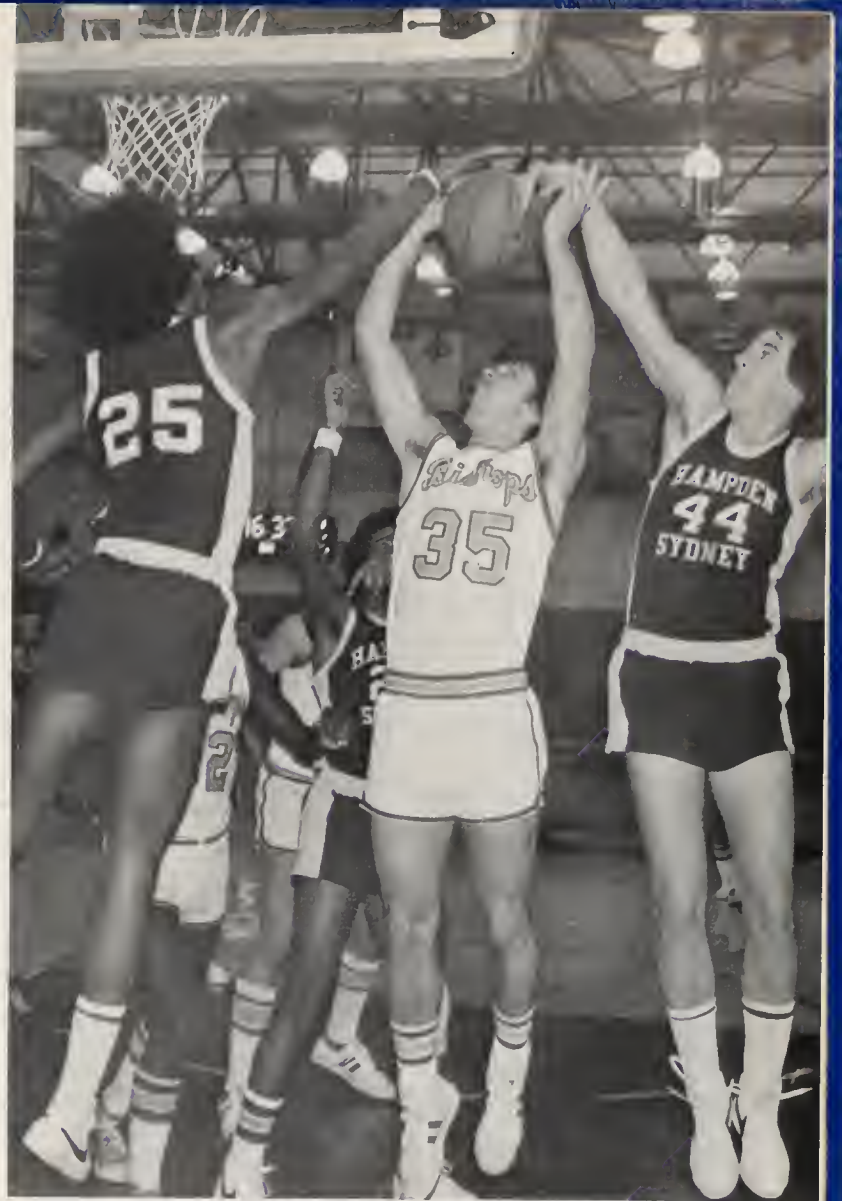
## BASKETBALL

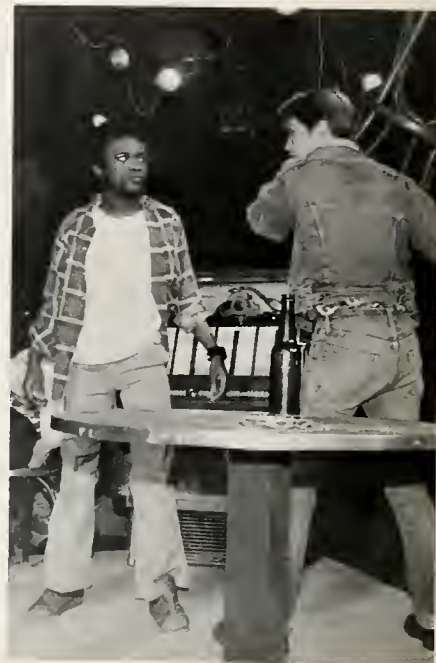
## A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM

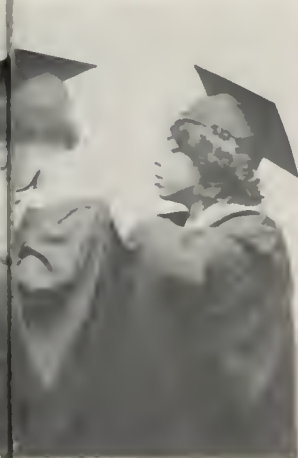

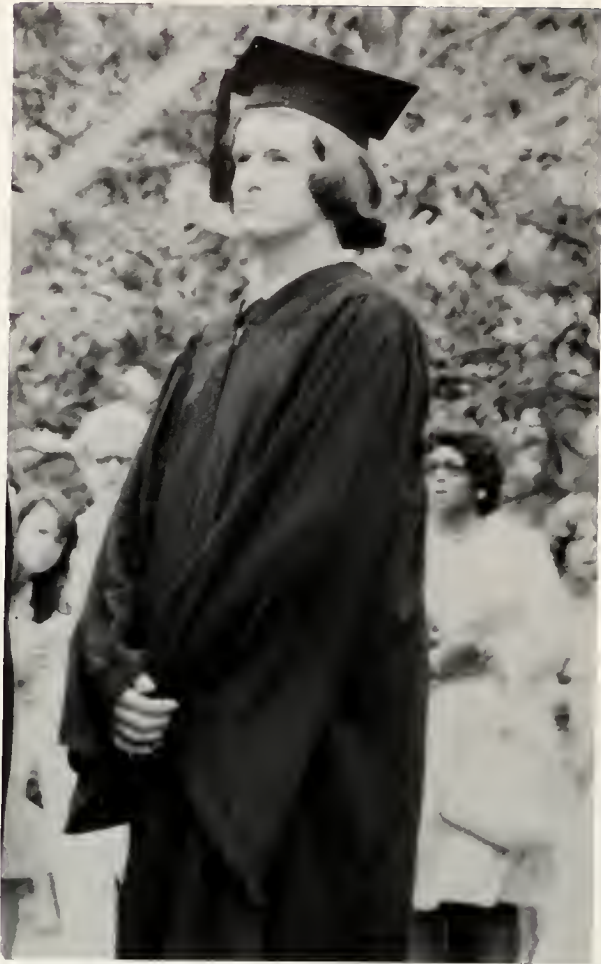

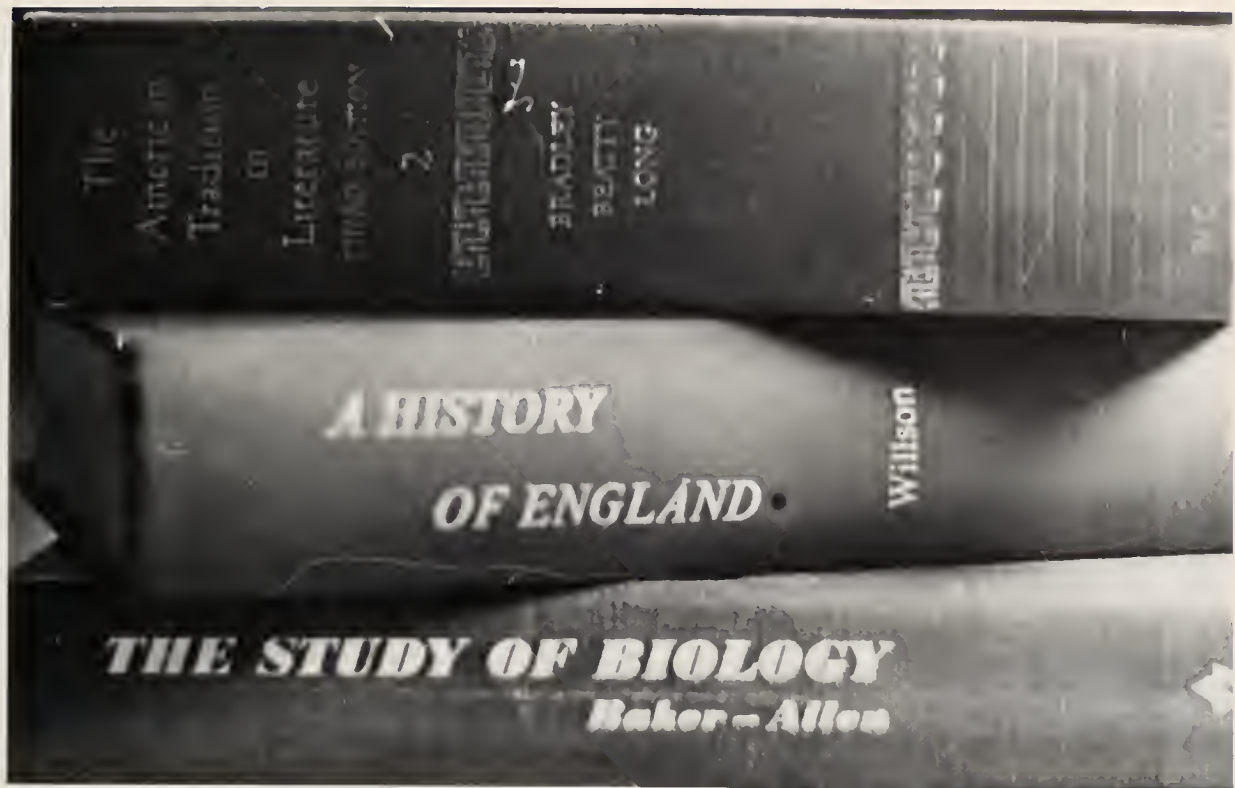
