# Dissenter 1965

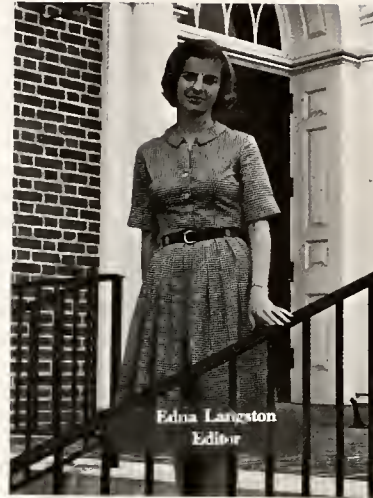

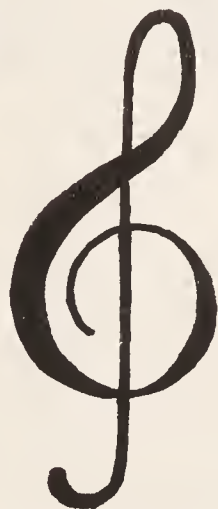

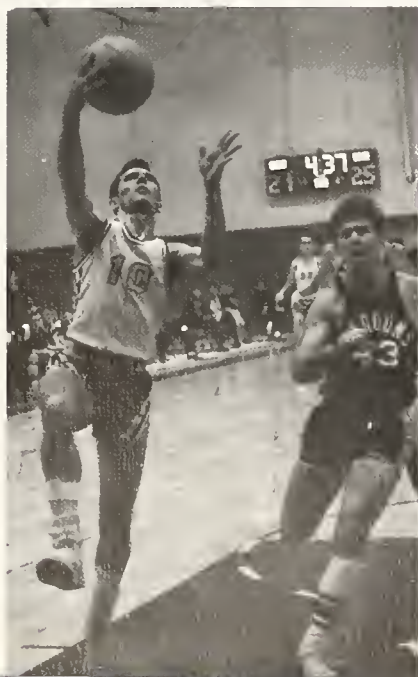

Of more use than they look, the NCWC Comment Squad added much needed school spirit to many ball games.



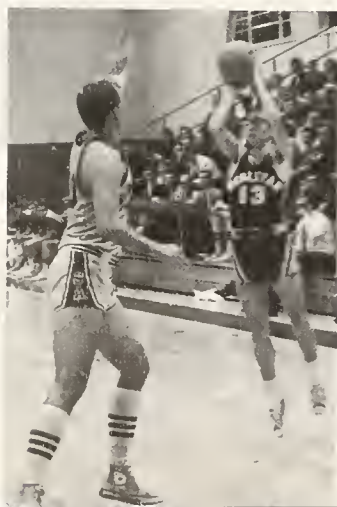

has gained experience and shows much promise for next year.

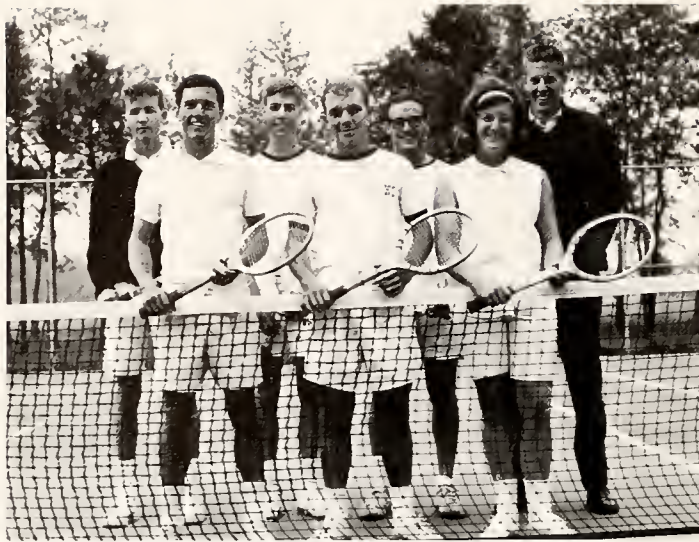
