004 a shed at the rear of a premises in Dumboy Street Delungra was broken into. The shed was padlocked however the person responsible gained entry to the shed by manipulating the padlock. From inside the shed a quantity of property was stolen, some of which is listed below;

Husqvarna 268 chainsaw, 9 inch wolf brand angle grinder, sidchrome spanners, 4 x 5 litre plastic bottles of Catrol motor oil, a Makita buffer, a Ryobi blower vac, set of taps and dies.

The same premise was subjected to prowler activity a couple of nights prior to the 8<sup>th</sup> August which could be linked to this theft.

About 9.15am on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> August 2004, a house in Reedy Street Delungra suffered fire damage following a house fire. In relation to this house fire I praise the efforts of neighbours who woke the occupants of the premises to alert them of the fire. This incident should be viewed as a timely reminder to ensure that all houses are sufficiently equipped with fire safety devices (alarms etc). Thankfully no one was injured. The fire was extinguished by the Delungra Rural Bush Fire Brigade.

Between 8.30pm Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> August and 8.30am Monday 24<sup>th</sup> August 2004 a "Brumby" green king size swag was stolen from the rear yard of a premises in Railway Street Delungra. Two males were sighted around 2.00am Monday morning, walking in the vicinity with something in their possession. I can only hope that this 'borrowed' swag is returned before further action results.

On the 25<sup>th</sup> August an 86 year old Delungra man was caught driving a motor vehicle without a licence. His licence has been cancelled by the RTA for various reasons. Despite being cancelled the 86 year old continues to drive and will again find himself appearing in Court later this month.

Over recent weeks, predominantly of a Friday nights (early hours of Saturday mornings), some premises in the vicinity of the Local Hotel have had their rooves rocked with oranges. This sets a dangerous precedent and can cause structural damage. If anyone is caught performing these types of acts, they will be charged with the offence of "Throw Missile" and will have a date with the local magistrate to answer for their actions.

On a final note the Local Area Command Youth Liaison Officer, Fiona McCormack and I, attended Delungra Public School on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> August 2004 to address the students in issues relevant to 'bullying'. All students were very supportive of the program. Fiona, I and other Police will be returning in November to run a bicycle safety education program. We are hoping that Gum Flat Primary School can join us for this education program.

Before concluding I would like to take this opportunity to wish Brendan JONES the best of luck as he competes this month in the Grafton to Inverell Cycle race. Brendan

is a local and will not only be representing Inverell but Delungra in this prestigious event. I am sure that Brendan will ride the race of his life and regardless of the outcome will do himself, his family and community proud. Lets all get behind Brendan as he competes in one of the hardest road races known to man.

Mark the 10<sup>th</sup> October on your calendars. I will be holding a Police and friends charity golf day at the challenging, yet picturesque Delungra Golf Course. The event will be a three person ambrose event, commencing at 10.30am with a shot gun start. I would like to thank all the local Business Houses, whom so far have made donations towards this years event. Anyone still wishing to make a donation towards the golf day can contact me at the Delungra Police Station. Any donations (cash or prizes) will be greatly appreciated. The golf day could not proceed with community support and so far, donations received have been encouraging. All money raised will be put back into the Delungra community.

The family fun nights are gaining momentum. I am in the process of making inquiries into starting up a Delungra Blue Light. If successful, it will allow Discos to be run for the kids of our community. It will also provide increased insurance and allow our group to look further a field and run outer town activities (bus trips). I'll keep you posted on this one, at this stage only preliminary inquiries have been made.

Don't forget that I have a notice board at the front of the Delungra Police Station. Should you attend the station and I am out on patrols (or not working) leave me a message and I will endeavour to contact you at the first available opportunity. If you attend for an urgent matter and I am not present, try the residence or contact Triple "O" (or Inverell Police Station on 67220599). Lets work together to keep our town safe, fun and a great place to live.


