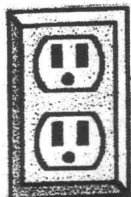

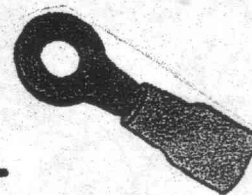

CRIME REPORT

Welcome to this months crime report.

In last month's crime report I advised that I would not be supplying a report for this months addition of the Delungra Newslink. Despite this information, I felt it was important to get a Crime Report completed as it will most likely be my last.

It is with deep sadness I advise that I will soon be leaving Delungra. Whilst on leave there were some significant movements in relation to my transfer. On Friday 24th March (whilst on leave) I received a phone call stating that my transfer had been brought forward, my transfer date from the village of Delungra will be the 26th April 2006. This in effect means, that due to other duties and commitments, my last day of service in Delungra will be Thursday 20th April 2006. My replacement will be Constable Brad LEWIS, he will start in Delungra from Sunday 7th May. Brad will be living in the Delungra residence from about the middle of April so I hope to have an opportunity to show him around and meet the locals before I leave. On the 4th April Delungra school will be hosting a friendship breakfast. I am in the process of trying to get Constable LEWIS to Delungra for that event. This will be a great opportunity to introduce Constable LEWIS to some of our locals. Once Brad gets himself established, he has indicated that he will continue to provide monthly crime reports in the Delungra Newslink.

I am a little disappointed to be leaving Delungra. It was a decision which was not taken lightly however one which had to be made. Delungra and District is a great community and one which you should be very proud of. I am very proud at what I have achieved and accomplished during my three years here. I have met some wonderful people, been involved with some wonderful Organisations, groups and events and thoroughly enjoyed interaction and policing throughout the rural community. I hope to have the opportunity to say goodbye to you all before I official depart. Once gone I will leave with lots of fond memories and hope to get an opportunity to come back at various stages for different events. I truly appreciate the way the community has accepted me, my policing principles and the support received throughout my three year reign. I am not going far, just moving to Inverell. I am only a phone call away if needed - always remember that.

In last months Newslink I was interested to read about the suspension policy in place at the Delungra Public School. Delungra School is a great school and one the community should be proud of the school works hard to educate the community's children, interacts within the community through different events and functions and provides outstanding community services beyond their duties and responsibilities. Like the police, schools have a number of protocol procedures which they must adopt before a child receives a suspension, and even when a child receives a suspension, the school looks after the child's welfare through Departmental resources.

Don't believe everything you hear on the grape vine about a child or the suspension policy. If you have concerns or want to find out some information which you may have heard, approach the school. The school is always open with communication. Suspension is not taken lightly and if a child gets suspended, it's for a good reason or culmination of reasons.

Whilst talking about child suspensions, I will probably *ruffle* a few feathers with my next comments. My comments are not directed at any individual or any individual families. My comments are my views only and/or concerns received from other community members from their observations. It relates to children being suspended and how suspension from school can be seen as a deterrent/punishment/penalty or what ever words you like to use here. When a child is suspended, the onus falls upon the parents to inflict suitable punishment. In my days at school if you got suspended you got grounded. You got suspended for a reason so you suffered the due punishment which came with that suspension. It appears in today's society that people views have changed. I am amazed to see the number of kids who are suspended from school (during school hours) walking the streets, out playing, playing in the park, riding go carts, riding pushbikes around town, hanging around the front of the school etc. These cases are not isolated but regular so I ask the question 'how is suspension seen as a deterrent'. Kids won't learn from this if this scenario continues, kids will view a suspension like a holiday. That's wrong, kids should learn from their wrong doings - this appears more like a reward than punishment.

Last month I provided information about a Teenage Party information Night which is being held in Inverell on the 12th April 2006. With that information I advised that a free bus would be run from Delungra to and from this evening. It appears that no bus is required as no interest was received from any community members.

In relation to matters of interest, I advise the following:

On the 6th March 2006 police searched a rural property east of Delungra after receiving reliable information that a 30 year old male, wanted for a serious domestic violence assault and other matters, was at that location. Following the search the male was located, arrest and conveyed to Inverell. He was interviewed and charged with numerous offences. Bail was refused.

On the 6th March Police received a complaint about an older model burgundy ford falcon sedan speeding and driving erratically in Reedy Street and around back lanes throughout the Delungra township. Police from Inverell attended however the vehicle could not be located. Local Police know the identity and owner of this vehicle and if the manner of driving continues, the vehicle and driver will be targeted.

Whilst on holidays messages were left at the Delungra police station in relation to various complaints. One complaint related to people trespassing at the Presbyterian Church whilst the other related to a local youth throwing pieces of wood at a house and shed. One of the pieces of wood struck a child. Both matters were forwarded to Inverell or Ashford Police on the 7th March for follow up. I can only hope that police attended or contacted the complainants in relation to those complaints.

On the 10th March a verbal domestic argument occurred at a rural property on the Mount Russell Road.

On the 16th March a driving complaint was received in relation to the manner of driving of a motor vehicle between Warialda and Delungra.

Between Sunday the 26th of February and Saturday the 11th of March 2006, persons unknown have taken a XA GT Ford Sedan from a machinery shed on the property Glen Top. The property is on the Cherry Tree Hill Road. The vehicle was without motor or gearbox.

On the 12th March 2006 it was found that the property "Glen Prairie" on the Cherry Tree Hill Road had been broken into. The machinery Shed had a padlock cut off a mesh door and entry was gained to that shed. When in that shed they have forced open a metal gun safe that was bolted to the wall by jemmying the door open. Two firearms have been stolen from within, being an Air Rifle and a Shotgun. Three other firearms (centrefire rifles) were left in the safe. An amount of ammunition was also taken. A wooden cupboard was also opened within the shed and two UHF Handheld two-way radios and their chargers were stolen. A number of other valuable transportable items (ie: chainsaws/tools) were not touched. An overhead fuel tank containing diesel was handled with 400 L of diesel being stolen. In another open part of the shed some ammunition reloading equipment was taken (for a calibre of firearm that remained in the safe and was not taken by the offenders). Entry was also forced into the house by physically forcing a side door allowing

access into the kitchen. Once inside the house the offender/s have rifled through a number of drawers. Situated within the hallway of the house was an Antique Grandfather Clock (well over 100 years) that was against the wall. This clock was stolen and would require at least 2 people to carry it. Although not valued the clock is believed to have been worth in excess of \$50,000. Three other antique wall clocks of unknown value (but believed to be significant) were also stolen from the living/lounge and kitchen area. No other property is believed to have been stolen. If anyone has information about this theft, please contact Police or call crime stoppers.

On Sunday 19th March Police attended a residential address in Dumboy Street after an allegation of contaminated water was received. The complainant believed someone had contaminated their tank water. Following investigations into this matter, the allegations made by the complainant could not be substantiated. Police provided the complainant with a variety of information about the water however the complainant would not accept this information. The complainant indicated to police that arrangements would be made for the water to be tested. Police do not believe that any water has been contaminated from their investigations.


Around 3.00am Saturday morning 25th March a motor vehicle travelling east along Railway Street Delungra missed the corner. The vehicle locked its brakes however skidded off the roadway, down the embankment and drove through a wire fence. Damage was sustained to both the vehicle and fence. The identity of the driver is sought. The vehicle was a dark coloured station wagon. A male and female were in the vehicle at the time.

On Saturday 25th March a minor verbal argument developed between a 12 year old Delungra youth and his grandmother. The incident occurred at a residential address in Inverell Street. Police attended and spoke with the youth about his manner of communication towards his grandmother.

On Sunday evening 26th March 2006 a 12 year old Delungra youth was stopped by passing police in the main street of Delungra. The youth was riding a bicycle at night, street lighting was poor, and the youth had no shoes on, no lights on the bike and no helmet on his head. The youth was riding backwards and forwards across the road which caused the passing police to stop the youth and speak with him about his actions. The police were genuinely concerned that the youth would get hit by passing vehicles. It is a little ironic that that passing police officer was from Crime Scene who was returning to Inverell after attending an accident where two 15 year old youths had been killed. The Police officer did not want this Delungra youth to become another statistic.

As indicated this will be my last crime report for the Delungra District. I hope you have enjoyed each monthly report which I have compiled. I thank you for your positive feedback in relation to these reports. I have enjoyed bringing each monthly report to you and hope that you have found them enjoyable, entertaining and full of information. I will miss providing this information to you all.

Don't forget I have a notice board at the front of the police station. Should you attend and I am not available at the time, leave your details and I will contact you in due course. I am sure this process will continue once Brad commences duty at Delungra. I look forward to what limited time I have left in Delungra and I look forward to seeing you all before I officially go.

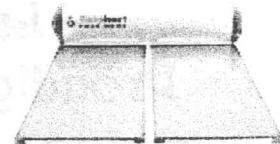



On this occasion we called upon our colleagues from Whitlow and Inverell, this shows the power of the RFS to bring appropriate resources to bear when the situation demands.

This illustrates the importance of rapid reporting if you see a fire. If you do please report it straightaway, if it's already been reported no harm is done, if it hasn't you will save time and possibly property and lives.

This month some of our members attended the Northern 6 exercise, which you will have heard about, in Glen Innes. Those that went enjoyed the experience, got to know each other better and learnt a lot. They strengthen our Brigade's capability and we are grateful to them for spending their weekend in this way. Our newest member, Adam Lodge, has attended his Basic Firefighter course and now takes his place alongside the rest of us in being ready to make a contribution on the fireground.

I hope that by now you have all tested your smoke alarms and replaced their batteries. If you did overlook this please attend to it straightaway, after all it's your life!

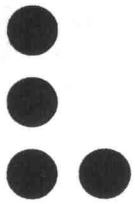

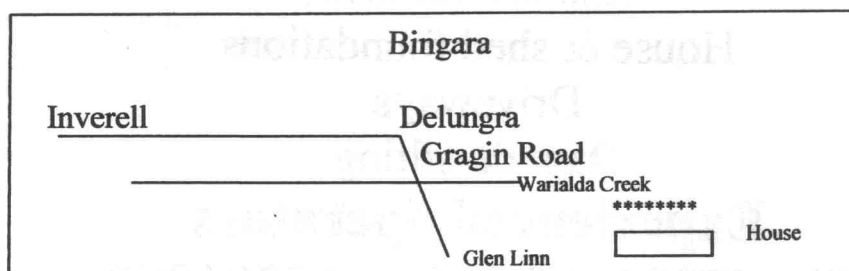
