Hasn't the rain been wonderful – and it takes such a short time for lawns and gardens to green up again. The school is participating in the Clean Up Australia campaign this week. Our main focus is the oval and the immediate school area. This is an excellent community service activity for our students.

The school, and I'm sure everyone else in Delungra, is getting used to our new recycling system. The students are quickly getting used to our two bin system. Now the paper that we throw out, (and there seems to be so much of it, no matter how hard we try), will be recycled and not clutter up our garbage dumps.

The school focus for training and development for teachers this year is literacy. Staff have attended a course on visual literacy, learning how to help students make sense of the multitude of images that confront them in everyday life ty, magazine, internet sites and web pages, advertising brochures and countless others. Mrs Griffin and I are also completing a year long

course to update our skills in the teaching of reading, writing and talking and listening.

Our students have been given the opportunity to attend a District Small School's Camp at Copeton Dam commencing at morning tea time on Wednesday, 28th March and finishing lunch time Friday, 30th of March. The main focus of this camp is a Drug Forum where senior students will be working with trained Year 10 students from Inverell High, and Drug Ed consultants to increase their awareness of the dangers of drugs and the types of drugs they may be exposed to and the effects of these drugs. There will also be a very strong focus on strategies students may use to resist peer pressure to be involved in drug use. This is a very important part of the school curriculum and is an excellent opportunity for our students. There is a quality drama a scries of workshops performance and involving rock wall climbing, (very safe and highly supervised), archery coaching, gymnastics and drama - all in all a great three days. Students also have access to the water slide on one of the days. I'm hoping that all students from Years 3 to 6 will take the opportunity to attend this excellent camp to have fun with students from other schools, learn new skills and increase their awareness of the dangers of drugs and develop skills to protect them from drugs and drug pushers.

Ramblings of an Old Truckie.

This article is supplied by Gerry and Ann Kent after requests from a couple of families for some interesting articles to be placed in the Newslink. If you enjoy it or not please let us know.

This is a brief history of a considerable life change that occurred for us when in 19664 we departed the property "Paxton" south of Delungra to take over a carrying business which we had purchased at Coffs Harbour, a town, which at the time comprised about seven and a half thousand people, and was actually two towns about one and a half miles apart, Top Town and the Jetty. This was for us certainly a "Seachange".

Ann would go with our three young daughters driving the Falcon car and I would go in the loaded Ford truck which we had owned since 1953, and which we were taking to supplement the Coffs Harbour fleet of one 2 ton Inter. Which came with the business. We also purchased the house belonging to Reg Carter the previous proprietor.

On arriving in Coffs we put our furniture into storage and stayed in one of Knights Cabins at Park Beach, (down past the Hoey Mocy) in a bushland setting (hard to believe to-day) while awaiting the legal procedure of the transfer. Also over this period I (Gerry) accompanied Reg each day to learn the ins and outs of the business. It was while doing his, and only a week or two after arriving there that Reg informed me that he had been offered a run to Cascade (a sawmill village situated along with a lot of other similar villages in the Eastern Dorrigo). This was to take a small piece of machinery there and as he had to go to Woolgoolga that day for the regular load of bananas, if I liked to do the job I could do so with the Ford. He had already quoted on the job, and this was satisfactory, so I agreed. A quick look at the road map showed me that this village was only about thirty miles from Coffs, and as the machinery could be loaded on Thursday afternoon I could get away as early as I liked in the Friday morning. Ann asked if I needed to take lunch with me but as I intended to depart at 6am I assured her that even if there was a delay in unloading I could be back by 10am. (FAMOUS LAST WORDS)

Departed Coffs out through Coramba where I had already been and just on the western edge of Coramba swung off the reasonably good road on to the road which would (cont'd next pg)

eventually lead me to Cascade. Within half a mile I realised this road was very rough, very steep an extremely narrow. Quite soon on meeting a car, had I had a passenger he would not have been able to step out on that side of the truck, as the next step from the footboard would be at least a hundred footer. Needless to say I eventually arrived at Cascade a about the time I thought I would be back in Coffs, and found out that small store there sold very little except warm drinks and stale biscuits. I left Cascade after unloading and travelling some miles encountered a loaded timber jinker travelling towards Cascade. On a very sharp bend, the overhanging logs had driven about a foot into the cutting. Obviously he couldn't reverse and when he tried to pull out the prime mover had waltzed across towards the considerable drop on the other side, but he informed me I wouldn't have long to wait as he was waiting for a tractor to arrive from the nearby bush, so I sat in my truck with my drink and biscuits.

Probably an hour or more later I could hear the tractor coming, and actually on and off I could hear it for the next two or three hours. Tractor duly arrived, pulled the truck out and I proceeded to Coffs arriving about 6pm. FIRST LESSON LEARNED being if travelling more than fifteen miles in any direction from Coffs, to always carry a good supply of tucker and liquids. The next day when I saw Reg and told him he said "that's why I didn't arrange to do it before I had to go to Woolgoolga in the afternoon" so I obviously had been set up to get the experience, as the fruit had to be in Coffs on time to catch the train.
