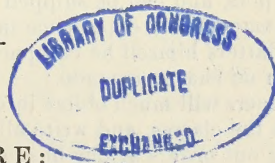

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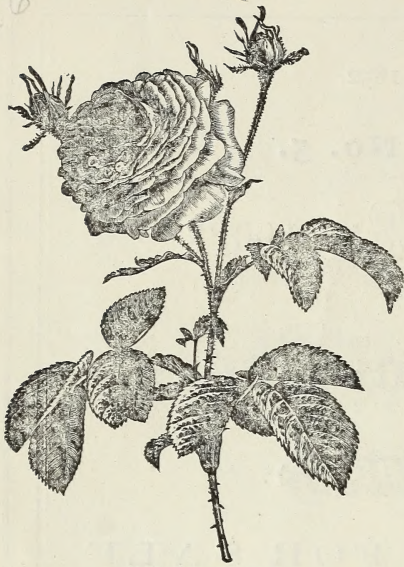

We prepay packages by Mail. Large plants, or in quantity when sent by Express, are at expense of purchaser.

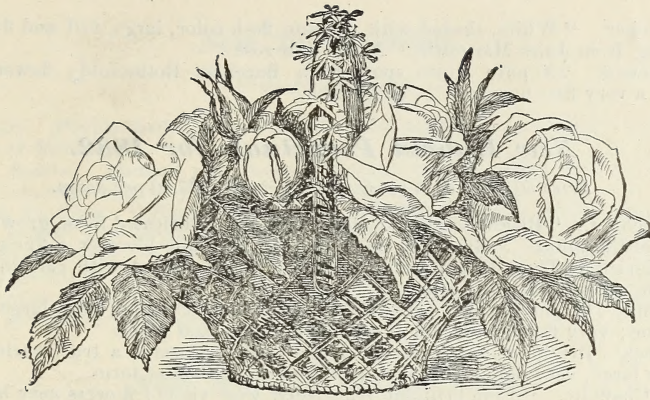
