CRIME REPORT

To begin this months crime report I wish to pay tribute to all those who supported the Police and friends Charity Golf Day, which was held on Sunday 10th October. 93 players braved the course in what turned out to be a wonderful day. I was overwhelmed with the tremendous support I received from sponsors, especially throughout the Delungra community. Sponsors from Inverell where just as generous, and for those who competed, there were plenty of prizes on offer. A big thank you to the Delungra Golf Club for allowing me to hold this day. In particular I pay homage to John and Libby Martel who worked tirelessly to ensure a hassle free day. After final analysis proceeds from the golf day totalled \$2611.54 which is phenomenal. So far \$1000 has been donated to the Delungra Girl Guides and \$250 was donated to the Delungra Newslink. A further \$250 was donated to the CWA Playgroup however in a tremendous and hearty gesture the playgroup committee immediately donated that money to the Family fun night committee. The CWA Playgroup committee wanted the wider Delungra community to benefit by this donation and this donation will allow the family fun night committee to hold a pre-Christmas disco for the kids as part of next months activity. To everyone who helped out, played, supported or sponsored the day – I say thanks.

It is disheartening to see that I am receiving some resistance in relation to the riding of electric scooters around town. Last month I reported that the electric scooters are illegal and therefore cannot be ridden on a road or road related area. These scooters can only be ridden on private land etc. This advice was met with criticism and was disputed by some members within our community. Despite an undertaking that the electric scooters would not be ridden until this matter was looked into further, members of our community defied this undertaking and continued to ride the scooters, causing danger not only to themselves but to other road users. Following further investigation into this matter, my previous advice that the electric scooters are illegal is correct. If ridden, the electric scooters carry the same penalties as driving an unregistered motor vehicle (700+ in fines). On Friday 23rd October I personally informed a number of people within our community about the scooters legalities and I provided 'black and white' documentation to prove they are deemed illegal. I am not surprise to hear that my cautions, warnings and advice has again been pushed aside with members of our community continually defying the laws by riding the electric scooters around town. More complaints were received by members of the community just 48 hours after being told the electric scooters were illegal to ride. These habitual offenders have forced my hand and basically there are three options now available;

1. The persons responsible stop riding the electric scooters and the matter is resolved. I do not believe this is an option as the offenders have re-offended despite repeated warnings, cautions and undertakings.
2. If detected by Police committing offences, appropriate police action will be taken.
3. Formal complaints by residents (statement of complaint).

Unfortunately, the majority of offences occur when I am not working, on patrols or absent from town. I say, deliberate acts on behalf of the offenders. Because of this and because I do not witness the offences first hand, without formal complaints by Delungra residents, my options are limited. If you want to complain, be prepared to make a formal complaint so I can follow the matter through.

I provide this information in an effort to protect everyone. Firstly to those committing the offences from being seriously injured in an accident, whether it be by having or causing it. Secondly to all other road users who may be victim of an accident or incident involving these electric scooters. Numerous complaints have been received in relation to reckless riding by the persons in control of these electric scooters, lets prevent accidents and/or serious injury to all parties before they happen. Unless I witness/detect the offences, I'm in your hands.

On a crime front I can report on the following:

Between 8.30am – 9.00am on Thursday, 7th October a residence in Burnett Street Delungra was broken into. It was reported to Inverell Police that money and alcohol was stolen. The victim in this matter would have to be the unluckiest person in the world, this is the victim's fourth break and enter at the same residence in the past 4 years (one a year). MO (modus operandi) appear similar in all cases. The matters may be isolated, we may have a seasonal break and enter merchant in our community or there may be other factors involved. I hope to look at all the reported break and enters involving this victim during the past 4 years to see if I can determine the reason why this victim is being targeted.

Between the 8th and 10th October a number of road signs between Warialda and Inverell had graffiti sprayed all over them. A number of obscenities were written on the signs in black paint, making reference to a certain person.

On the 16th October a resident in Railway Street was issued a noise abatement direction, effective for 28 days, relating to loud music after celebrating a birthday party. Complaints were also received in relation to illegal fire crackers being lit in the railway Street area around this time.

On the 23rd October it's been alleged that a 14 year old Delungra youth smashed a bicycle helmet into pieces. This matter is currently under investigation and if statements are forthcoming, police action will follow. Complaints against the same 14 year old, together with another 11 year old youth have been received in relation to riding an unregistered motor cycle and electric scooters around the Delungra township.


On the 24th October an assault occurred at the local Hotel. This is no reflection upon the Hotel with the Hotel itself being a victim of circumstance. The POI (person of interest) regretfully decided to vent their frustration against a victim inside the premises. The victim was drinking at the premises however the POI (person of interest) was not. The POI went to the Hotel looking for the victim. The matter was very well handled by the Hotel staff. At this stage minimal police action is being taken, at the victims request, providing the POI and victim go their separate ways. The POI was remorseful and apologetic for taking their grievance against the victim inside the Hotel.

In other news I wish to advise that I am a step closer in starting up a Delungra Blue Light. If successful, myself, together with a committee will be able to run blue light discos and activities for the youth of our town. On top of this the Family Fun Night committee will move under the blue light umbrella, therefore allowing this committee to diversify its activities. By moving under the blue light umbrella, more activities in, around or away from town can be undertaken due to blanket insurance coverage. At this point I've had an informal meeting with the Board of the Delungra Bowling Club (proposed venue) and the Board are fully supportive of this project. I thank the Bowling Club Board for their enthusiasm and encouragement. On the 26th November the family fun night will be holding a pre-Christmas disco at the bowling club. Time will be 7.00pm to 10.00pm. This will be the last family fun night activity for this year as December is deemed too busy for everyone to hold an activity. I will be using this disco to gauge the interest within our community and youth re holding disco's. If this disco is well supported, I will look seriously at commencing a Delungra Blue Light in 2005, targeting our youth.

Keep in mind the 20th November 2004. On this date McDonalds Restaurants all around Australia will be supporting McHappy Day, raising much needed funds for childrens cancer research. For every Big Mac sold, a certain percentage of money is donated to this cause. I'll be doing my part, working at McDonalds to show my support, selling Big Macs by the dozen. Times are to be confirmed but I'll be working behind the counter between 10.00am - 12 noon or 1.00pm - 3.00pm (still to be decided which time). If you or your family are in town that day, come and buy a Big Mac from me. Your money will be going to a worthy cause.

Once again I may be difficult to find over the next month. Due to staff shortages at Inverell and continued training, I may be required to work some shifts in Inverell. Don't be discouraged though, if I can't attend to a particular job, Inverell will. During this period I encourage you to continue reporting crime, incidents or concerns. Remember, you will never know where or when I may surface

Don't forget that I have a notice board at the front of the Delungra Police Station. Should you attend the station and I am out on patrols (or not working) leave me a message and I will endeavour to contact you at the first available opportunity. If you attend for an urgent matter and I am not present, try the residence or contact Triple "O" (or Inverell Police Station on 67220599). Lets work together to keep our town safe, fun and a great place to live.



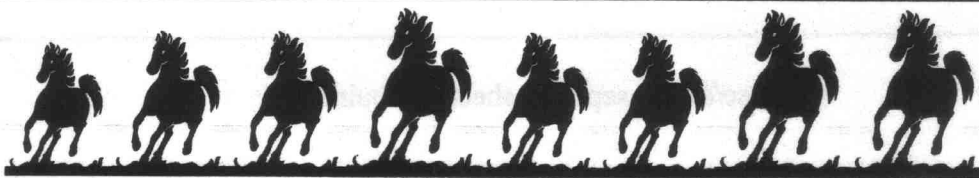

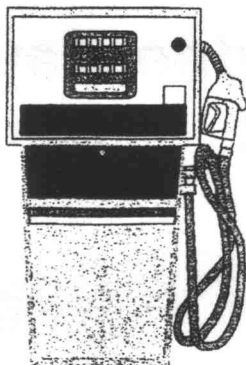

DELUNGRA RURAL FIRE SERVICE NEWS

This has been a relatively quiet month for the Brigade, thank you all for your care and responsibility with fire! We at the Brigade would be much happier if it was always like that.

There have been two call outs in the month. One was to a grass fire near the Golf Club and the second to a grass fire started by some Oxy equipment but which fortunately had been extinguished by the land holder before the brigade arrived.

This month marks the retirement from the brigade of Lenny Spinks and Judy Canning due to work and other commitments. Lenny has been a member of the brigade for 14 years and a Deputy Captain for much of that time. Judy has been our First Aid Officer. The contributions they have both made are greatly appreciated and we thank them for that and wish them well, they will be greatly missed!

The brigade has two fire engines to enable it to carry out its work:-

The most used is an Isuzu 4WD (CAT 1) which is appropriate for structural, grass, and bush fires and for fire protection at Motor Vehicle Accidents. It carries a 3300 Litre tank which with its 2 pumps at full pressure can be emptied in 4 minutes. It carries a full complement of hoses, nozzles, extinguishers and implements for the various tasks it may be called on to perform. It can carry up to 7 firefighters in the cab. Radio contact is available at all times both with Headquarters in Inverell and with Despatch located in Newcastle. It replaced a Bedford previously used in Delungra some 3 years ago.

The second is a more specialised engine primarily intended for structural fires, it is our 'village protection unit'. Whilst it carries 600 Litres of water it would normally be used connected to a fire hydrant to provide a high volume of water. It is capable of pumping water at 1200 KPa, at that pressure it requires 2 people to control the nozzle and for safety reasons someone stationed at the pump ready to turn it off instantly should control be lost. Hoses carried are in excess of 1 Km in length. Of course it is available to support the other engine in different situations if that is required.

We are now very much in the fire season, please ensure that if you do intend to light a fire in the open that you get a permit and follow all the conditions of that permit. It really helps us to know what is going on and means you are doing the right thing and will not have any explaining to do.

You don't have to start a fire as such to cause one, remember that in some circumstances vehicles, Oxy equipment, power tools (especially grinders) and even unsafe electrical cables can be just as dangerous as matches.

I hope that the next month will also be a quiet one for the brigade and we ask for your care to help bring this about.
