Graduates may find employment in the automotive service industry.








BUILDING

ELECTRICAL INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE

Courses in the basic building trades specializing in Carpentry, Masonry, and Electrical Installation are offered. Through a combination of classroom and practical job experiences, a student may be qualified to enter his particular trade as an on-the-job trainee or apprentice.

COSMETOLOGY

The Cosmetology Curriculum is designed to prepare the student for employment in the field of cosmetology. The Curriculum provides instruction and practice in manicuring, shampooing, permanent waving, facials, massages, scalp treatment, hair cutting, and styling. This Curriculum is approved by the North Carolina State Board of Cosmetic Art Examiners.









PRACTICAL NURSING

The Practical Nursing Curriculum is structured to prepare students for participation in the care of patients of all ages, in various states of dependency, and with a variety of illness conditions. Graduates of the program are eligible to take the licensing examination given by the North Carolina Board of Nursing.








WELDING

The Welding Curriculum gives students an understanding of the principles, methods, and techniques of oxyacetylene, arc, and inert gas welding. Practical shop work provides opportunity to attain essential skills for successful employment.







AIR CONDITIONING AND REFRIGERATION

The Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Curriculum is designed to give the student practical knowledge that will enable him to become a capable serviceman in the industry. Students may be prepared for jobs in air conditioning, automatic heating, sheet metal, and commercial refrigeration installation and service.






