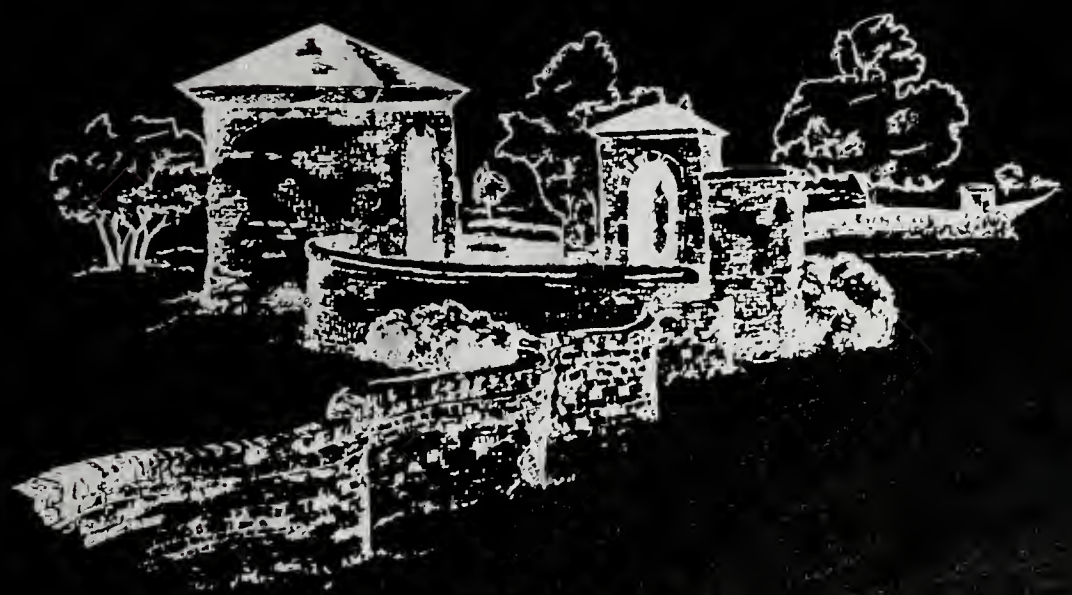

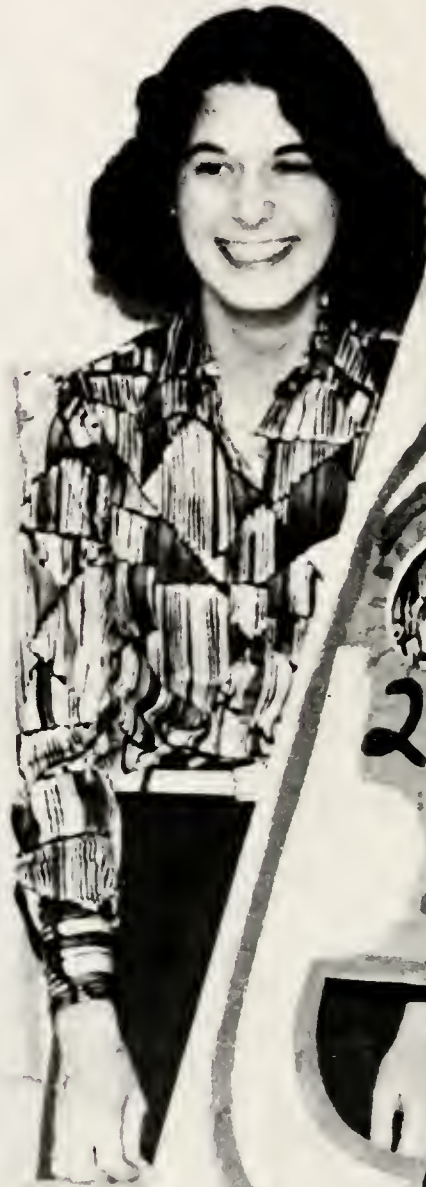

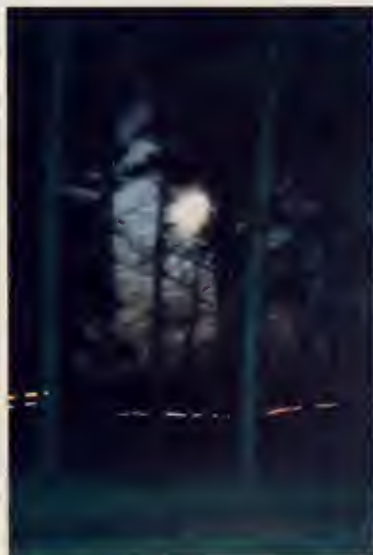

Volleyball, softball and a game of tug-of-war showed us that even as strangers we could all pull together to make up a winning team; the Wesleyan team. One of the very best!

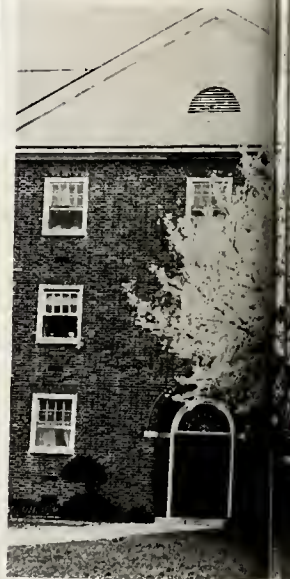

NEW KID IN TOWN



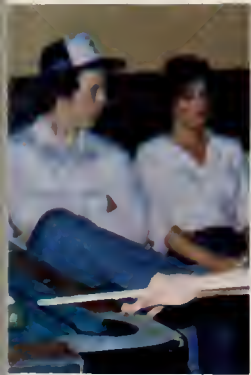
